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SALE NO.20 OF $26^{TH}/27^{TH}$ MAY, 2020 C O M M E N T S

Crop harvests from across all estates have seen an increase following the recent wet weather conditions that were experienced. Whilst clear weather has been reported from towards the latter part of last week, there have been reports of rains accompanied by heavy blowing from the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa provinces that both produce the larger majority of low grown elevational teas. The department of Meteorology has also warned of an atmospheric disturbance that is developing in this region which is once again expected to result in heavy falls over most parts of the island.

Meanwhile, the April, 2020 Tea Export figures have been released and during the month under review the largest market has been Russia with a gain of 20.98% over the same month last year, followed by Iraq and Turkey, both of whom have shown lower intakes than in April, 2019. The next largest is China, with +49.14% over the corresponding month last year. This is identified as a growing market with vast potential for further expansion. During the year-to-date period, Iraq continues to lead followed by Turkey, Russia, Iran and China. More comprehensive statistical data appears elsewhere in this report.

Sale #20 concluded this week was held on May 26 & 27, 2020 where a total quantity of 5.3 m/kgs was on offer. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.6 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 0.6 m/kgs.

Ex Estate teas generally met with an irregularly lower market. High Grown BOP in the best category eased up to Rs. 20/-whilst their corresponding BOPF declined Rs. 30/- to 50/- per kg. Prices for "below best" BOP's were firm to dearer on account of added interest from China and Hong Kong whilst other markets were seen to follow quality more closely. CTC PF1's continued to attract good interest from buyers for the "Tea Bag" segment although prices were Rs. 10/- to 20/-easier, in keeping with the market. Buyers for Japan, Germany and other European destinations too were active for a range of selected quality offerings.

Low Grown teas once again saw lower prices, both for leafy grades and tippy teas. In general, price declines of Rs. 40/- to 60/- per kg were common for most grades, resulting from more selective buying by those operating for the Middle East. Demand from Gulf States usually sees a temporary dip after the festival of Ramadan as most buyers are on holiday for almost a fortnight thereafter.

This week's auction comprised of **9,654** lots with a total quantity of **5,369,493** kgs.

OPA: Better OPA's declined substantially whilst others too were easier by Rs.30-50/- per kg. At the lower end cleaner types declined up to Rs. 30/- per kg. Balance eased further.

PEK/PEK1: Select best teas declined Rs.50/- and more whilst others too were easier but to a lesser extent.

BOP: Best Westerns declined Rs. 10-20 per kg. In the Below Best category, a selection of clean leaf coloury teas gained Rs. 20-30/- per kg, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end, clean leaf coloury sorts were Rs. 10-20/- per kg deare, whilst the others were generally firm. Nuwara Eliyas were firm to marginally dearer. Uva/Uda Pussellawas were barely steady

BOPF: Teas in the Best and Below Best categories declined Rs. 30-50/- per kg, whilst the plainer sorts eased further. Nuwara Eliyas were mostly unsold. Uva/Uda Pussellawas - teas in the higher priced bracket which were up to Rs. 100/- per kg easier at the commencement, were lower to a lesser extent by the close. Others sold around last week's levels.
