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SALE NO.41 OF 15TH/16TH OCTOBER, 2019 C O M M E N T S

The overall Tea Production for the month of September is recorded as 21.7 m/kgs, and, is a gain of 2.3 m/kgs over the corresponding month last year. In analyzing the monthly production however, it will be noted that only the low grown elevation has given a surplus whilst both high and medium elevations show lower production levels to September, 2018. The reason behind this is the extremely rainy conditions experienced in the hill country throughout September this year which retarded growth. During the ytd period of 2019, a total crop of 232 m/kgs has been achieved showing a year-on-year positive variance of 9.7 m/kgs. It is noted that 2/3rd of the cumulative surplus is from the low grown plantations.

Overcast mornings followed by fairly heavy evening showers have been reported from all planting districts. The Department of Meteorology expects this type of weather to continue in to the week ahead as well. All plantations have reported a low intake of crop.

A higher volume of 6.3m/kg was on offer this week which was 0.4 m/kg above last week. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.9 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to approximately 0.9 m/kgs which was marginally higher to last week's figure.

Fair demand was once again prevalent for low grown teas. The better made, stylish BOP1's and OP1's were generally firm to dearer whilst the better leafy OP/OPA's ruled fully firm. Below best teas fully maintained last levels. Shotty Pekoes were fully firm to dearer, while bolder descriptions held firm. The very tippy teas continued to attract good buying interest from a cross section of exporters whilst well made FBOP's and FBOPF1'swere about firm to sometimes a little easier. Saudi Arabia, Syria, Kuwait and the U. A. E. were active with maintained interest from Turkey. Iran was selective and tended to closely follow quality. Bottom end teas again met with subdued interest from Iraq and Libya.

Improved demand was seen for high growns in the Ex Estate catalogue, and, liquoring BOPF in particular recorded sharp price gains. Neater "below best" teas also saw greater absorption by a wider set of buyers at prices which were Rs. 20/- to 40/- dearer on last. The best low grown CTC PF1's continued to be keenly sought after and appreciated Rs. 20/- to 50/- per kg. High and medium PF1's opened fully firm but gained sharply as the sale progressed following some late buying orders received half way through the Ex Estate sale. There was maintained interest from Japan for the select liquoring teas with competition from Germany and a few other niche European markets. Hong Kong, China and Russia too were more active

- **BOP1** : Select best together with best invoices declined by Rs.40-50/- and more as the sale progressed; balance however appreciated by Rs.10-20/- per kg.
- **OP1** : Teas in the select best category were fully firm on last week levels; balance tended irregular. Stalky invoice declined by Rs.20/- and at times more.
- **OP** : Select best teas maintained; balance too were fully firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower were barely steady.
- **OPA** : Best teas were fully firm to dearer by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance maintained. Poorer sorts tended irregular.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well-made shotty invoices were barely steady; balance however fully firm on last week levels. Best bold PEKOEs too maintained; balance appreciated by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were generally easier.

BOP: Best Westerns –select high priced teas declined Rs.10-20/-per kg whilst the others were firm and dearer by a similar margin. Teas in the below best category -brighter sorts were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst the others together with the plainer sorts were difficult of sale. Nuwara Eliyas –select invoices gained Rs.20-40/-per kg and more following quality. Udapussellawas –select brighter teas were firm whilst the others were Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer following quality. Uvas continued to sell well.

BOPF: Best Westerns, where quality was maintained, were firm and tended dearer. In the below best category - brighter sorts gained Rs.20-40/-per kg and more whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end prices were mostly firm. Nuwara Eliyas were firm and tended dearer. Udapussellawas were firm and up to Rs.10/-per kg dearer. Uvas were Rs.10-20/-per kg lower.

Good but irregular demand for the 139,720 packages (9.25m/kgs) in the market 10.68% remained unsold.

The Best BP1s available were about steady to USC11 easier while Brighter varieties saw an irregular enquiry varying between USC2-USC27 dearer to easier by up to USC6 with Mediums appreciating by USC2-USC32 but a few lines were difficult of sale. Plainer descriptions ranging between fully firm levels to USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC2.

Best **PF1s** on offer advanced by USC2-USC12 with Brighter categories easing by USC5-USC18 while Medium varieties ranged between firm to USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC2. Plainer varieties were steady to USC9 dearer with Plainest varieties were steady to USC9 dearer with Plainest neglected.

The Best **PDUSTs** in the market were irregular varying between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC6 WHILE Brighter sorts steady USC4 to USC6 with Mediums irregular ranging between firm to USC8 above previous rates to easier by up to USC2. Plainer categories were steady to USC2 below last levels and a few invoices were unsold.

Best **DUST1s** on offer met good enquiry at firm to USC24 dearer with Brighter categories saw more competition and advanced by USC11 to USC18 with Medium varieties well competed for at USC9-USC50 and more, above previous rates. Plainer descriptions appreciated by USC8-USC15 but a few teas remained without bids.

In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs held value with PF1s were firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings gained while DUSTs were steady. Other Fannings wee firm while DUSTs held steady BMF's were well absorbed at dearer rates,

Pakistan Packers lent strong support with useful enquiry from Egyptian Packer. Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and Afghanistan and there was increased interest from Bazaar, Kazakhstan and other CIS nation showed useful activity with less support from Sudan, UK and Russia and were selective. Iran were quiet Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.




An overall improved crop intake has been recorded for the month of September 2019, due largely to the +2.6 Mkgs month-on-month harvest made in the Low Grown elevation whilst both High & Medium elevations recorded a lower crop than September, 2018, due to the heavy showery conditions that were experienced, which hampered growth. During the period January to September 2019, a total crop of 232.7 Mkgs has been harvested reflecting a year-on-year improvement of 9.6 Mkgs.
