

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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# SALE NO.17 OF 29<sup>TH</sup> & 30<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2019. COMMENTS

An auction quantity of 7.2 m/kgs was on offer this week which was an improvement of 150,000 kgs over the previous sale. Low Grown Leafy teas accounted for 2 m/kgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf teas totaled 1.150m/kgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted 1 m/kgs.

The quality of Low Growns was a little lower to last. Leafy grades met with good demand with stylish and well-made BOP1's/OP1's holding firm although the better OP/OPA's were barely steady amidst sustained demand from Saudi Arabia, Libya, Jordon, Kuwait and Iraq. Pekoe descriptions however were a little irregular and easier, following selective demand from Turkey and Syria. Tippy teas in best category saw more support from Iran. Buyers for the U. A. E. operated on a cross-section of grades in the Tippy / Small Leaf catalogue.

There was improved demand for the small availability of best Westerns as well as selected neat leaf Uva's but weak and lack-luster demand was seen to prevail for the majority of the balance offerings. The poorer leaf, plainer BOP/BOPF types in particular were often lower up to Rs. 20/- and even more. Japan was more active for the better liquoring types with some competition from Europe as well. However, the "Tea Bag" sector was less active amidst less interest from Russia. Buyers for Hong Kong and China too were more selective.

Plantation districts have reported bright mornings followed by evening showers with more rains being predicted by the Department of Meteorology in the next few days. There has been an all-round improvement of crop as well.

#### LOW GROWNS – LEAFY

- **BOP1** : Select best teas declined by Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance however maintained. Teas at the lower end held firm.
- **OP1** : Teas in the select best category declined Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance was fully firm on the last week levels. Stalky invoices were however irregularly dearer.
- **OP** : A few invoices in the select best category were barely steady; balance declined by Rs.20-30/- and more as the sale progressed. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- **OPA** : Select best invoices were fully firm on last week levels, balance declined Rs.30-40/- and more particularly towards the latter part of the sale. Poorer sorts were however maintained.
- **PEK/PEK1:** A few well made shotty invoices advanced by Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance declined substantially and at times were difficult of sale. Best bolder Pekoe's however met with a good demand; balance declined Rs.10-20/- and more as the sale progressed. Teas at the lower end too lost.

- **BOPF/BOPFSP** : A few select best maintained. Balance were easier. Below best and teas at the lower end were firm on last.
- **FBOP/FBOP1** : Select best and best FBOP's were firm to easier. Below best and cleaner teas at the lower end sold around last levels. Others were irregular following quality. Select best and best FBOP1's were lower. Balance firm on last.
- **FBOPF/FBOPF1 :** Very tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and below best together with cleaner teas at the lower end appreciated. However, the leafy varieties were firm on last. Few select best FF1's were barely steady. Best were irregular and mostly lower. Few cleaner below best and few cleaner teas at the lower end maintained. Others were easier.
- **FBOPFSP/ EXSP :** Select best category continues to attract good demand, FBOPFSP small types gained. Cleaner teas at the lower end too appreciated.

#### HIGH GROWNS

**BOP:** Best Westerns were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst select high priced teas of last week were irregular. Teas in the below best category too were firm and tended dearer whilst the plainer sorts and particularly the poor leaf teas were difficult of sale. A few select Nuwara Eliya's were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others were difficult of sale. The range of better Udapussellawas were irregularly lower whilst the others were difficult of sale. Neater Uva's sold at firm to dearer rates following quality whilst the others were barely steady with the poor leaf teas often being difficult of sale.

**BOPF:** Best Western select high priced teas of last week were irregularly easier whilst the others together with the brighter below best sorts were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer. The remainder together with the plainer sorts were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas sold at marginally easier rates whilst teas with poorer leaf the others declined further. Udapussellawas were generally easier with poorer sorts declining Rs.30/-per kg and more. A range of Uva's were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others were irregular following quality.

#### CROP & WEATHER For the period 22<sup>nd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> April, 2019

Western / Nuwara Eliya Regions - Erratic weather was reported with bright mornings, dull and rainy evenings in both regions throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology predicted strong winds up to 60 kmph in the week ahead. Uva / Udupussellawa Regions - Bright mornings and heavy evening showers were experienced during the course of last week. Heavy showers can be expected in both regions in the days to come according to The Department of Meteorology. Low Growns - Both Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna regions reported bright mornings with evening showers during the week. #### Qatar opens first tea packaging plant Source: Xinhua 2019-04-29

DOHA, April 28 (Xinhua) -- The first tea packaging plant of Lipton and Red Label brands in Qatar's New Industrial Area opened on Sunday, further boosting the Gulf state's industrial sector.

Qatar Industrial Manufacturing Company's (QIMC) plant in Doha forms part of the efforts of the ministerial group, headed by Prime Minister and Interior Minister to stimulate and support the country's economy. The opening of the plant is one of the fruits of Qatar's ongoing efforts to achieve partnership with the private sector.

According to QIMC, Lipton and Red Label brands, which are part of Unilever Worldwide, represent more than two-thirds of sales in the domestic market.

Demand was very strong for the 163,475 packages (10.42m/kgs) on offer and prices closely followed a quality with easing tendency towards the close. 16.49% were unsold.

The Best **BP1s** in the market gained up to USC10 but a few lines eased with quality with brighter types were firm to USC10 below previous levels and a few invoices were neglected with Medium categories steady to USC4 dearer. Plainer sorts saw better absorption gaining USC11-USC23.

Best **PF1s** on offer were steady to USC4 dearer with brighter types appreciating by USC11-USC16 while Medium varieties advanced by USC6-USC14. Plainer sorts met improved interest and were USC22-USC47 dearer but some teas were neglected towards the close.

Best **PDUSTs** available were strong feature appreciating by USC48 – USC 56 while brighter types met strong competition gaining USC16-USC82 with Mediums strongly competed for and advanced by USC46-USC84 although some teas shed up to USC18. Plainer sorts were USC8-USC24 dearer with some teas neglected towards the close.

Best **DUST1s** in the market met strong interest advancing by USC22-USC 92 with brighter types USC32-USC34 dearer with Medium varieties appreciated by USC8-USC30 with some teas easing by up to USC14. Plainer descriptions appreciating US15-USC41 but some invoices remained without bids towards the close.

In the Secondary Catalogues BPs held value with PFs steady. C lean well sorted coloury Fannings appreciated while similar DUSTs gained. Other Fannings advanced with DUSTs dearer. BMF s were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers lent very strong support and were dominant with more and strong interest from Yemen. Other Middle Eastern Countries and Afghanistan, Egyptian Packers maintained activity with selective tendency towards the close. There was more enquiries from Russia, Sudan UK and Bazaar while Kazakhstan and other CIS nations were active. Somalia maintained activity at the lower end of the market.
