

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT



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# SALE NO.26 OF 07<sup>TH</sup>/08<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2020 C O M M E N T S

Sri Lanka has sold 113.8 m/kgs of orthodox teas from all three elevations during the first half of 2020 at an average of Rs. 646.96, which, when compared to the corresponding period last year is a substantial drop of 25.4 m/kgs on volume, although the average of the current year is + Rs. 65.08. During the period under review, 12.8 m/kgs of CTC teas were sold in 2020 at Rs. 494.02 which is an overall better performance than 2019 where 12.2 m/kgs were sold at Rs. 434.78.The orthodox low grown teas have enjoyed a bullish market thus far this year, and surpassed the average of Jan/June 2019 by Rs. 86.91, although the current year's weight is – 20 m/kgs lower on account of the prolonged drought conditions experienced in the first quarter.

Sale #26 concluded this week on July 7 & 8 (Tue/Wed) had an offer quantity of 7 m/kgs compared to the previous week's volume of 6.9 m/kgs. Low Grown Leafy/Semi leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised approximately 3 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas amounted to 1 m/kgs. 1.1 m/kgs was on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue.

There was fair demand for Ex Estate teas at firm to easier rates. A range of western BOP's with maintained quality were firm and dearer on account of special interest, but their corresponding BOPF ranged from being about firm to Rs. 10/- to 20/- lower following quality. Uva /Uda Pussellawa BOP's with neater leaf were firm, but BOPF shed Rs. 10/- to 20/- per kg. CTC PF1's from the high and medium elevations lost Rs. 10/- to 20/- and more in the case of teas with poorer leaf, but low grown sorts were mostly firm. The "Tea Bag" buyers were more selective, whilst high-end liquoring markets too operated very selectively. Bulk buyers for Russia, Hong Kong and some other eastern destinations operated at lower levels.

Low Grown teas once again met with fair demand. Well made, leafy OP1's were firm to irregularly dearer, whilst cleaner OP/OPA's too followed a similar trend. Semi leafy BOP1's in the "best" category were irregularly dearer, and, at the lower end, prices moved up by Rs. 10/- to 20/-. Shotty Pekoes were fully firm to dearer; bolder types gained Rs. 10/- to 20/-. Well-made FBOP/FBOPF1's in the Tippy Catalogue were firm. The best tippy FBOPF's continued to attract good buying interest. Buyers for Iran were fairly active though selective, whilst other Middle Eastern buyers lent strong competition. There was more widespread interest from buyers for Russia. Turkey was more active. Libya operated at the lower end.

Bright mornings and occasional showers have been reported from estates in the western districts, and crop intakes too have shown a decline. Estates in the Uva have mainly experienced clear weather. Reports from Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa too indicate dry conditions. The Department of Meteorology however, predicts some rainfall in most planting districts in the week ahead.

This week's auction comprised of **11,767** lots with a total quantity of **7,012,029** kgs.

In the Below Best category, neat leaf coloury sorts were firm to marginally dearer whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market were Rs. 10-20 per kg lower following quality. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular following quality. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 20 per kg and more mostly following quality.

# Crop & Weather

### From $29^{\text{th}}$ June to $05^{\text{th}}$ July, 2020

Western /Nuwara Eliya Regions - Bright mornings and overcast evenings with occasional light showers were reported in the Nuwara Eliya Region. According to the Department of Meteorology, rain is expected in both regions during the week ahead.

# **MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT**

# Sale No.27 of the $06^{\text{th}}/7^{\text{th}}$ July, 2020

Fair general demand for the 192,080 packages (12.65 m/kgs) in the market at irregularly easier levels and 22.08% remained unsold.

Best **BP1's** available met improved enquiry gaining USC2-USC30 while brighter varieties were better absorbed at USC21-USC24 above previous rates. Medium categories were irregular ranging between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC18 with Lower Mediums varying between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC6 and some invoices were neglected. Plainer descriptions saw an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC14.

The Best **PF1s** in the market were irregular and varied between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC9 with brighter types discounted by USC10-USC12 and a few lines remained without bids. Medium varieties saw less demand easing by USC3-USC10 with some invoices neglected while Lower Medium sorts held steady to USC5 above previous prices but a few teas were unsold. Plainer descriptions met an irregular activity varying between firm to USC2 and plainest were difficult of sale.

Best **PDUSTs** on offer shed USC8-USC11 with brighter types steady to USC6 easier while Medium Categories were discounted by USC2-USC10 but a few improved lines appreciated by up to USC4 closely following quality. Lower Medium varieties were irregular ranging between firm to USC26 dearer to easier by up to USC2 and some invoices were unsold with plainer descriptions varying between firm to USC16 above last rates to easier by up to USC8 and plainest were neglected.

The Best **DUST1s** available eased by USC3-USC40 while brighter varieties held steady to USC06 dearer with Medium types appreciating by USC3-USC6 but a few lines were barely firm. Lower Medium categories were discounted by USC5 to USC7 while plainer sorts ranged between firm to USC8 above last prices to easier by a similar level.

In the **Secondary Catalogues,** BP's were steady with PFs firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were dearer with similar Dust's steady. Other Fannings held value while Dust's eased. BMF's were well absorbed.

Kazakhstan, other CIS nations, Sudan, Afghanistan and Bazzar showed more interest. Yemen, other Middle Eastern Countries and Egyptian packers were active but at lower levels while UK and Russia were selective. There was reduced activity from Pakistan packers with some selective interest from Iran. Local packers were active in line with price. Somallia were active at the lower end of the market.

## Sale 07 held on Monday 06<sup>th</sup> July, 2020.

**CTC LEAF:** 48,099 packages of Current season teas & 90 packages of Old Season teas on offer continued to meet with a very selective demand at easier rates.

**BROKENS:** Well made good liquoring small Brokens met with a fairly good demand but eased by Tk.2/- to Tk.4/- per kg. BOPs were less sought after and were lower by up to Tk.7/- with fair withdrawals. Plain and BLF teas were again a difficult market and withdrawals were very heavy.

**FANNINGS:** Well made good liquoring Fannings met with a fair demand but prices were again easier by Tk 5/- to Tk 8/- per kg. The remainder were a very weak market with a further drop in price. Withdrawals were again very heavy particularly for plain and BLF teas.

**CTC DUST:** 8,818 packages of Current Season teas & 10 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Good liquoring Ds particularly CD continued to sell well following quality at firm to slightly dearer rates. Their Mediums sold around last levels. Plain and BLF teas saw some interest at lower rates with quite fair withdrawals. Blenders lent fairly good support with fair interest from the Loose Tea buyers.

**COMMENTS:** The sale for Leaf section of the catalogue was held at the Bandabandhu Hall, World Trade Centre, Chittagong and the Dust was held at the usual action venue. Demand continued to be restricted with buyers being very selective and also closely following quality. As aforesaid, both blenders and loose tea buyers operated selectively which once again resulted in heavy withdrawals this week.
