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SALE NO.07 OF 18TH/19TH FEBRUARY, 2020

COMMENTS

Sri Lanka has only achieved a total tea production of 21.9 m/kgs for January, 2020 recording a decline of 1.4 m/kgs from the corresponding month in 2019. The largest drop is seen from the low grown elevation with a percentage loss of (9.43) over January, 2019 whilst harvests from the medium elevation have declined 6.57%. The drought conditions that are being experienced have impacted tea flush in the medium and low elevations in particular as a result of heat buildup in the soil and environment that retards growth. In the meanwhile, crop intakes from all plantation areas have shown a further drop following the several weeks of dry weather. The hot and humid conditions have dried up the soil to an extent that the tea bushes are now facing stress conditions which limit flush.

This week's sale comprised of a total quantity of 6 m/kgs which showed a slight gain of 0.4 m/kgs over the previous sale. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.5 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled approximately 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to almost 962,920 kgs.

Fair demand was once again seen for Low Grown teas with good overall demand from buyers for Russia and the C. I. S. as well as those for the Middle East whilst Turkey was more selective. Stylish leafy BOP1's and OP1's were generally firm whilst teas at the lower end were dearer. The best OP's/OPA's were irregularly lower, but the balance was firm to dearer. True to grade Pekoes were firm to irregularly dearer, whilst bolder sorts eased Rs. 10/- to 20/-. Select best FBOP's / FBOPF1's were firm, but others were lower. The best tippy teas maintained last levels.

High Grown Western teas in the "Ex Estate" catalogue received good demand. Seasonal western quality BOP's and BOPF's gained Rs. 30/- to 60/- and substantially more for some selected lines following special demand. Teas in the "below best" category however, were mostly irregular and even easier following quality. Improved Nuwara Eliya's too were substantially dearer amidst added Air Mail interest. The better high and medium elevational CTC PF1's were barely firm whilst others lost Rs. 10/- to 20/- per kg. Buyers for Western Europe and Japan were active on quality offerings. Hong Kong, China and Russia too lent useful support but interest from Taiwan was subdued. There was sustained interest from local packers.

This week's auction comprised of 10,530 lots with a total quantity of 6,050,209 kgs.

BOP1: A few select best invoices maintained following special inquiry whilst others declined by Rs.40-50/- per kg and at times more. Teas at the lower end were irregularly lower.

OP1 : Select best teas were fully firm on last week levels; balance declined Rs.30-40/- per kg. Stalky invoices however gained Rs.10-15/- per kg.

OP : Select best teas were irregular. Best category declined Rs.30-40/- per kg and more as the sale progressed; balance was generally firm. Teas at the lower end were fully firm to dearer by Rs.10-15/- per kg.

OPA: Teas in the select best category declined Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance too were lower by Rs.20/- per kg and at times more. Poorer sorts however advanced Rs.10-20/- per kg.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were barely steady; balance declined Rs.30-40/- per kg and at times were difficult of sale. Best bold PEK's were lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance too declined Rs.20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end however appreciated Rs.20/- per kg.

BOP: BoP: Best Westerns – seasonal quality teas gained Rs. 40-60 per kg and more, whilst the others too were dearer but to a lesser extent. In the Below Best category, teas were irregularly lower following quality and the plainer sorts too followed a similar trend. Nuwara Eliyas – limited selection on offer gained sharply. Uda Pussellawas were dearer by Rs. 20-30 per kg and more. Uvas – best varieties were Rs. 30-40 per kg dearer, whilst the others were firm.

BOPF: Best Westerns – a few seasonal quality teas were dearer by Rs. 40-50 per kg and more, whilst the others and Below Best category brighter sorts were dearer by Rs. 20-30 per kg and the balance too were dearer, but to a lesser extent. At the lower end, teas were irregular following quality. Nuwara Eliyas gained sharply. Uda Pussellawas were dearer by Rs. 10-20 per kg and more. Uvas too were dearer by Rs. 10-20/- and more.

BANGLADESH AUCTION

Sale 41 held on Monday 17th February, 2020

CTC LEAF: 32,702 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with much less demand and again with heavy withdrawals.

BROKENS: There were only a few lines of clean Broken which sold fairly well around steady rates and were about steady whilst all others met with a very selective demand and mostly were sold except the plainest and poor types which were in fair demand but again at lower rates. There were again quite heavy withdrawals.

FANNINGS: A handful of clean Fannings sold well although often at lower rates but other varieties were generally neglected with quite heavy withdrawals. However, the plainest and the poor types attracted some interest but sold at much lower rates.

CTC DUST: 5,496 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with less demand. Good and Medium liquoring teas met with a fair demand. Plain and BLF teas were easier by Tk.12/- toTk.18/- with several withdrawals. Blenders were selective. Loose tea buyers were very selective.

COMMENTS: This sale took place in Srimangal. The quality was mostly end of season which was much less in demand particularly from the Blenders. Loose tea buyers, however, were fairly active on the cheapest teas on offer. There was some interest from Pakistan buyers but again at lower rates. Withdrawals continued to be very heavy. Dusts met with less demand.

Fairly good demand fir tge 203,459 packages (13.37 m/kgs) on offer at irregularly easier levels and 12.54% remained unsold.

Best **BP1s** in the market met an irregular interest varying between firm to USC30 dearer to easier by up to USC22 and a few lines were unsold while Brighter types were firm to USC24 easier and many invoices were neglected with Mediums irregular ranging between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC36 and some teas remained without bids. Lower medium varieties saw an irregular enquiry ranging between USC6—USC13 dearer and a few improved invoices advanced substantially to easier by a similar level with a few lines unsold while plainer descriptions held firm to USC10 below previous rates.

The Best **PF1s** available saw improved competition appreciating by USC10-USC32 with Brighter sorts firm to USC6 easier while medium varietites were irregular ranging between firm to USC7 dearer to easier by USC4-USC20. Lower Mediums ranged between firm to USC7 above previous rates to easier by up to USC26 while plainer types varied between firm to USC5 dearer to easier by up to USC12 and many teas were neglected.

Best **PDUSTs** on offer were irregular and varied between firm to USC9 dearer to easier by up to USC2 while Brighter categories eased by USC4 – USC8 with Mediums irregular varying between firm to USC3 dearer to easier by up to USC15 and a few lines were unsold. Lower Mediums sorts were steady to USC5 below previous levels with Plainer descriptions firm to USC4 easier.

The Best **DUST1s** available gained USC4-USC18 while Brighter varietites shed USC6 to USC14 with Medium categories easing by USC5-USC20 and a few invoices remained unsold. Lower Mediums held value with plainer descriptions discounted by USC6-USC25.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's held value with best PF's discounted while others were steady. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings eased with Dust's firm. Other Fannings held value with similar DUST's firm. BMF's were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers lent strong interest and were dominant while Egyptian packers showed useful support with good enquiry from Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Afghanistan and Sudan. There was reduced activity from Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and Bazaar while UK were active but selective and Russia were selective. Iran were quiet. Somalia were avtive at the lower end of the market.


