COMMENTS

A sharp drop is seen in tea crops from estates across most planting districts following very dry and humid conditions and fairly intense buildup of heat during the day that has been experienced over the last two weeks. The Sun is directly over Sri Lanka for the next several days, and chances of an immediate recovery seem remote at this stage. Factory intakes have declined by half when compared to the previous month and this is amply reflected with the lower volumes of fresh teas that are now being received in Colombo for cataloguing.

The elevational averages for August, 2020 have been released and all elevational categories have shown substantial gains over the corresponding month of 2019. The combined average for Orthodox and CTC in respect of low grown teas for last month is recorded as Rs. 666.43 which is Rs. 122.56 above the average of the same month last year, whilst Uva Medium category has gained Rs. 122.17 with an average of Rs. 566.86, and Western Medium category has recorded an average of Rs. 529.16 which reflects a gain of Rs. 103.95. The Western High average for August, 2020 is Rs. 554.31 and Rs. 89.10 higher than what was achieved in August, 2019.

This week's auction (Sale # 33) was conducted on the 31st August and 2nd September (Mon/Wed) in view of the intervening Poya Holiday on the 1st September. The offer quantity was 5.9 m/kgs. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.6 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to approximately 0.7 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue had 0.7 m/kgs; a further drop of over 0.1 m/kgs from the previous auction.

Ex Estate teas met with fair demand. Best western BOP's were irregular following quality whilst a range of neater and brighter below-best sorts advanced Rs. 10/- to 20/-. Select best westerns with maintained quality held firm but others were irregular and lower. The availability of best liquoring western BOPF's held firm; others including below-best teas lost Rs. 20/- per kg. Seasonal Uva BOP/BOPF on receipt of special demand were at times sharply dearer whilst others were mostly firm. CTC PF1's saw only fair interest at mostly lower prices, whilst BPI/BPS grades were generally firm. There was fair demand from Hong Kong and China, whilst Japan and Europe concentrated on the best quality high growns. "Tea Bag" buyers were active at lower levels.

Low grown leafy teas continued to meet with fair demand. Stylish OP1's were fully firm whilst secondary sorts were irregular. The better made OP/OPA's were firm to irregularly dearer, but secondary teas were barely firm. Good demand was again seen for teas in the semi leafy category, with BOP1's and Pek/Pek1's ruling firm. In the Tippy Catalogue, select best FBOP's were irregularly lower while cleaner below-best teas maintained last levels. A limited selection of the best FBOPF1's held firm, but others were easier. There was fair demand from Saudi Arabia, Libya, Kuwait and the U. A. E. whilst Iran was again selective. Russia, the C.I.S and Turkey continued to support their usual buying standards.

This week's auction comprised of 10,553 lots with a total quantity of 5,908,449 kgs.

BOP1: Select best invoices were barely steady. Teas in the best category appreciated by Rs/20-30/- per kg; balance however declined by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Lower end teas were generally firm.

OP1: Select best teas were maintained; balance advanced Rs.20-30/- per kg. Stalky invoices held firm.

OP: Teas in the select best category were irregularly lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance was barely steady. Lower end teas however held firm.

OPA: Select best category were firm on last week levels; balance tended irregular. Poorer sort were firm to dearer by Rs.5-10/- per kg.

PEK/PEK1: Well made shotty Pekoe's tended irregular; balance was firm on last levels. Best bold Pekoe's were generally firm; balance declined Rs.10-20/- and at times more. Lower end teas too were generally declined.

In the Below Best category, few select brighter sorts were firm and tended dearer, whilst the others tended easier- Plainer coloury sorts were firm and Rs.10/- per kg dearer, whilst the others were firm. Nuwara Eliyas - hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawas were firm and up to Rs.10/- per kg dearer. Uvas - few select invoices gained Rs.20/- per kg and more, whilst the others were generally firm.

Crop & Weather

From 24th August to 30th August, 2020

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions reported isolated evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts light showers in the week ahead.. **Uva/Udapussellawa Regions:** Both regions reported bright mornings and overcast evenings with moderate rain fall throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, heavy showers (over 75 mm) are expected in the Uva Region during the week ahead.

Low Growns: Clear weather was reported throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology forecasts heavy showers in the Sabaragamuwa Region, whilst light showers are expected in the Ruhuna Region in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions experienced a decrease in the crop intake, whilst the Uva, Udapussellawa and Low Grown regions maintained.

BANGLADESH AUCTION

Sale 14 held on Monday, 31st August, 2020

CTC LEAFs 48,828 packages of Current Season teas on offer continued to meet with a strong demand at dearer rates.

BROKENS: Well made good liquoring BOPs met with a good demand at firm to slightly dearer rates. Their FBOPs were again a strong feature of the market and prices advanced further often by upto Tk.10/- and more. Their Medium and plain varieties were also a strong market and were dearer following competition. There was some withdrawals.

FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring Fannings were again a strong market and were mostly dearer by Tk.5/-and more. Their Mediums continued to be a good market and were also dearer. Plainer varieties met with a fairly good market but there were some withdrawals in this category.

CTC DUST: 11,723 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with quite a good demand. Good liquoring Dusts particularly CDs were an easier market and sold at a drop of Tk.10/- to Tk.15/- closely following quality. However, their Medium and plainer varieties which include BLF, met with a good support and sold at steady rates with less withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: Once again the market witnessed a strong demand with improved liquoring sorts advancing further. Major Blenders continued to lend quite useful support with Loose tea buyers continuing to operate quite actively.

Dusts were an easier market.

MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

Sale No.35 of the 31st Aug /01st Sep 2020

Good general demand for the 138,438 packages (9.07m/kgs) in the market and prices closely followed quality. 24.02% were unsold.

The Best **BP1's** on offer saw an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC3 while Brighter sorts advanced by USC4-USC10 with Medium varieties well competed for and varied between steady to USC 42 above previous week's levels to easier by up to USC8. Plainer types were steady to USC4 above last prices but may lines were neglected.

Best **PF1s** in the market were firm to USC2 easier with brighter categories advancing by USV06-USC8. Medium varieties saw improved absorption and appreciated by USC8-USC50 above previous rates but a few lines eased by up to USC8 following quality. Plainer types were discounted by USC2 to USC7 and many teas were neglected.

The Best **PDUSTs** available held steady to USC3 above last levels with brighter sorts USC6-USC38 dearer while medium types were well completed for gaining USC8-USC22 but a few lines eased with quality. Plainer description were irregular varying between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC0 with some teas unsold.

Best **DUST1s** on offer were firm to USC28 below previous rates while Brighter categories appreciated by USC2-USC8 with Medium varieties irregular and ranged between firm to USC14 dearer to easier by a similar levels. Plainer varieties held steady to USC6 dearer with a few lines remaining unsold.

In the **Secondary Catalogues**, BP's gained while PFs tended easier. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were firm with DUSTs steady. Other Fannings held value with similar DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed.

Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries lent more and strong support with strong enquiry from Pakistan Packers while Egyptian Packers were active but lower levels. Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Afghanistan, Sudan, Russia and Bazaar reduced interest while UK were less active and selective with Iran quieter. Local Packers showed reduced support in line with price. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.
