COMMENTS

The National Elevational Averages for October, 2019 have been released and a welcome improvement is seen in the combined Orthodox and CTC average which is recorded as Rs. 527.34 reflecting a gain of Rs. 14.51 over September. Out of the orthodox segment, the October western high average of Rs. 500.19 is a gain of Rs. 26.09 over the previous month whilst low grown elevation average of Rs. 572.36 is Rs. 19.64 higher. CTC teas too have shown increases across all three elevations, and, more details are given elsewhere in this report. In terms of the combined total orthodox and CTC volume sold up to end October, 2019 it will be noted that the weight of 255,663,174 kg is an improvement of 11.2 m/kg over the corresponding period last year.

An all-round moderate increase in crop intakes has been reported from the planting districts following the recent heavy showers experienced. Normal work has now resumed in the estates after the Deepavali Holidays amidst intermittent bursts of evening rainfall preceded by sunny mornings.

This week's quantity of 5.6 m/kg was mostly similar to last week's auction weight. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.5 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.6 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 781,737 kgs.

Once again there was quite fair and widespread demand for leafy low grown teas. Well made BOP1's/OP1's as well as OP/OPA's were fully firm to dearer. Shotty and well-made Pekoes were selectively dearer whilst the balance was mostly firm. Buyers for Saudi Arabia and other Middle Eastern destinations were active whilst there was more absorption from buyers for Russia, and, the C. I. S. as well. Turkey was selective. In the "Tippy & Small Leaf" catalogue, there was maintained demand from Iran and the U. A. E. The better FBOP's and FBOPF1's were firm to dearer. The best available very tippy teas continued to sell well at higher prices.

There was improved demand for Ex Estate teas, particularly at the "below best" and "lower-end" of the market. Select high priced western BOP's however, eased up to Rs. 20/- per kg, whilst their BOPF counterparts eased up to Rs.50/- following more selective buying by buyers for Japan, Hong Kong, China, Taiwan and Europe. Plainer teas with acceptable leaf appearance were hotly pursued by bulk buyers operating for Russia and some Far Eastern countries. CTC teas too enjoyed robust demand from the "Tea Bag" sector with prices appreciating Rs. 20/- and more across all three elevations

BOP1: Select best teas held firm; balance was appreciated by Rs.10-20/-per kg. Teas at the lower end were maintained.

• Teas in the select best category were fully firm to selectively dearer; balance too advanced Rs.20/per kg. Stalky invoices declined Rs.20-30/- per kg.

OP : A few teas in the select best category held firm; balance was irregularly lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower were maintained.

OPA: Select best category were declined by Rs.30-40/- and at times more; balance too lower by Rs.30-40/- and times were difficult of sale. Poorer sorts were barely steady.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were fully firm on last week levels; balance tended irregular. Best bold PEKOEs were lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance too irregularly lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were maintained.

FBOPF/FBOPF1: Very tippy teas attracted good demand and were substantially dearer. Best and well made below best sorts too appreciated. Cleaner teas at the lower end gained Rs.40/- per kg and more. Others maintained. Select best and best FF1's were dearer. Below best together with cleaner teas at the lower end appreciated. Others maintained.

FBOPFSP/EXSP: Very tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best category sold on last week's levels whilst below best and the other sorts were appreciated Rs.50/- per kg.

Teas in the below best category gained by Rs.50/-per kg whilst the plainer sorts appreciated further. Nuwara Eliyas were irregular and difficult of sale. Udapussellawas –select invoices gained Rs.20-30/-per kg and more following special inquiry whilst the others sold around last. Uvas continued to sell well.

BOPF: Best Westerns declined by up to Rs.50/-per kg. Teas in the below best category were firm and selectively dearer. Plainer sorts were firm and Rs.20-30/-per kg dearer. Nuwara Eliyas were Rs.10-20/-per kg easier. Udapussellawas were Rs.30-50/-per kg dearer. Uvas –clean leaf teas were Rs.20-30/-per kg dearer whilst the poorer sorts were lower by a similar margin.

Best **BP1's** In the market were strongly competed for and appreciated by USC 56-USC80 following quality with Brighter sorts a strong feature gaining up to USC5t3 but a few invoices shed up to USC20 with quality while Medium categories met an irregular interest ranging between firm to USC25 dearer to easier by up to USC4 and some lines remained without bids. Plainer types were about firm to USC10 below last prices.

The Best **PF1s** on offer held firm to USC3 dearer while Brighter categories were steady to USC2 dearer with Mediums irregular varying between firm to USC2 above last levels to easier by USC6-USC8. Plainer descriptions irregular ranging between firm to USC28 dearer to easier by up to USC10.

Best **PDUSTs** in the market were irregular varying between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC06 with brighter varieties discounted by USC9-USC17 while Medium types were irregular and caries between USC2-USC8 dearer to easier by USC10- USC12. Plainer sorts irregular and varies between firm to USC18 dearer to easier by up to USC6.

The Best **DUSTs** available advanced by USC6-USC8 with Brighter types irregular varying between firm to USC06 dearer to easier by up to USC5 while Medium categories ranged between firm to USC52 above last week's levels to easier by up to USC2. Plainer varieties were irregular varying between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by a similar margin.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, Best BPs gained while others were steady with PFs firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were discounted while DUSTs gained. Other Fannings held value with similar DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed at easier rates.

Pakistan Packers showed strong enquiry and were dominant with strong and useful activity form Kazakhstan, other CIS states. Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries. There was more support from Afghanistan and Sudan with good but reduced interest from Egyptian Packers while Bazaar were selective UK and Russia were more selective with Iran subdued. Somalia showed good activity at the lower end of the market.

BROKENS: Good Brokens met with a strong demand and were a dearer market following competition. Medium Brokens met with a fairly good demand and sold at around last levels whilst plainer types eased with quite a lot of withdrawals. Poor types were a lower market but there were a little less withdrawals in this category.

FANNINGS: Good Fannings met with a good demand and tended dearer following competition. Medium varieties met with quite a fair demand and sold at around last levels. Plainer sorts were an easier market with fair withdrawals. Poor varieties were also easier with a little less withdrawals

CTC DUST: 11,969 packages of Current Season and 30 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with quite a good demand. Good liquoring teas sold well at firm to slightly dearer rates. Medium teas met with a good demand and sold at around last levels. Plain and BLF categories were an easier market with more withdrawals.
