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SALE NO.19 OF 20TH/21ST MAY, 2020 <u>C O M M E N T S</u>

Sri Lanka's tea production for April, 2020 has once again shown a drop and is the fourth consecutive month of declines right from the beginning of the year. Last month has recorded a total harvest of 20.2 M/kgs which is a decline of 3.2 M/kgs over the corresponding month of 2019. The traditional Sinhala & Tamil New Year holidays in April, and the total disruption to everyday work throughout the month as a result of COVID-19 Lockdown are perhaps the main reasons for the negative production figures. During the ytd period, Sri Lanka has harvested a total of 73.3 M/kgs which has escalated the cumulative shortfall to -23 M/kgs when compared to January/April, 2019. Our comprehensive circular on Sri Lanka Tea Production for April, 2020 is attached to this edition of the Tea Market Report.

Heavy showery conditions have been experienced over plantations in most districts with the Department of Meteorology extending its "Red Alert" over the severe cyclonic storm "Amphan" that is expected to develop in to a Super Cyclonic storm which will cause more severe showers or thunderstorms in the Southern, Western, Sabaragamuwa and Central Provinces that comprise of large extents of plantation lands. This type of weather is expected to continue in the next several days as well.

Sale #19 concluded this week was held on May 20 & 21, 2020 where a total quantity of 5.3 m/kgs was on offer. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 0.6 m/kgs.

High Grown Ex Estate BOP/BOPF in the best category were mostly firm with the fair demand that prevailed. A prominent multinational buyer continued to operate with force whilst other traditional quality buyers for Japan, Hong Kong, China, Germany and other European destinations too were active. Buyers for Russia bid actively for "Tea Bag" types, and in particular for the coloury CTC teas.

Low Grown teas initially received fair demand but there was a rapid decline in interest from buyers for most leafy and tippy grades, particularly on the second day of the sale. Price drops of Rs. 50/- and more were evident for similar teas on the second day of the Low Grown sale. A salient feature on day 2 was the noticeable increase in the amount of unsold teas, directly on account of the weaker demand that was displayed. To add to the issue of waning demand, this week's trial of conducting the Low Grown Leafy catalogue in two separate Electronic Platforms on the second day had disastrous prices. consequences with much lower This method should not be continued. is unsuitable and

OP1 : Select best OP1s were firm to easier whilst the balance too tended irregular.

- **OP** : Teas in the best category and the balance were declined Rs.60/- whilst poorer sorts were maintained.
- **OPA** : Select best tended irregular and at times advamced whilst the others too were irregular and mostly lower.

PEK/PEK1: Select best teas declined and balance were irregular. Poor teas at the lower end lost substantially.

- **BOPF/BOPFSP** : Select best and best declined; balance sold at last week's levels.
- **FBOP/FBOP1** : Select Best FBOP's were easier. Few cleaner and below best teas at the lower end sold around last levels; others were lower. **FBOP1's** in general easier.
- FBOPF/FBOPF1: Tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and below best were firm. Teas at the lower end too were firm on following quality. However leafy varieties were irregularly following quality. Select best and best FBOPF1s declined. Few cleaner below best together with the cleaner teas at the lower end were firm; others were irregularly lower.
- **FBOPFSP/EXSP**: A few select best invoices continued to attract good demand. Best and below best teas too were appreciated.

Crop & Weather From 11th to 17th May, 2020

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - Bright mornings and heavy evening showers were reported throughout the week. Uva/Udapussellawa Regions – Both regions reported clean mornings and evening showers during the course of the week. Low Growns - Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported bright mornings and heavy evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology predicted heavy showers and strong winds in most planting regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake - Western, Uva, Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions showed an increase, whilst the Nuwara Eliya region maintained.

OTHER MARKETS

MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

SALE NO.20 OF THE 18TH & 19TH MAY, 2020

There was fair general demand for the 186,847 packages (12.3 m/kgs) of offer at easier levels and 12.62% remained unsold.

