This week's auction comprised of **11,585** lots with a total quantity of **6,605,023** Kgs.



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# SALE NO.38 OF 24<sup>TH</sup>/ 25<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER, 2019. C O M M E N T S

Flood warnings for three rivers have been issued as heavy rains continue to lash across Sri Lanka. With precipitation at 94% forecast for the next few days and around 200 millimeters of rainfall experienced yesterday, the Department of Meteorology expects the current weather pattern to last till at least the end of September. Further, The National Building Research Organization has issued a level 1 (yellow) landslide early warning for Kalutara, Galle and Kegalle districts which all have a vast cover of plantations. These adverse conditions have had a telling effect on crop intakes as growth has been stunted by the absence of sunlight which is a *sine quo non* for flush. All plantation districts have additionally reported a poor worker turnout following these conditions and a further drop in auction volumes in the sales scheduled to close in the immediate future is envisaged.

A lower weight of 6.6 m/kgs was on offer this week. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.9 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 1 m/kgs which was around last week's figure.

There was only fair demand for well made, true to type low grown teas. The better made leafy BOP1's and OP1's ruled firm as did cleaner OP/OPA's. Demand from Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Syria, Jordon, the U. A. E. and Turkey was subdued. Iran continued fairly active for very tippy teas as well as the best available FBOP's and FBOPF1's but secondary teas once again received weak demand. Iraq and Libya were more selective.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, there was wider interest for the better made high growns which was a welcome sign in an otherwise dull market which has been prevalent for the past several months. There is now a clear signal to the producer sector that a tea with reasonably neat leaf appearance, and, good liquor merit, will be amply rewarded in the future sales. Below best and poor teas however, continued to be heavily discounted, amidst total apathy displayed by buyers for poor teas. CTC PF1's from the High and Medium elevations received more selective demand this week although the brighter and coloury Low Grown teas were dearer up to Rs. 30/- and more. Russia together with Europe, Hong Kong and China bid selectively for their requirements. Japan showed greater interest on the better liquoring sorts.

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#### LOW GROWNS – LEAFY

- **BOP1** : Select best invoices declined Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance was fully firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower end LOST Rs.20/- and at time more.
- **OP1** : A few select best teas gained substantially following quality; balance was lower by Rs.20-30/- and at times more difficult of sale. Poorer sorts too followed a similar trend.
- **OP** : Best teas held firm; balance however advanced Rs.10-15/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were fully firm to dearer by Rs.5-10/- per kg.
- **OPA** : A few select best teas held firm; balance was dearer by Rs.10-15/- per kg. Poorer sorts too were maintained.

**PEK/PEK1:** A few well made shotty invoices gained substantially; balance too continued to attract good demand. Best bold PEKOEs' were barely steady; balance dearer by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Poorer sort too followed a similar trend.

- **FBOPF/FBOPF1 :** Very Tippy teas continue to attract good demand. Best were firm on last. Balance eased. However a few clean teas at the lower end were fully firm too marginally dearer. Select best FF1's were firm to dearer whilst best together with cleaner below best and cleaner teas at the lower end were firm. Balance declined
- **FBOPFSP/EXSP**: Select best invoices maintained last levels whilst below best Secondaries and poorer sorts were an easier feature.

Teas in the below best category declined Rs.20/-per kg and more whilst teas at the lower end declined Rs.30/-per kg and more for the poor leaf teas. Nuwara Eliyas –select invoices sold at dearer rates following special inquiry whilst the others were neglected. Udapussellawas –select best were Rs.20-30/-per kg dearer whilst the others were neglected. Better Uvas were Rs.30-40/-per kg dearer whilst the others were barely steady.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns –select invoices gained Rs.20/-per kg and more whilst the others were irregular and lower. Teas in the below best category were Rs.20/-per kg lower. Teas at the lower end were barely steady whilst the poor leaf teas were neglected. Nuwara Eliyas/ Udapussellawas were Rs.10-20/-per kg lower. Better Uvas were Rs.30-40/-per kg easier whilst the others were irregular and lower to a lesser extent.

# **BANGLADESH AUCTION**

# Sale 20 held on Monday 23rd September, 2019

CTC LEAF: 42,657 packages of Current Season and 524 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with much less demand at progressively easier rates.

**BROKENS:** Initially Brokens met with a fair demand at about Tk.4/- to Tk.6/- lower than last levels but with the progress of sale, demand slackened and prices eased further by upto Tk.5/- to Tk.8/- with fair withdrawals. Medium Brokens followed a similar trend. Plainer types saw only a little interest and there again prices eased. There was hardly any interest for the plain and poor varieties and these were withdrawn owing to lack of bids.

**FANNINGS:** Like the above, Fannings met with a similar trend and prices were generally lower by Tk.5/- to Tk.8/- from previous levels with quite a lot of withdrawals. Plain and poor types suffered heavier withdrawals.

**CTC DUST:** 7,959 packages of Current Season and 51 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a fairly good demand at easier rates. There was improved demand for the 136,949 packages (9.06m/kgs) available. Only 10.60% were unsold.

Best **BP1s** on offer saw irregular enquiry with select and improved lines appreciation by up to USC90 while others raged between ranged between firm to USC17 dearer to easier by up to USC7. Brighter categories were irregular varying between steady to USC20 dearer to easier by up to USC7 while Medium types varied between firm to USC7 dearer to easier by USC10-USC17 and a few invoices were unsold. Plainer varieties irregular and varied between firm to USC20 dearer to easier by up to USC10.

The Best **PF1s** in the market gained USC4-USC12 while Brighter varieties advanced by USC4-USC8 with Mediums irregular ranging between USC 5-USC16 above previous prices to easier by up to USC5. Plainer sorts irregular varying between firm to USC5 dearer to easier by up to USC9.

Best **PDUSTs** available were barely steady to USC6 easier with Brighter sorts about steady to USC8 below last levels while Medium types were irregular and varied between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by USC2-USC14. Plainer descriptions fully firm to USC20 dearer.

The Best **DUST1s** on offer were a weak feature and shed USC16-USC52 with brighter sorts ranging between steady to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC11 while Medium varieties were fully firm to USC30 easier. Plainer categories USC2-USC8 dearer.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, **BPs** appreciated with PFs dearer. Clean well sorted coloury fannings advanced while similar DUSTs eased. Other Fanings were dearer with DUST1s gaining BMFs were well absorbed.
