C O M M E N T S

Dry conditions continue to be experienced in the plantation districts with Nuwara Eliya experiencing very cold temperatures at night resulting in ground frost. This is not uncommon at this time of the year in Nuwara Eliya, but frost does cause much harm to agricultural crops with tea being no exception. Elsewhere in the country, the present hot and dry weather with strong sunlight in the afternoons is reported to be drying up tea plantations resulting in lower crop intakes.

This week's sale comprised of a total quantity of 6.3 m/kgs which was marginally lower to the previous sale figure. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.9 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 650,000 kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to approximately 1 m/kgs.

Fair demand was once again seen for all low grown teas with continued interest from buyers for Russia and the C.I.S. as well as the Middle East and Turkey. Select best BOP1's/OP1's were fully firm, whilst OP/OPA's too followed a similar trend. The best Pekoes were selectively dearer whilst bolder types were irregular. Select best FBOP's and FBOPF1's were irregular with below best types often ruling easier to last. Secondary types too were lower although the very best tippy parcels continued to attract strong buying interest.

High Grown teas in the Ex Estate catalogue met with good general demand at irregular rates following quality. The opening market was firm to irregularly easier, but there was a strengthening of demand from around the last half of the sale when a prominent multinational buyer stepped up purchases amidst more robust competition from a large bulk buyer who appeared to have received a late buying order. As against a market which was irregularly easier up to the halfway mark in the brokers order of sale, the closing market for neater leaf "below best" teas in particular was Rs. 10/- to 30/- higher than the prices ruling at the commencement of the sale. CTC PF1's were supported by buyers for the "tea bag" sector at firm rates whilst BP1/BPS grades received better demand from buyers for China and consequently appreciated sharply. Other buyers for Russia, Japan, Hong Kong, Germany and other European countries too were active.

This week's auction comprised of **11,078** lots with a total quantity of **6,373,538** kgs.

- BOP1** : A few teas in the select best category maintained; balance declined Rs.30-40/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end were firm on last levels.
- OP1** : Select best teas declined substantially; balance however maintained last levels. Stalky invoices however appreciated Rs.30-40/- per kg.
- OP** : Teas in the select best category were barely steady; balance gained Rs.20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end too advanced Rs.30-40/- per kg.
- OPA** : Select best teas were generally firm on last levels; balance appreciated Rs.20-30/- per kg. Poorer sorts too advanced by a similar margin.
- PEK/PEK1**: Well made shotty invoices were barely steady; balance declined Rs.30-40/- per kg. Best bold Pekoe's declined Rs.20/- per kg; balance too were lower by Rs.10-20 per kg. Teas at the lower end however maintained.

BOP: Teas in the best category where quality was maintained and/or improved, were firm and gained Rs.20/-per kg and more. In the below best category, select improved teas were substantially dearer following special inquiry whilst the others appreciated Rs.10-20/-per kg. At the lower end of the market too, clean leaf improved liquoring teas were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas continued to be neglected. Uva/Udapussellawas were generally firm with select invoices gaining substantially following special inquiry.

BOPF: Best Westerns –select high priced teas of last week were irregular whilst the others were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer following quality. In the below best category, brighter sorts were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer whilst the others sold around last. At the lower end, prices were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas continued to be neglected. Udapussellawas gained Rs.10-20/-per kg. Uvas –select invoices were substantially dearer whilst the others were firm.

- OTHER MARKETS -

BANGLADESH AUCTION

Sale 36 held on Tuesday 14th January, 2020

CTC LEAF : 57,624 packages of Current Season and 110 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with less demand with prices falling further.

BROKENS : A select few lines of clean Brokens sold well at around firm rates but Mediums met with much less demand with heavy withdrawals whilst plain types followed a similar trend. The poorest, however, met with some interest.

FANNINGS : A few lines of clean liquoring Fannings met with a good demand at around last levels but Medium varieties witnessed a further decline and there were heavier withdrawals. Plain types followed a similar trend. However, the poorest saw a little demand.

CTC DUST : 8,928 packages of Current Season and 11 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Good liquoring teas sold well at around last levels. Medium teas were firm to slightly dearer market. Plain and BLF teas were easier by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/- with more withdrawal compared to last. Blenders lent good support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS : There was less demand from all sections of the market and consequently prices dropped further with heavy withdrawals. Blenders were the mainstay of the market whilst there was only limited interest from the Loose tea buyers.