The best BP1's on offer were a weak feature and eased by USC4-USC67 with brighter varieties better absorbed at firm to USC10 dearer while Medium sorts were USC2-USC14 below last levels where sold. Plainer types were irregular varying between steady to USC13 dearer to easier by up to USC5 and a few invoices were neglected.

Best PF1s available shed USC5 to USC10 while brighter categories eased by USC2-USC5 and some teas remained without bids while Mediums varieties were discounted by USC6-USC10 and a few invoices were unsold. Plainer sorts varied between steady to USC10 dearer to easier by up to USC8 with a few teas neglected.

The Best PDUSTs in the market met an irregular interest varying between firm to USC3 dearer to easier by up to USC6 while brighter types held firm to USC9 below previous week's rates. Medium varieties were steady to USC10 easier and many invoices remained unsold. Plainer types held firm to USC4 below last prices.

Best **DUST1s** available saw an irregular enquiry and ranged between firm to USC45 dearer to easier by up to USC14 with brighter sorts varying between firm to USC6 above pervious prices to easier by up to USC15 where sold. Mediums met an irregular activity and ranged between USC8 to USC14 above previous rates to easier by USC10 to USC15 and many lines were neglected. Plainer descriptions shed USC6 to USC8 and few teas were neglected.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's were firm with PF's easier. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings appreciated with DUST's firm. Other Fannings were steady while Dusts held value. BMF's were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers lent useful and strong interest with increased support from Bazaar while Egyptian Packers and Sudan were active but at lower levels. There was reduced enquiry from Kazakhstan, other CIS nations, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, UK and Russia. Afghanistan was active but selective with Iran selective. Somalia was active at the lower end of the market.

CTC LEAF: 17,279 packages of Current Season teas and 24 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a good but selective demand.

BROKENS: The best Brokens on offer were well sought after and these ranged between Tk.230/and Tk.240/-. Below best sold between Tk.220/- and Tk.230/-. Others which were lower in quality sold between Tk.200/- and Tk.210/-. BLF teas sold between Tk.140/- and Tk.170/- with fair withdrawals.

FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring Fannings elicited good support and generally sold in line with quality, prices ranging between Tk.228/- and Tk.233/- whilst below best fetching prices between Tk.220/- and Tk.225/-. The remainder met with fair interest and these ranged between Tk.195/- and Tk.205/-. BLF teas saw some interest but ranged between Tk.140/- and Tk.170/-.

CTC DUST: 2,757 packages of Current Season teas and 2 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Ds and CDs met with a fairly good competition and sold at a range between Tk.235/- and Tk.250/-. Others also sold well in line with quality. However, plain/BLF teas met with less demand with fair withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: This was the first sale of the season which took place at the Bangabandhu Conference Hall, World Trade Center, Chittagong after an interval of two months where strict social distancing was maintained. However, owing to curtailment of movement because of the prevailing COVID-19 epidemic, out-station buyers could not be present. Inspite of these constraints, a good market prevailed whereby the bulk of the offerings could be disposed off at an average of Tk.218.79. Both Blenders and Loose tea buyers were operating in good strength for the best teas on offer. However, Plain teas particularly BLFs were mostly withdrawn owing to lack of bids. Dusts sold well.

The Sri Lanka Tea Production for April, 2020 is 20.2 Mkgs which is -3.0 Mkgs to the same month last year. During the month under review, the steepest month-on-month drop is seen from the High Grown sector with -23.08% followed by Medium Growns with -21.18%. The Low Growns have not dropped as sharply and is recorded at -8.58%.

During the year-to-date period of 2020 (Jan to April) Sri Lanka's total Tea Crop of 73.3 Mkgs is 23.0 Mkgs lower to the figure of 96.3 Mkgs achieved during the same period of 2019, and the year-to-date defict which stood at -20.1 Mkgs as at the end of March, 2020 has now widened to -23.9 Mkgs as at end April, 2020.
