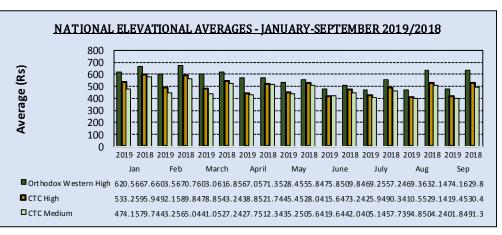
#### COMMENTS

After several days of heavy precipitation across all planting districts, the weather has taken a turn for the better during the last few days where the earlier reported gloomy skies have given way to some bright sunshine. Crop intakes too have shown an improvement following the change in climatic conditions whilst life in the flood affected areas is slowly returning to normal.

The National Averages for teas sold in September have been released and comprehensive details appear elsewhere in this report. The graph below gives an analysis of selected elevational national averages, and it will be noted that substantial price drops in the averages

have taken place month after month this year, compared to the same period of 2018. The Orthodox Western High average of Rs. 620.52 in January this year has come down to Rs. 474.10 and, similarly CTC High from Rs. 533.15 to Rs. 419.41 and CTC Medium from Rs. 474.08 to Rs. 401.89!

A lower weight of 6.4 m/kgs was on offer this week. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.9 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale



High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 0.9 m/kgs which was slightly lower to last week's figure.

Fair demand prevailed for low grown teas. The better made leafy BOP1's and OP1's were fully firm to dearer whilst the better OP/OPA's too appreciated on last levels. Well made, true to grade Pekoes received wider buying interest from buyers for Turkey and Syria, and prices were fully firm to dearer. There was sustained interest from Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, and the U. A. E. Iran continued to actively bid on the best Tippy teas as well as stylish FBOP's and FBOPF1's. However, below best and poorer quality offerings were irregularly lower. Iraq and Libya were again rather selective.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, there was more demand for the best liquoring high growns which saw further price gains from the previous week; a most welcome sign for producers of good quality tea. Neater teas in the "below best" category too were in receipt of better interest and were Rs. 10/- to 20/- dearer. The poor leaf, plain types however continued to be neglected. Russia was selective. There was maintained interest from Europe, Hong Kong and China. Japan was active for the better liquoring sorts.

- **BOP1** : A few select best teas gained Rs.40-50/- following quality; balance on average advanced Rs.20/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end too were irregularly dearer.
- **OP1** : Select best invoices continue to attract good demand; balance was irregularly lower. Stalky invoices however held firm.
- **OP** : Teas in the select best category together with best teas declined by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance however fully firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower end too maintained.
- **OPA** : Select best teas were barely steady; balance was maintained. Poorer sorts were generally lower.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well made shotty invoices continue to attract good demand; balance appreciated by Rs.30-40/- per kg. Best bold Pekoes gained Rs.20-30/- and at times more; balance too followed a similar trend. Teas at the lower end too were dearer.

- **FBOP/FBOP1** : Select best FBOP's appreciated. Best and cleaner below best were firm to dearer. Cleaner teas at the lower end maintained. Others were lower. Select best and best FBOP1's were firm to dearer; others were irregularly lower.
- **FBOPF/FBOPF1**: Very tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and cleaner teas in the below best were firm to dearer. Others were lower. Select best FF1's together with the best were dearer. Cleaner below best too appreciated. Others and teas at the lower end declined following quality.
- **FBOPFSP/EXSP :** Select best invoices maintained last levels whilst below best Secondaries and poorer sorts were an easier feature.

**BOP:** Best Westerns –few select invoices gained Rs.20-30/-per kg and more following special inquiry whilst the others were irregular. In the below best category, few clean leaf brighter teas gained Rs.10-20/-per kg whilst the others were irregular. Plainer teas were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg lower. Nuwara Eliyas were irregular following quality. Udapussellawas –select high priced teas continued to sell well, although at irregular rates whilst the other poorer sorts gained Rs.20/-per kg and more. Uvas sold well with select invoices appreciating following special inquiry.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns –select high priced teas were barely steady whilst the others gained Rs.20-30/-per kg. In the below best category, brighter sorts gained Rs.30-50/-per kg and more whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Plainer sorts were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas gained Rs.50/-per kg and more. Udapussellawas –select high priced teas were irregular whilst the other poorer sorts were Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer. Uvas gained Rs.20-40/-per kg and more for select invoices.

#### **INTERNATIONAL TEA NEWS**

The East Africa Tea Industry is seeking to expand into the Chinese market in order to boost its declining revenues, an official said on Thursday.

