

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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
# SALE NO.14 OF 02<sup>ND</sup> & 03<sup>RD</sup> APRIL, 2019. COMMENTS

This week's auction comprised of 11,825 lots and 6.8Mkgs – an improvement of 0.3Mkgs over the previous sale. Low Grown Leafy teas accounted for 2 Mkgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf teas totaled 1.1 Mkgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted 0.9 Mkgs.

The quality of Low Growns was fully maintained, and all teas on offer met with good demand. Stylish BOP1's and OP1's in the "best" category were selectively dearer, whilst others were fully firm. Cleaner and well-made OP/OPAs as well as below best types were fully firm to dearer amidst good demand from Russia and the CIS together with traditional Middle Eastern interest. The better made PEKs were supported by Syria and Turkey at around last levels. Buyers for Iraq and Libya were forceful for secondary type teas. In the Tippy/Small Leaf category, there was fair demand from buyers for the UAE and some other selected Middle Eastern markets resulting in firm to dearer prices. However, Iran, once again appeared selective.

The Ex-Estate market was disappointing yet again with less demand from a cross section of buyers sourcing for important export destinations. A handful of select liquoring Westerns barely maintained last levels whilst all others eased Rs. 20-30/- and more. A fair number of teas failed to attract bids in keeping with the broker's "Asking Prices" and, all such teas consequently remained unsold. The absence of fresh orders from several key buyers operating for the "Tea Bag Sector" has resulted in lack luster demand, and all present indications point out that an uptick in demand is fairly remote at this point in time.

The following graph would no doubt indicate the market behavior for Ex-Estate High Grown teas in particular, during the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2019 vs. 2018. Orthodox Western High Growns have sold at Rs.516.81 during January/March, 2019 as against Rs. 589.79 during the corresponding period last year which is a drop of Rs.72.98. The averages of CTC Low and Medium categories have declined by Rs.134.15 and Rs.104.85 respectively, with producers currently making substantial losses.

#### CROP & WEATHER For the period 25 - 31 March 2019

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: Bright weather was reported in both regions throughout the week. However, Hatton sub- district experienced some mid week evening showers and bright weather in the latter part of the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts misty mornings in the week ahead in both regions. Uva/Udapussellawa Regions: Both Uva and Udapussellawa regions reported dry weather throughout the week. Scattered showers may occur in a few places in the Uva District according to The Department of Meteorology. Low Growns: Severe dry weather was reported in both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions in the past week. The best **BP1s** available eased by USC2-USC60 with Brighter types irregular by USC2-USC20 below previous levels while Medium varieties met an irregular enquiry ranging between USC8 dearer to easier by USC4-USC10 with some invoices neglected. Plainer types varied between USC25 dearer to easier by up to USC16 with a few teas unsold.

**Best PF1s** in the market held firm to USC2 dearer with Brighter types irregular varying between USC8 dearer to easier by a similar level while Mediums were irregular and ranged between USC2 – USC9 dearer to easier by up to USC10. Plainer descriptions varied between USC8 dearer to easier by the same rate with many lines neglected.

The Best **PDUSTs** on offer shed USC5 – USC10 while Brighter varieties held firm to USC5 easier with Medium sorts irregular and ranged between USC2 –USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC6. Plainer sorts ranging between USC4 above previous rates to easier by up to USC24.

Best **DUST1s** in the market held steady to USC2 easier with Brighter types firm to USC6 below last prices while Medium varieties saw an irregular activity varying between firm to USC24 dearer to easier by USC10-USC24. Plainer descriptions were discounted by USC2-USC30.
