## **COMMENTS**

Heavy rains continue to lash plantation areas and the prevailing adverse weather conditions are likely to continue in the coming days, according to the Department of Meteorology. Meanwhile, The Disaster Management Centre (DMC) issued landslide warnings for Ratnapura, Kegalle, Kalutara and Badulla which all have large extents of land occupied by plantations. Latest reports indicate that 5660 people have so far been affected by these adverse weather conditions. The inclement weather is creating many hardships to the plantation labour who are unable to effectively carry out the day's tasks including the harvesting of leaf and agricultural practices. All plantations have therefore once again reported a low intake of crop.

A lower volume of 6 m/kg was on offer this week which was 0.3 m/kg below last week. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to approximately 0.9 m/kgs.

Fair demand was seen for low grown teas. Well made, stylish BOP1's and OP1's were fully firm whilst the better leafy OP/OPA's generally maintained last levels. Below best teas were selectively dearer. Shotty Pekoes were fully firm to dearer, while poorer sorts were maintained. The better FBOP's and FBOPF1's were generally firm, whilst select best tippy parcels continued to attract useful demand. Buyers for Saudi Arabia, Syria, Kuwait and the U. A. E. maintained their buying strength. Turkey was active for Pekoes. Iran too was strong on tippy varieties.

Less demand was seen for high growns in the Ex Estate catalogue, and, liquoring BOP/BOPF were seen to record price drops of Rs.20/- to 40/- per kg. A very limited range of selected westerns however, sold at marginally higher prices when supported by air mail enquiry. High priced selected Uda Pussellawa's once again received strong demand from buyers for "The Orient", chiefly China, Taiwan and Japan. There was subdued interest from the liquoring buyers for Europe but Russia continued to be active for "Tea Bag" types. The best low grown CTC PF1's were again keenly sought after and appreciated Rs.20/- and more per kg.

## LOW GROWNS – LEAFY

- **BOP1** : Select best invoices declined substantially; balance too declined Rs.20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were generally firm.
- **OP1** : Teas in the select best category declined Rs.50-60/- and at times more; balance maintained last week levels. Stalky invoices however declined Rs.20-30/- and at times more.
- **OP** : A few select best teas held firm; balance was irregularly lower by Rs.10-15/- per kg. Teas at the lower end maintained.
- **OPA** : Select best invoices were maintained at the commencement of the sale but declined Rs.30-40/- and more particularly towards the latter part of the sale; balance too easier by Rs.20-30/- and at times more. Poorer sorts were generally firm.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well-made shotty invoices declined by Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance however maintained last week levels. Best bold Pekoes declined by Rs.30-40/- and at times more; balance too eased by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end too generally a lower feature.

**BOP:** Best Westerns –select high priced teas declined Rs.20/-per kg and more whilst the others were firm and often dearer by a similar margin. In the below best category, select brighter invoices were Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst the others were lower by a similar margin. Clean leaf plainer sorts were Rs.10-20/-per kg lower whilst the others were firm. Nuwara Eliya –select improved invoices were substantially dearer whilst the others were difficult of sale. Udapussellawa –select high priced teas were firm and tended dearer whilst the others sold around last. Uvas were mostly firm and dearer.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns –select high priced teas were Rs.30-40/-per kg lower on last whilst the others were irregular. Teas in the below best category were Rs.10-20/-per kg lower. At the lower end, prices were mostly firm. Nuwara Eliyas declined Rs.20-30/-per kg. Udapussellawas were Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer following quality. Uvas –select invoices were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others were irregular following quality.

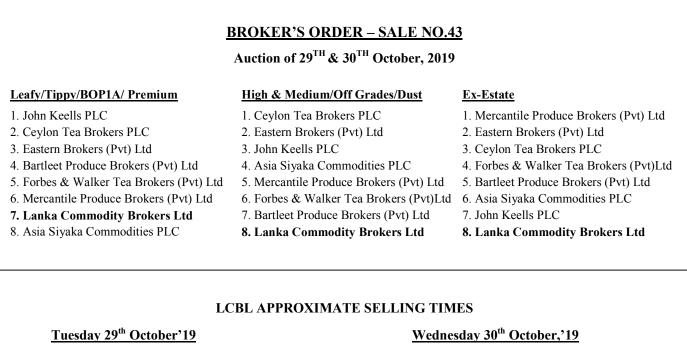

## INTERNATIONAL TEA NEWS

#### Tea price hits six-month high at Mombasa auction

#### Thursday, October 17, 2019

Tea prices at the Mombasa trading have hit a six-month high as a series of good sales continued at the auction in the last one month. A market report by the East African Tea Traders Association (EATTA) indicates that a kilo of tea fetched Sh233 up from Sh225 in the previous sale. The traded volume increased by over 500,000 tonnes, one of the largest jumps in quantity in recent months, as the tea sector recovers from the dry weather that hit the country in the first quarter. "The average price increased to Sh233 when compared to last week's Sh225," says EATTA