Edward Mudibo, managing director of the East African Tea Trade Association (EATTA) told Xinhua in Nairobi that the region is experiencing increasing production while demand for the cash crop has stagnated hence lower prices at the Mombasa tea auction.

"We plan to sign a memorandum of understanding with the Chinese tea trade association later in the year so that more east Africa tea is sold in China," Mudibo said. EATTA represents the interests of the tea industry in Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi, Ethiopia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Malawi, Madagascar and Mozambique.

The trade association said its principal mandate is to run the weekly Mombasa tea auction center which is currently the largest tea auction center in the world and the only one dealing in teas from more than one country.

Mudibo said that the auction has more than 70 buyers but key markets are Pakistan, Egypt, Britain, Sudan, Yemen and United Arab Emirates.

He noted that if more Chinese buyers enter the tea market it will boost the price at the market and increase foreign revenues for the region.

According to the tea industry official, the Mombasa tea auction center traded over 400 million kilograms of tea valued at over 100 billion shillings (\$1 billion) in 2018.

Mudibo revealed that in July, the Mombasa tea auction witnessed the lowest average price of 1.76 U.S. per kg due to overproduction of tea.

# **Crop & Weather** For the period 23<sup>rd</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> September 2019

Western/Nuwara Eliya and Udapussellawa Regions: Overcast and rainy weather prevailed throughout the week in all three regions. Showery conditions are expected to continue in the week ahead according to The Department of Meteorology. Uva Region: Bright mornings and wet evenings were reported during the week. The Department of Meteorology expects rain (75-100 mm) in the days to come. Low Growns: Both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported showery conditions throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts misty conditions in the Sabaragamuwa Region in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: Uva, Udapussellawa and Nuwara Eliya regions maintained the crop intake, whilst Western, Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions showed a decrease.

# OTHER MARKETS

#### BANGLADESH AUCTION Sale 21 held on Tuesday 1st October, 2019.

**CTC LEAF:** 65,698 packages of Current Season & 280 packages of Old Season Teas on offer once again met with less demand and prices eased further. There were heavier withdrawals.

**BROKENS:** Good Brokens met with a fairly good enquiry at the beginning but demand slackened thereafter with prices dropping by Tk.5/- to Tk.8/- with fair withdrawals. Medium Brokens met with a similar trend. Plain types were difficult of sale with heavier withdrawals. Poor varieties met with some enquiry but again at lower rates.

**FANNINGS:** In this section also buyers were less active particularly at the latter half of the sale and prices fell further. There were also quite heavy withdrawals in all varieties particularly for the Plain and poor types.

**CTC DUST:** 11,780 packages of Current Season & 20 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a good general demand. Clean, well made, best liquoring teas sold at around last levels. Good and Medium teas were barely steady and tending easier in line with quality. Plain and BLF teas met with less demand and also witnessed fair withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

**COMMENTS:** A larger weight of tea was offered this week but owing to lack of competition prices declined further and there were also heavy withdrawals particularly for the plain and poor varieties. However, two major Blenders were the mainstay of the market who absorbed the bulk of offerings.Dusts were an easier market.

Demand was strong at the opening and closed at about firm levels for the 139,731 packages (9.200m/kgs) on offer. 10.15% remained without bids.

The Best BP1s in the market met strong enquiry gaining USV8-USC80 while Brighter varieties held firm to USC13 below last rates with Mediums irregular ranging between firm to USC24 dearer to easier by USC7-USC10. Plainer descriptions well absorbed and advanced by USC10-USC21.

Best **PF1s** available appreciated by USC4-USC18 with Brighter types irregular varying between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC2 while Medium sorts ranged between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC4. Plainer descriptions advanced by USC10-USC12.

The Best **PDUSTs** on offer were USC6-USC10 above last levels while Brighter varieties were irregular and varied between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC10 with Mediums ranging between USC8-USC10 dearer to easier by USC6-USC9. Plainer types were USC3-USC8 dearer.

Best **DUST1s** available were firm to USC15 dearer while Brighter varieties were irregular varying between firm to USC6 to easier by up to USC7 with Medium descriptions ranging between USC8-USC20 above previous rates to easier by up to USC8. Plainer sorts ranged between firm to USC10 dearer to easier by up to USC5.

In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs were firm while PFs appreciated. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were dearer with similar DUSTs advancing. Other Fannings gained while similar DUSTs held value. BMFs were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers lent strong support and were dominant while Afghanistan showed more interest and were dominant. There were more enquiries from Yemen, other Middle Eastern Countries, Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Sudan and Russia. Egyptian Packers lent strong activity with UK active but selective. Bazaar showed reduced interest. Iran were quiet while Somalia were more active at the lower end of the market.
