

## LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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## SALE NO.27 OF 14<sup>TH</sup>/15<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2020

# COMMENTS

Sale #27 concluded this week on July 14 & 15 (Tue/Wed) with an offer quantity of 6.8 m/kgs showed a drop compared to the previous week's volume of 7 m/kgs. Low Grown Leafy/Semi LeafLeafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised approximately 3 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas amounted to 0.8 m/kgs. Approximately 1 m/kgs was on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue.

There was fair demand for Ex Estate teas at irregularly dearer rates for teas with improved quality with the better BOP's ruling firm to dearer and even registering sharply higher prices when supported by air-mail bids. A range of select Western BOPF's with improved quality was Rs.10/- to 20/- dearer on account of special interest, but plainer sorts were mostly firm. High and Medium CTC PF1's generally eased Rs. 20/- to 30/- per kg whilst Low Grown sorts were much dearer with buyers closely following quality. Teas with poorer leaf however, were neglected and difficult of sale. There was renewed interest from some quality liquoring markets in Europe and the Far East. "Tea Bag" buyers were more selective, with maintained demand from those operating for Russia,

Good demand was seen for low grown semi leafy teas with BOP1's and shotty Pekoes ruling fully firm to dearer, whist bolder Pekoes gained Rs.20/- and more. A range of select wiry OP1's was firm, but others were barely steady. Well-made OP/OPA's too held firm, but secondary teas were easier. Neat and well-made FBOP's/FBOPF1's were firm, whilst others were irregularly easier. The best tippy FBOPF's continued to attract strong interest. Buyers for Iran were fairly active though once again selective, whilst other Middle Eastern buyers lent fair competition. There was maintained demand from buyers for Russia at lower levels. Turkey was more active. Libya operated at the lower end.

In the Below Best category, clean leaf coloury sorts gained Rs.10-20 per kg, whilst the others were barely steady. Plainer sorts sold around last. Nuwara Eliyas - hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawas were firm and up to Rs.10 per kg easier. Uvas were generally firm.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns, where quality was improved a few select invoices gained Rs.10-20 per 11g, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. In the Below Best category a selection of coloury invoices gained Rs. 10-20 per kg, whilst the others together with the Plainer sorts sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliyas - teas in the higher price bracket declined Rs.50 per kg, whilst the others were firm. Uva/Uda Pussellawas were firm.

### **Crop & Weather** From 06<sup>th</sup> July to 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2020

**Western /Nuwara Eliya Regions:** Both regions reported bright mornings and overcast evenings with occasional showers during the course of the week.**Uva/Udapussellawa Regions:** Bright weather was reported with a few isolated showers throughout the week.The Department of Meteorology forecasts rainy weather in the Central Province in the week ahead. Low Growns **Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions** reported clear weather throughout the week. According to theDepartment of Meteorology, rainfall (above 75 mm) is expected in both regions during the week ahead.

**Crop Intake:** The Western, Nuwara Eliya, Uva and Udapussellawa regions showed a decrease in the crop intake, whilst the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions maintained.

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# - OTHER MARKETS-

### **BANGLADESH AUCTION**

### Sale 08 held on Monday 13th July, 2020.

**CTC LEAF:** 51,631 packages of Current Season teas and 20 packages of Old Season teas met with a fair but selective demand.

**BROKENS:** Well made good liquoring small Brokens met with a good demand mostly at firm rates, Demand for good BOPs were fair with prices easing by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/- with some withdrawals. All others including Plain and BLF teas were again an easier market and withdrawals were quite heavy.

**FANNINGS:** Well made good liquoring Fannings once again met with a fair demand but prices were easier by upto Tk.5/- per kg. All other varieties were a weak feature with further drop in prices. Withdrawals were again quite heavy particularly for the plain teas.

**CTC DUST:** 8,574 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Good liquoring Ds met with good competition and sold at firm to dearer levels. The remainder were slightly easier market and sold at a drop of Tk.3/- to Tk.5/- closely following quality. Plain and BLF teas were again a difficult market and withdrawals were more. Bleners lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

**COMMENTS:** The sale for Leaf section of the catalogue was held at the Bangabandhu Conference Hall, World Trade Center, Chittagong and the Dust was held at the usual auction venue. A feature of the sale was the good demand for improved liquoring teas which appreciated in value following competition. Demand continued to be selective for the remainder particularly for the plain and reprinted teas. Both Blenders and Loose tea buyers continued to operate selectively.

Improved and bright liquoring teas and CDs were a strong feature of the market.

### MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

#### Sale No.28 of the $13^{\text{th}}/14^{\text{th}}$ July, 2020.

History was made at the East Africa Tea Trade Association Limited's auctions with the unprecedented first auction (sale) of all Primary and Secondary Grade teas in Sale 28 2020 of 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> July 2020 on the ITTs E-Auction Platform.

There was fair general demand for the 179,676 packages (11.77m/kgs) on offer at irregular rates closely following quality. 21.32% were unsold.

Best **BP1's** in the market saw an irregular enquiry varying between firm levels to easier by up to USC32 with brighter types ranging between steady to USC2 dearer to easier by a similar rate while medium sorts met improved absorption and varied between firm to USC12 above previous week's levels to easier by a similar price where sold. Plainer sorts well-competed for and ranged between steady to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC9 and some invoices were neglected.

The Best **PF1s** available were firm to USC2 above last rates while brighter categories held steady to USC4 dearer with medium types irregular ranging between USC3-USC13 above last prices to easier by up to USC4 and some invoices were neglected. Plainer sorts held steady to USC3 easier and a few lines were neglected.

Best **PDUSTs** on offer were well absorbed at USC5 to USC14 dearer while brighter categories gained USC8 to USC12. Medium sorts met better interest appreciating by USC2 to USC20. Plainer categories were discounted by USC4 to USC6 where sold.

The Best **DUST1s** in the market saw improved enquiry appreciating by up to USC54 and more closely following quality but a few lines eased by up to USC3 with brighter categories irregular ranging between stady to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC14. Mediums held firm to USC9 below previous prices. Plainer descriptions discounted by USC6 to USC18 where sold.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's were firm while PFs held value. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings gained with DUSTs firm. Other Fannings were steady with similar DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed.

Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and Sudan lent strong support and there was increased activity from Afghanistan and Bazaar. Pakistan Packers were active while Egyptian Packers were active but at lower rates with UK selective. There was less support from Russia and Iran. Local Packers were active with Somalia active at the lower end of the market.
