

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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## SALE NO.22 OF 09<sup>TH</sup> /10<sup>TH</sup> JUNE, 2020

#### COMMENTS

Increased crop intakes are still reported from across most plantations and the inevitable drop in the standard of green leaf that is associated with rush crops will require stringent quality control measures at the point of acceptance in to the factories, in order to maintain a satisfactory standard of the end product. Auction prices from now on will strictly be in sync with quality, as there will be a much wider selection of teas to choose from along with the increased volumes that will be available for sale. During such periods teas with poor leaf and liquors are heavily discounted, and even neglected, and it is always better to avoid that situation.

Sale #22 concluded this week was held on June 9 & 10 (Tue/Wed) where an increased quantity of 6.6 m/kgs was on offer compared to the previous week's volume of 6.0 m/kgs. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades once again comprised of 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled approximately 1 m/kgs from the previous sales volume of 0.8 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 1 m/kgs.

The overall quality of Ex Estate teas was lower and the market weakened further this week. The better high grown BOP's lost Rs 30/- and more whilst their BOPF counterparts eased Rs. 50/- to 70/- per kg. BOP's in the below best category eased Rs. 30/- to 50/- whilst their BOPF eased more, and even up to Rs. 100/- per kg. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's /BOPF's too were substantially lower, particularly where leaf appearance had shown a drop. High and Medium CTC PF1's saw price drops of Rs. 10/- to 20/- and more for teas with poorer leaf, whilst Low Grown sorts were lower up to Rs. 50/-. There was fair demand at lower levels from China and Hong Kong whilst other markets followed quality more closely. CTC PF1's continued to attract sustained interest from buyers for Russia operating for the "Tea Bag" segment, but prices were again lower to last.

Low Grown teas met with fair demand. Buyers for the Middle East, Turkey and the C.I.S were active for their usual buying standards. Secondary type teas again saw easier prices, and this trend is likely to continue in the coming weeks where auction quantities are larger. Commencing from next week, i.e., Sale # 23 of June 16 & 17, 2020 the Low Grown Leafy Grades catalogue will be sub divided in to two separate catalogues, and, will be referred to as "Low Grown Leafy Grade" and "Low Grown Semi Leafy Grade" catalogues respectively. The former will comprise of whole leaf grades OP1, OP & OPA whilst the latter will include the grades BOP1, Pekoe and Pekoe1.

This week's auction comprised of **11,152** lots with a total quantity of **6,641,175** kgs.

BOP1 :Select best invoices and best invoices declined by Rs.50/- and at times more; balance barely steady. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

OP1 : Teas in the best category were firm; balance too maintained. Stalky invoices were firm to irregularly lower.

OP : Select best teas maintained; balance appreciated by Rs.20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were generally lower.

OPA : Select best teas declined Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance however advanced by Rs.10-15/- per kg. Poorer sorts declined by Rs.20/- at times more.

**PEK/PEK1:** Well made shotty invoices were generally lower; balance irregularly lower by Rs.10/- per kg. Best bold Pekoes' declined Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance was fully firm to last week's levels. Teas at the lower end were maintained.

BOPF/BOPFSP: Select best was lower; best too followed a similar trend. Balance was firm on last.

FBOP/FBOP1 : Select best and best FBOP's were firm. A few cleaner below best and cleaner teas at the lower end

declined. Others were easier following quality. FBOP1's in general were easier.

**FBOPF/FBOPF1:** Very tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and below best were firm to dearer whilst

cleaner teas at the lower end declined. Select best and best FF1's were easier. However, cleaner below best and cleaner teas at the lower end declined. Balance was irregular following

quality.

FBOPFSP/EXSP: Select best invoices continued to attract good demand. Best and below best teas too were firm.

**BOP**: Best Westerns - Select invoices, where quality was maintained, declined up to Rs. 30/- per kg, whilst the others eased Rs.50-80/- per kg. Teas in the Below Best category declined Rs. 30-50/- per kg, whilst the plainer sorts were barely maintained. Nuwara Eliyas - hardly any offerings. Uva/Uda Pussellawas barely maintained.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns declined Rs. 50-70/- per kg and more as the sale progressed. In the Below Best category neat leaf coloury sorts declined Rs.50-70/- per kg, whilst the thin liquoring teas eased up to Rs.100 per kg. Plainer sorts were Rs. 50-70/- per kg easier. Nuwara Eliyas - hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawas sold around Iast week's levels. Uvas declined Rs. 30-40/- per kg and more for the poorer sorts.

