

A lower weight of 6.9 m/kgs was on offer at this week's auction. Low Grown Leafy teas totaled 2 m/kgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf/Premium Flowery catalogues had 1.1 m/kgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted 1 m/kgs.

Fair demand was seen for low grown teas. Stylish BOP1's, OP1's were mostly firm, while OP / OPA's were barely steady. At the lower price-end most teas ruled fully firm to dearer. Pekoes were irregular to marginally lower with bolder varieties experiencing diminishing demand. In the Tippy catalogues, the select best FBOP's were firm whilst others tended irregular. Well-made FBOPF1's fully maintained previous prices and Tippy teas continued to attract strong interest. Buyers for the Middle East operated on a wide range of grades. Buyers for Russia, and the C I S, were not as forceful as in the previous sale. Turkey and Syria were more selective. Iraq and Libya however, were more active for secondary teas.

Less overall demand was seen for High Growns. A range of brighter Western BOP's in the "below best" category advanced up to Rs. 20/- but it was disappointing to see the better teas not receiving the usual demand which consequently resulted in these teas declining Rs. 10/- to 20/- per kg. The select best Uva's with some seasonal character were sharply dearer following special interest. Uda Pussellawa's continued to be neglected and were absorbed at low price levels. A selected range of CTC PF1's with



neater leaf were much dearer, but others were discounted. There was limited demand from "Tea Bag" buyers operating for Russia. Buyers for Japan and Germany were active for the quality offerings, whilst China, Hong Kong and other European buyers were selective.

The national averages for January to July, 2019 of all elevational categories have shown a steep drop when compared to the same period last year. Whilst teas of "CTC" manufacture have suffered significant declines year-on-year, both Western High and Medium elevations too have registered fairly alarming declines as can be seen from the chart below.

This week's auction comprised of 12,073 lots with a total quantity of 6,975,178 Kgs.

BOP1: Teas in the select best category declined by Rs.40-50/- per kg; balance however maintained last week levels. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

OP1 : Select best invoices maintained; balance was firm to irregularly dearer by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Stalky invoices tended irregular.

• Select best together with best varieties declined Rs.30-40/- per kg and more as the sale progressed; balance too were lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end however advanced Rs.20/- per kg.

OPA: Select best teas were declined by Rs.40-50/- per kg; balance too lower by Rs.20-30/- per kg and at times more. Poorer sorts however advanced Rs.20/- per kg.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were firm on last levels; balance tended irregular; Best bolder PEK's declined substantially when compared to last week levels; balance too declined by Rs,20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end maintained.

BOP: Best Westerns were irregular and mostly Rs.10-20/- per kg lower. Brighter teas in the below best category gained Rs.20/- per kg and more for select invoices. Plainer sorts were generally firm whilst the poor leaf invoices were barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas were disappointing following quality. Udapussellawas were generally firm. Uva's – select invoices were particularly the seasonal teas were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others were Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer.

BOPF: Best Westerns declined Rs.20/- per kg. Teas in the below best category declined Rs.10-20/- per kg and more for the brighter sorts. Teas at the lower end were generally firm. Nuwara Eliyas together with Udapussellawas continued to sell at low levels following quality. Uvas were irregular and barely steady.

CTC LEAF: 55,152 PACKAGES OF Current Season and 1080 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a strong demand.

BROKENS: Good Brokens were a strong feature and were mostly dearer often by up to Tk.5/-. Mediums were about steady. However, plainer types met with a fair demand at lower rates with some withdrawals. Poorest continued to be difficult of sale with very heavy withdrawals.

FANNINGS: Bright Fannings met with a good demand and were fully firm to occasionally dearer. Medium types saw a better demand and were firm to slightly dearer. Plain varieties saw some enquiry and sold at irregularly easier rates. Poor varieties saw a little more enquiry but there was quite heavy withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,474 packages of Current Season on offer met with a fairly good demand. Best and good liquoring Dusts were firm to slightly dearer. Medium sorts sold well at around at last levels. BLF Dust met with a slightly better demand following some improvement in quality. However, plainer typs witnessed some withdrawals. Blenders once again lent good support with fair interest from the Loose Tea Buyers.

COMMENTS: This sale comprised of a much larger weight of tea than last but offerings were quite well absorbed without a decline of price. Blenders lent strong support whilst there was more interest from the Loose tea buyers. As a result of increased activity, the withdrawal percentage was lower and overall sale average was also higher. BLF varieities saw a little more enquiry but prices released were irregular. Yhere was again very heavy withdrawals in this section.

Dusts met with an improved demand.

The Best **BP1**'s in the market were a strong feature appreciating by USC24-USC28 with Brighter categories irregular varying between USC10 dearer by up to USC16 while Mediums ranged between firm to USC20 above previous levels to easier by a similar rate. Lower Medium descriptions were steady to USC4 dearer with plainer types firm to USC8 easier and plainest remained without bids.

The Best **PF1**'s available saw improved interest and gained USC8-USC12 with Brighter sorts advancing by USC7 to USC14 while Mediums were irregular varying between firm to USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC4. Lower Medium categories ranged between firm to USC11 dearer to easier by up to USC16 with Plainer varieties steady to USC4 below last rates and Plainest wre neglected.

The best **PDUST**'s on offer advanced by USC8-USC27 while Brighter varieties were well completed for and appreciated by USC17-USC28 with Medium varieties gaining USC3-USC16. Lower Mediums met an irregular enquiry and varied between firm to USC36 dearer to easier by up to USC6 while plainer descriptions varied between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC5.

The best **DUST1s** in the market appreciated by USC10-USC14 while Brighter varieties were steady to USC19 dearer with Mediums firm to USC13 above previous levels. Lower Medium sorts were mostly steady to USC5 easier while Plainer categories were firm to USC4 dearer.

In the **Secondary Catalogues** BPs eased with PF's firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were dearer while similar Dust's appreciated. Other Fannings were discounted while Dust's gained. BMF's were well absorbed at improved levels.
