COMMENTS

Most plantation districts continue to experience dry weather with hot and humid conditions, and crop harvests have shown a rapid decline from the previous week. The situation is quite alarming in the low grown properties in the Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna provinces as well as high grown estates in the Western district. Due to the acute shortage of flush some Producers with multiple factories have been forced to suspend manufacture in some factories, and divert all green leaf to an identified factory for processing in order to curtail soaring costs.

This week's sale comprised of a total quantity of 5.3 m/kgs, down marginally to the previous sale. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.2 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled approximately 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to almost 834,203 kgs.

Low Grown teas met with fair demand. Stylish, leafy BOP1's and OP1's were fully firm whilst lower end teas too were mostly firm. The best OP's/OPA's held firm but the balance was firm to dearer. True to grade Pekoes generally sold around last levels. Select best FBOP's / FBOPF1's were firm, but others were mostly irregular. The best tippy teas were firm. Buyers for Russia and the C. I. S. were fairly active. Middle East and Turkey were active though tending to be more selective.

High Grown teas in the "Ex Estate" catalogue generally saw demand at lower levels which resulted in downward pressure on prices for a wide range of quality offerings. An exception to an otherwise lower market was a brighter range of Nuwara Eliya's with maintained quality, and a selection of neater "below best" western BOPF which ruled dearer. Poorer and plainer quality teas from the high elevations will have to pay special emphasis on manufacturing a neater and more all-round tea during the next two months after the cessation of the western quality season, as unlike their low growns counterparts that have leafy and semi-leafy teas that enjoy unique demand, the plain liquoring high growns on the other hand, can be easily replaced with cheaper teas from other origins. This is perhaps the most important thing that must be remembered by producers of high grown teas if we are to retain our traditional liquoring markets.

This week's auction comprised of **9,678** lots with a total quantity of **5,385,896** kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

BOP1: Few select best invoices advanced Rs.30-40/- and more following quality. Best category were declined Rs.30-40/- and at times were difficult of sale; balance was maintained.

OP1 : Select best teas were fully firm irregularly dearer; balance were maintained. Stalky invoices were gained Rs.20/- per kg.

OP : Teas in the select best category were firm to dearer by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance declined Rs.20/- and at times more. Secondaries were fully firm to Rs.5-10/- per kg dearer.

: Select best invoices was maintained; balance appreciated by Rs.10-15/- per kg. Poorer sorts were OPA fully firm to dearer by Rs. 10-15/- per kg.

PEK/PEK1: Well made shotty teas declined Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance were irregularly dearer by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Best bold Pekoes advanced Rs.20/- per kg; balance too dearer by Rs.20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end however irregularly lower by Rs. 10-15/- per kg.

HIGH GROWN

BOP: Best Westerns – Select high priced teas of last week were mostly easier following quality, whilst the others were irregular. In the Below Best category, better sorts were Rs.20 per kg lower, whilst the others declined further and were often difficult of sale. At the lower end, prices declined Rs.20 per kg and more. Nuwara Eliyas – Select invoices sold continued to sell well at firm to dearer rates. Others were irregular. Uda Pussellawas continued to weaken following plainer quality. Uvas – Better teas firm and tended dearer, whilst the poorer sorts were substantially easier.

BOPF: Best Westerns – Select high priced teas were easier following quality, whilst the others were irregular. In the Below Best category, better sorts declined Rs.20 per kg, whilst the others eased up to Rs.30 per kg. At the lower end, clean leaf teas were firm and Rs.10-20 per kg dearer. Others lower by a similar margin. Nuwara Eliyas maintained. Uda Pussellawas were generally easier following poorer quality. Uvas declined Rs.20 per kg and more following quality.

Crop & Weather

For the period 24 February - 01 March 2020

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: Bright weather conditions were reported in both regions throughout the week. **Uva/Udapussellawa Regions:** Both regions experienced clear weather throughout the week. **Low Growns:** Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported extremely bright conditions throughout the week. Department of Meteorology expects clear weather conditions to prevail in the week ahead in all planting regions.

Crop Intake: Nuwara Eliya , Uva and Udapussellawa regions maintained last week's crop levels, whilst the crop intake in the Western, Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions further declined.

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- OTHER MARKETS-

BANGLADESH AUCTION

Sale 43 held on Monday 2nd March, 2020.

CTC LEAF: 30,837 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with only a fair demand.

BROKENS: nominal weight of clean Brokens met with quite a good demand and were generally firm to slightly dearer. The remainder which comprised of mostly end of season types were easier with some withdrawals. Plain and poor types followed a similar trend.

FANNINGS: A small weight of clean Fannings met with a fairly good demand but were generally easier following quality. The Medium varieties met with only a limited demand and generally declined by Tk.10/- and more. There were heavy withdrawals. Plain and poor types saw fair demand but at easier rates. However, there were also several withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 4,364 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with a fair demand. Good and Medium liquoring teas met with a good demand. Plain and BLF teas were easier by Tk.8/- to Tk.12/- with some withdrawals. Blenders were selective. Loose tea buyers were active. Good liquoring CDs met with a fair demand.

COMMENTS: This sale took place in Srimangal where buyers' participation was rather limited. Internal Loose tea buyers were active but major Blenders were rather selective. Withdrawals continued to be quite heavy.

Dusts had a fair demand.

Fair general demand for the 195,258 packages (12.79m/kgs) on offer at irregularly easier rates closely following quality. 14.65% remained without bids.

The Best **BP1s** in the market were barely firm to USC2 dearer and a few lines shed up to USC2 while Brighter categories generally held firm to USC15 above previous rates with Medium sorts irregular ranging between firm to USC7 dearer to easier by up to USC10. Plainer descriptions eased by USC6-USC10 where sold.

Best **PF1s** available eased by up to USC8 with Brighter types irregular and ranged between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC12 and some lines were neglected while Medium varieties were discounted by USC2-USC12 and many teas remained without bids. Plainer sorts held steady to USC5 dearer but Plainest were difficult of sale.

The Best **PDUSTs** on offer held firm while Brighter categories saw an irregular interest varying between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC8 with Mediums easing by USC6-USC15 and some invoices were neglected.

Best **DUST1s** in the market held firm to USC15 below last levels while Brighter categories marginally gained but to USC2 with Medium types irregular varying between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by USC3-USC8. Plainer descriptions easing by USC2-USC18 and Plainest were unsold.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, Best BP's appreciated while others were firm with PFs steady. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were easier with DUSTs dearer. Other Fannings held value with DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed.

Pakistan Packers were dominant and lent strong interest while Egyptian Packers showed strong and useful support with improved activity from UK. There was useful enquiry from Yemen, other Middle Eastern Countries, Sudan and Russia while Kazakhstan and other CIS states lent good interest by at lower levels. Afghanistan and Bazaar were less active. Iran were quieter. Somalia lent strong interest at the lower end of the market.