The impressive performance gives farmers hope of earning a good bonus at the end of this financial year, if the trend continues, coming at a time growers have just earned the low returns from the previous fiscal year. Tea farmers affiliated to KTDA earned lower returns of Sh69.7 billion in 2018/2019 financial year in what the agency attributed to low international prices. Last year farmers earned Sh84 billion. There has been an outcry over the recent payout that has left farmers desperate. The reduced earnings placed Kenya at position two globally in terms of payment to farmers, having paid the growers an average of Sh42 per kilo. It was followed by Sri-Lanka at Sh48. Kenya is the leading exporter of the commodity in the world, selling 95 percent of its tea in the global market.

Kenya is exploring new markets and expanding the existing ones such as China, which has potential to buy more of the local tea.

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## CONGRATULATIONS TO KALUBOWITIYANA TEA FACTORY

## All time Record Price

At this week's Ex Estate Tea Auction, an invoice of PF1 of Kalubowitiyana Tea Factory, secured a top price of Rs.980/- per kg which equals the existing Colombo Tea Auction Record Price for a CTC PF1 grade from any of Sri Lanka's High, Medium and Low elevations. This tea was purchased by Messrs Commercial Export Company amidst stiff competition from several other buyers i.e, Lipton, Uniworld, Ranfer, Ceylon Tea Marketing and St. Clair Teas, and, was sold through the catalogue of Lanka Commodity Brokers Ltd.

Kalubowitiyana is a Government owned tea factory situated in Neluwa of the Southern Province, and borders the picturesque Sinharaja Strict Natural Reserve. This factory is renowned for the production of the finest low grown CTC teas, following the "quality drive" initiated by the estate manager, Mr. Janaka Tilakaratne, who insists on a very high standard of green leaf for manufacture. This factory comes under the purview of The Ministry of Plantation Industries.

#### OTHER MARKETS MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

#### SALE NO.43 OF THE 22<sup>ND</sup> & 23<sup>RD</sup> OCTOBER, 2019.

There was fairly good demand for the 147,279 packages (9.72m/kgs) on offer at irregular rates closely following quality. 12.06% were neglected.

Best BP1's in the market met improved interest gaining up to USC41 following quality but a few lines shed up to USC10 with Brighter sorts irregular and ranged between USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC27 while Medium categories were discounted by USC5-USC34 where sold. The Best PD1s available eased by USC12-USC30 following quality while Brighter types saw an irregular enquiry varying between USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC27 and some teas were unsold with Mediums better absorbed and ranged between USC2-USC4 above previous levels to easier by USC6-USC14. Plainer types about firm to USC8 easier and a few invoices were difficult of sale.

Best PDUSTs on offer shed USC8 to USC10 with Brighter categories easing by USC10-USC14 while Medium types met an irregular enquiry ranging between USC2-USC4 above previous levels to easier by USC16-USC22. Plainer descriptions firm to USC4 easier and a few invoices were unsold.

The Best DUSTs in the market gained USC4 but a few lines shed up to USC2 with Brighter sorts appreciating by up to USC7 while Mediums saw an irregular activity varying between firm to USC11 above last rates to easier by up to USC6. Plainer varieties discounted by up to USC8 and some teas were neglected but a few improved invoices gained up to USC2.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BPs were steady with PFs firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fanning s held value while similar DUSTs were steady. Other Fannings were firm while DUSTs held value. BMFs were readily absorbed.

Pakistan Packers showed strong interest with more and strong support from Kazakhstan and other CIS states. There was less activity from Egyptian Packers, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, Sudan, UK and Russia. Afghanistan and Bazaar maintained interest. Iran were subdued. Somalia lent strong support at the lower end of the Market.
