The higher weight of 7.8 m/kgs on offer this week reflected an increase of 0.8 m/kgs over the previous sale. Low Grown Leafy teas totaled 2.1m/kgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf teas accounted for1.3 m/kgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted 1.2 m/kgs. The volumes on offer at the next two auctions are at 7.6 m/kgs and 7.5 m/kgs respectively, which is a fairly high availability of offerings, for which there does not seem to be sufficient demand. Russia, a large buyer of our teas is presently in to their summer during which period consumption shows a drop. On top of this, the tea merchants in Russia are presently reported to be carrying adequate stocks which is possibly the reason why fresh buying orders from this vast market have been eluding the Colombo Auctions in recent weeks.

Once again, there was only fair demand for Low Growns. Best leafy BOP1's / OP1's were irregular whilst well sorted OP/OPA's firm to easier. A range of select Pekoes maintained whilst the remainder was mostly lower. A limited range of better made FBOP's and FBOPF1's held firm but others eased on last. Buyers for the Middle East were more selective as were the shippers to Russia and the markets in the C. I. S. There was fair interest from Iraq and Libya.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, demand was slightly better this week, particularly for the best available westerns and CTC teas in general. Plainer, poor leaf teas however, continued to be a weak feature and a large amount of lots remained unsold in consequence. Buyers for Japan, Germany, and other niche markets operated for the better liquoring teas whilst a little more in interest was seen for neater CTC teas from the "Tea Bag" sector.

This week's auction comprised of **12,572** lots with a total quantity of **7,823,049** Kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

BOP1: A few select best invoices advanced Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance too appreciated. Teas at the lower end were irregularly lower.

OP1 : Select best invoices were appreciated by Rs.3-40/- and more as the sale progressed; balance generally lower. Stalky invoices tended irregular.

OP : Teas in the select best category were maintained; balance declined by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.

OPA: Select best teas held firm; balance were declined Rs.10-20/- per kg. Poorer sorts were maintained.

PEK/PEK1: Well made shotty invoices were fully firm to dearer by Rs.20-30/- and at times more; balance was maintained. Best bolder Pekoes advanced Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance were fully firm to Rs.10-20/- dearer at the commencement but declined Rs.20/- and more particularly the latter part of the sale. Teas at the lower end were irregularly lower.

MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

SALE NO.25 OF THE 17TH/18TH JUNE, 2019.

Demand reduced further for the 156,178 packages (10.15m/kgs) on offer at irregularly easier rates with 31.78% remaining unsold.

Best **BP1s** available saw an irregular enquiry ranging between firm to USC16 dearer for the few improved invoices to easier by up to USC10 and some lines were unsold while Brighter varieties held firm to USC10 dearer with Mediums irregular varying between firm to USC30 above last rates to easier by USC9-USC12 and a few teas were neglected. Plainer descriptions were about steady to USC4 below previous levels with Plainest difficult of sale.

The Best **PF1's** in the market shed USC6-USC11 where sold while Brighter categories held steady to USC5 below previous levels with Medium typs firm to USC10 easier. Plainer sorts were steady but poorest were neglected.

Best **PDUSTs** available were a weak feature easing by USC22-USC35 with Brighter categories discounted by USC4- while Mediums were about steady to USC52 below last levels where sold. Plainer sorts varying between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by a similar level but poorest were difficult of sale.

The Best **DUST1s** on offer were a weak feature and shed USC38-USC68 with Brighter varieties discounted by USC14-USC25 while Medium sorts eased by USC13-USC60. Plainer types irregular ranging between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC5 and poorest were neglected.

In the **Secondary Catalogues** BPs were discounted while PFs eased. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings lost value while DUSTs were easier. Other Fannings were firm with DUSTs discounted. BMFs were well absorbed.

Egyptian Packers lent more and useful support with increased interest from Yemen and other Middle Eastern Countries. Pakistan Packers maintained activity while UK and Bazaar showed good but selective enquiry. There was less interest from Kazakhstan other CIS states, Afghanistan and Russia while Sudan were selective with Iran subdued. Somilia maintained activity at the lower end of the market.
