

## LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT



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## SALE NO.33 OF $20^{TH}/21^{ST}$ AUGUST, 2019. C O M M E N T S

This week's auction had a quantity of 7.2 m/kgs with Low Grown Leafy Grades comprising 2 m/kgs, and, 1.2 m/kgs for Tippy/Small Leaf teas. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 1 m/kgs. The quality of Low Growns was somewhat irregular as a fair amount of offerings had been manufactured following rainy weather. A small range of teas from the eastern side of the island had typical Uva character whilst apart from selected Westerns, the balance continued to have uninteresting leaf and liquors.

Middle Eastern buyers were not as strong as in previous weeks and it does appear that their full buying strength has still not returned to the Colombo Tea Auctions after the Eid-Ul-Adha holidays. Turkey was more selective whilst buyers for Russia and the C. I. S were fairly active. Selected BOP1's and OP1's were fully firm to dearer, but OP/OPA's in general were irregular and lower for secondary teas. Well-made Pekoe / Pekoe1's were barely steady although bolder types ruled firm. In the Tippy catalogues, FBOP's/FBOPF1's were firm to easier. Very Tippy teas continued to attract good interest and were fully firm.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, a range of select best Westerns and Uva's sold at dearer rates following special demand, but, there was noticeably less demand for the balance offerings. A large availability of teas continued to have poor leaf and dull liquors and these teas continued to be neglected. There was fair interest from Japan and Germany for the best liquoring teas, whilst Hong Kong and China displayed more interest for neater below best teas. There was much less demand from "Tea Bag" and "Bulk" buyers operating for the Russian market.

This week's auction comprised of 12,474 lots with a total quantity of 7,275,497 Kgs.

#### **LOW GROWNS – LEAFY**

**BOP1**: Select best invoices were maintained; balance firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

**OP1** : Teas in the select best category firm to dearer; balance were irregular and at times more difficult of sale. Stalky invoices too declined.

**OP** : Select best invoices firm to lower; balance declined Rs.20-30/- and held with a less demand. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

**OPA**: Select best teas were lower by Rs.20/-per kg; balance too lower and at times were difficult of sale. Poorer sorts however gained Rs.20/- per kg at the latter part of the sale.

**PEK/PEK1:** Well-made shotty invoices were maintained; balance too fully firm to lower. Best bolder Pekoes were per kg; balance too lower by Rs.20-30/- and at times more. Poorer sorts were irregularly lower by Rs.20-30/- per kg.

dearer. Balance sold around last levels. Select best and best FF1's were easier. Cleaner below

best and cleaner teas at the lower end were firm to dearer. Balance were firm on last.

**FBOPFSP/EXSP**: Select best were firm to dearer and met with good demand whilst the balance too followed

a similar trend.

#### **HIGH GROWN**

**BOP:** Best Westerns declined Rs.20-30/-per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week. Teas in the below best category -few select invoices sold at dearer rates whilst the others declined Rs.20/-per kg and more. At the lower end prices were firm. Nuwara Eliyas -select invoices were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others sold around last. Udapussellawas –clean leaf teas were firm whilst the others were Rs.10-20/-per kg lower. Uvas –seasonal teas appreciated substantially following special inquiry whilst the other coloury sorts appreciated to a lesser extent.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns –select invoices appreciated following special inquiry whilst the others were irregular and tended easier. Teas in the below best category declined Rs.20/-per kg and more. At the lower end prices were generally firm. Nuwara Eliyas were generally firm. Udapussellawas gained Rs.20/-per kg and more with the exception of very fibrous invoices that were barely steady. Uvas –seasonal teas were substantially dearer whilst the other coloury sorts too appreciated to a lesser extent.

#### **BANGLADESH AUCTION**

#### Sale 15 held on Tuesday 20th August, 2019.

CTC LEAF: 63,393 packages of Current Season and & 1573 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a strong demand.

**BROKENS:** Well made Brokens were well competed for and were mostly dearer by Tk.2/- to Tk.3/- and sometimes more. Medium Brokens were mostly firm. Plainer varieties saw a better demand at last levels. There was more absorption of these types at firm rates. Poor types elicited a little enquiry and there were heavy withdrawals.

**FANNINGS:** Good liquoring Fannings were a strong feature and were mostly fully firm to slightly dearer following competition particularly the improved invoices. Mediums were fully firm to a touch dearer. Plain types witnessed a fairly good demand and were about steady but there were some withdrawals. Poor varieties met with only a limited enquiry and there were heavy withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,965 packages of Current Season Teas on offer met with quite a good demand. Best and good liquoring Dusts met with good competition and were dearer by Tk.5/- to Tk.7/-. Medium Dusts were fully firm. Plainer and BLF varieties were around last levels. Blenders lent strong support with only some interest from the Loose tea buyers.

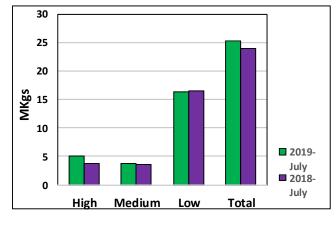


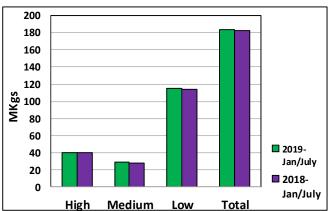


## Sri Lanka Tea Production-July 2019 vs. 2018 (In Kgs)