#### **Crop & Weather**

#### From 01st to 07th June, 2020

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - Both regions reported bright mornings and overcast evenings, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported evening showers during the latter part of the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts rainy weather in both regions during the week ahead. Uva/Udapussellawa Regions - Clear weather was experienced in both regions throughout the week. Strong winds (up to 40-50 kmph) are expected during the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology. Low Growns - Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported bright weather with occasional showers during the course of the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts heavy rainfall (above 50 mm) in the week ahead.

Crop Intake - All planting regions showed an increase in the crop intake.

#### BANGLADESH AUCTION

#### Sale 03 held on Monday 08th June, 2020.

**CTC LEAF:** 29,250 packages of Current Season teas and 1,884 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a selective demand at easier rates.

**BROKENS:** Well made good liquoring Brokens were a lower market and eased by Tk.5/- to Tk.10/-. The remainder were also a lower market easing by upto Tk.10/- and more with quite fair withdrawals particularly the plain and BLF teas.

**FANNINGS:** Likewise, Fannings were also a lower market but better liquoring types met with some competition and eased by Tk.5/- to Tk.10/-. All others eased further by Tk.10/- and more including plainer and BLF types.

**CTC DUST:** 4,372 packages of Current Season teas and 815 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with an improved demand. Good liquoring D and CD were well competed for at firm to dearer levels. Others met with less demand and were easier by Tk.5/- to Tk.7/- following quality. BLF teas attracted only fair interest from buyers and were steady. Blenders lent strong support with improved interest from the Loose tea buyers.

#### COMMENTS:

In order to maintain social distancing, the sale for Leaf section of the catalogue was again held at the Bangabandhu Conference Hall, World Trade Center, Chittagong and the Dust catalogue was held separately at the usual auction venue. There was more tea on offer today. Demand in the Leaf section was selective with brighter liquoring sorts meeting with some competition but Medium and plainer types were much less in demand and were subject to quite heavy withdrawals. Blenders were quite active. Loose tea buyers operated selectively.

Dusts met with an improved demand.

#### SALE NO.23 OF THE 08TH & 09TH MAY, 2020

Good general demand for the 190,058 packages (12.50) in the market which eased towards the close at irregular levels. 22.04% remained without bids.

The best **BP1's** available held firm to USC12 easier while Brighter varieties shed up to USC18 and some invoices were unsold but a few improved lines gained up to USC2. Mediums saw an irregular enquiry ranging between USC2-USC16 above previous rates to easier by up to USC10. Plainer descriptions varying between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by a similar rate and some teas were neglected.

Best **PF1s** in the market eased by USC7-USC13 with Brighter sorts opening at firm rates but eased by up to USC7 as the sale progressed while Medium categories opened at steady to USC5 easier but closed up to USC8 below previous prices. Plainer varieties were generally firm on previous levels.

The Best **PDUSTs** on offer were better absorbed at firm to USC8 dearer with Brighter types steady to USC8 dearer while Mediums held firm to USC3 above previous levels to easier by a similar rate. Plainer descriptions were irregular and varied between steady to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC4 and a few invoices were neglected.

Best **DUST1s** available met improved enquiry at USC12-USC19 dearer while Brighter varieties appreciated by up to USC10 following quality with Mediums irregular and ranged between firm to USC3 above previous week's levels to easier by up to USC5 and many invoices were neglected. Plainer categories USC2-USC6 above previous prices but some invoices and plainest were neglected.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's held value while PF's were steady. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were firm with similar DUST's easier. Other Fannings held value while Dusts were discounted. BMF's were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers lent strong enquiry and were dominant with increased support from Bazaar while UK and Russia were active. Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries were active but selective with reduces interest from Pakistan Packers, Kazakgstan and other CIS states. Sudan were active. Iran were barely active while Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.
