COMMENTS

Bright mornings and evening showers have been experienced in most planting districts which conditions are considered to be ideal for enhanced crop harvests. The Department of Meteorology has predicted heavy falls accompanied by strong and gusty winds in the week ahead as well due to the low level atmospheric disturbance in the vicinity of Sri Lanka during next few days.

Sale #18 concluded this week was held on May 13 & 14, 2020 where a total quantity of 5.3 m/kgs was on offer. This week's offer weight was 2.1 m/kgs higher than the restricted quantity on offer at the previous week's auction which was in view of Vesak holidays. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.3 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.7 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to almost 0.6 m/kgs.

High Grown Ex Estate BOPF opened barely steady but demand escalated with the progress of the sale following which prices were firm to a little dearer by the close. BOP descriptions on the other hand were irregular and easier, and often declined Rs. 20/- to 30/- per kg. CTC teas continued to meet with maintained demand, and, prices for High and Medium teas were mostly fully firm, whilst selected Low Growns gained sharply, amidst strong demand from Russia. Buyers for Japan, Hong Kong and China too were active, although more selective.

Low Grown teas received fair demand. The best leafy BOP's/OP1's were firm to irregularly lower whilst cleaner OP/OPA's too were barely steady. Below best sorts however, generally maintained last levels. A range of best Pekoes were about steady; other were irregular and lower. Selected FBOP's and FBOPF1's with neat leaf were mostly firm but teas at the bottom saw irregular prices following quality. Iran was again rather selective. Buyers for the C. I. S. and Turkey continued to bid actively for their requirements, but, followed quality more closely than in recent weeks. There was maintained interest from Russia and the C.I.S.

This week's auction comprised of **9,304** lots with a total quantity of **5,397,149** kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

LOW GROWNS – LEAFY

BOP1: Select best teas declined by Rs.50-100/- per kg and at times more; balance was barely steady. Teas at the lower end were maintained.

• Teas in the select best category were fully firm on last week levels; balance too met with a good demand. Stalky invoices gained substantially.

OP: Best teas declined by Rs.50-100/- per kg and at times more difficult of sale; balance was declined Rs.30-40/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were generally firm.

OPA: A few select best invoices held firm; balance was declined Rs.40-50/- per kg and at times more. Poorer sorts were maintained.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were maintained; balance was fully firm at the commencement but declined Rs.40-50/- per kg as the sale progressed. A few best bold PEK's held firm; balance was declined Rs.40-50/- per kg and more particularly the latter part of the sale. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.

BOPF: Westerns were firm and Rs. 10-20/- per kg dearer Nuwara Eliya's were firm and tended dearer. Uda Pussellawa's neat leaf, coloury sorts were substantially dearer, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Uva's were firm and Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer.

Crop & Weather From 03rd May to 10rd May, 2020

<u>Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions</u> - Bright mornings and evening showers were reported throughout the week.

<u>Uva/Udapussellawa Regions</u> - Clear mornings and rain was reported in the evenings during the course of the week.

<u>Low Growns</u> - Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions experienced bright mornings and evening showers throughout the week.

The Department of Meteorology predicts heavy rain fall and strong gusty winds in most planting regions in the week ahead.

<u>Crop Intake</u> - Western, Uva, Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions showed an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Nuwara Eliya and Udapussellawa regions maintained.

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MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

SALE NO.19 OF THE 11TH & 12TH MAY, 2020

Fair general demand for the 176,925 packages (11.8 jg) in the market at irregularly easier rates. However, 14.28% were neglected.

The best **BP1's** available met an irregular enquiry varying between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC14 while brighter sorts held firm to USC20 easier with medium categories a weak features and shed USC2-USC36 with some lines neglected but a few improved invoices advanced by up to USC5. Lower mediums saw better absorption gaining USC2-USC4 with plainer descriptions USC7-USC10 dearer but some invoices were unsold.

Best **PF1s** in the market appreciated by USC6 to USC15 with brighter types irregular and varied between steady to USC5 dearer by easier by up to USC3 and some invoices were unsold. Medium sorts shed USC2-USC6 and many lines remained without bids particularly towards the close while lower Mediums met an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC5 above previous levels to easier by up to USC10 and some lines were neglected with plainer descriptions discounted by USC8 to USC14 and some teas remained unsold especially towards the close.

The Best **PDUSTs** available saw an irregular enquiry ranging between steady to USC8 above previous rates to easier by up to USC4 with brighter varieties USC5-USC8 easier while medium types were irregular varying between firm to USC5 dearer to easier by USC10-USC14 and a few invoices remained unsold. Lower mediums ranged between steady to USC4 above last rates to easier by up to USC8 with some teas unsold while plainer categories shed USC6 to USC7 where sold.

Best **DUST1s** on offer shed USC4-USC52 while brighter types ranged between firm to USC4dearer to easier by a similar margin with medium categories varying between steady to USC15 above last rates to easier by USC8 to USC12 and many lines were neglected. Lower medium types varied between firm to USC7 dearer to easier by up to USC12 with plainer categories ranging between steady to USC10 above last week's level to easier by up to USC5.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's held value with PF's easier. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were firm while similar DUST's eased. Other Fannings were discounted with Dust's firm. BMF's were dearer

Pakistan Packers showed strong support with more and useful interest from Suda, Afghanistan were active but selective with Kazakhstan, other CIS states and Bazar active but at lower levels. There was reduced participation from Egyptian packers, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries. UK and Russia with some select activity from Iran, Somalia were more active at the lower end of the market.
