

# **SALE NO.30 OF 30<sup>TH</sup> & 31<sup>ST</sup> JULY, 2019.**

# COMMENTS

A weight of 7.2m/kgs was on offer at this week's auction. Low Grown Leafy teas totaled 2.1m/kgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf/Premium Flowery catalogues had 1.2m/kgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted1m/kgs.

There was fair demand for low grown teas resulting in a firm to dearer market. Stylish BOP1's, OP1's and OP / OPA's were firm to dearer whilst secondary descriptions also maintained previous levels. Most Pekoe descriptions too sold at firm prices. In the Tippy catalogues, the select best FBOP's were irregular but others were firm with well-made FBOPF1's fully maintaining previous week's prices as well. Buyers for the Middle East displayed keen interest on a cross-section of teas. Buyers for Russia, and the C I S, were strong on the better leafy teas, whilst Turkey and Syria continued to support Pekoes. Iraq and Libya were once again active for secondary teas.



A limited range of best westerns gained on last whilst the remainder together with Uva /Uda Pussellawa's were Rs. 10/- and more, easier. Poor leaf, plain liquoring teas were once again neglected which saw the unsold lots soar to higher levels than seen at recent auctions. CTC PF1's too met with much less interest and, consequently saw declines of Rs. 20/- and more where sold, whilst, the balance remained unsold. There was significantly less demand from "Tea Bag" buyers operating for Russia. Buyers for China, Japan, Hong Kong and Europe were also selective.

The latest figures relating to Sri Lanka Tea Exports for the first half of the current year are given below. Iraq emerges as the single largest market for "Ceylon Teas" followed by Turkey, Russia and Iran.

This week's auction comprised of 12,168 lots with a total quantity of 7,226,908 Kgs.

#### **LOW GROWNS – LEAFY**

**BOP1**: Select best teas declined Rs.40-50/ and more as the sale progressed; balance however maintained last week levels. Teas at the lower end maintained.

**OP1** : Select best invoices maintained; balance declined Rs.30-40/- and difficult of sale as the sale progressed. Stalky invoices too declined substantially.

**OP** : A few teas in the select best category held firm; balance on offer was irregularly lower by Rs.10-15/- per kg. Teas at the lower end too declined Rs.20-30/- and at times more.

**OPA**: Select best teas advanced Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance tended irregular. Poorer sorts declined Rs.20-25/- and more as the sale progressed.

**PEK/PEK1:** Well-made shotty invoices declined Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance tended irregular. Best bolder PEKOEs' advanced Rs.20/- and at times more; Balance too advanced Rs.20/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end maintained

were easier.

**FBOPFSP/EXSP**: Select best teas were marginally lower when compared to last week level whilst the best

and below best met with good demand and showed an improvement in price on last

levels.

**BOP:** Best Westerns declined Rs.20/-per kg and more. In the below best category, a selection of improved teas gained Rs.20-30/-per kg and more whilst the others were irregular and lower by a similar margin. At the lower end, plainer clean leaf teas were barely steady whilst the poor leaf types were discounted. Nuwara Eliyas –few select invoices were firm and dearer whilst the others were difficult of sale following plainer quality. Udapussellawas were barely steady. Uvas –select invoices were substantially dearer whilst the others were firm.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns –select improved teas gained Rs.20-30/-per kg and more whilst the majority were irregular and lower by a similar margin. In the below best category, a selection of improved teas gained Rs.20/-per kg and more whilst the others together with the plainer sorts sold around last. Nuwara Eliyas continued to sell at lower levels. Udapussellawas were irregular following quality. Uvas –selection of the better teas were Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst the others were easier following

# SALE NO.13 HELD ON MONDAY, 29<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2019

CTC LEAF: 39,760 packages of Current Season & 1007 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a fair demand.

**BROKENS:** Well made Brokens met with a fairly good demand and were about steady on last whilst all others were easier following quality. Plain varieties suffered quite heavy withdrawals and also witnessed a fair drop in price.

**FANNINGS:** Good Fannings met with a fairly good demand and were about steady. Medium types saw a little less demand and were easier by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/- with a few withdrawals. Plain types met with much less demand and were easier with quite heavy withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 7,868 packages of Current Season & 10 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with quite a good demand. Good liquoring varieties sold well at around last levels. Medium sorts were well absorbed at slightly easier rates. Plain and BLF teas met with only a selective enquiry and only a few were sold at much easier rates. Plainer categories saw an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by a similar margin with Plainest neglected.

The Best **PF1s** on offer were irregular and varied between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by a similar level while Brighter varieties ranged between firm to USC13 dearer to easier by up to USC5 with Medium types steady to USC 8 above last rates to easier by up to USC4. Plainer description were firm to USC6 dearer with a few improved in invoices gaining up to USC22.

Best **PDUST s** in the market wee well competed for and advanced by USC7-USC23 with Brighter categories advancing by USC6-USC38 while Mediums were irregular varying between steady to USC17 above last rages to easier by up to USC8. Plainer types mostly steady to USC9 below last rates.
