

LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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SALE NO.45 OF 17TH/18TH NOVEMBER, 2020

COMMENTS

The National Tea Production in October, 2020 has recorded a gain of 2.1 m/kgs over the corresponding month in 2019 and, this is only the second month so far this year that a monthly production has shown a surplus. Apart from October, during July this year a small gain of 0.3 m/kgs was recorded, but the rest of the period has all been a negative crop. During the ytd period this year, the crop shortfall stands at 29.4 m/kgs, and with just two months left to complete the year, it will be short of a miracle if Sri Lanka can even equal the previous year's harvest.

Upcountry estates have reported bright weather and evening showers whilst plantations in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa too have had rainy conditions in the evenings. Crop intake from the high grown sector is reported to have shown a sharp drop due to the traditional Diwali holidays which are celebrated for almost one week on plantations, whilst Low Grown plantations have not shown a significant change. Due to the low level atmospheric disturbance in the vicinity of Sri Lanka however, the Department of Meteorology expects enhanced precipitation during the next few days.

This week's auction (Sale # 45) was conducted on November 17& 18 (Tue/Wed) and, the quantity 5.5 m/kgs was 0.4 m/kgs lower than the previous sale. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 0.67 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue had 0.65 m/kgs.

Select High Grown Western BOP's gained Rs. 20/- to 30/- whilst others were dearer to a lesser extent, and their corresponding BOPF's sold around last week's levels where quality was maintained. Below best Western BOP's too gained Rs. 20/- per kg, whilst their BOPF's counterparts with maintained quality were firm although poorer sorts lost Rs. 10/- to 20/-. Nuwara Eliya BOP's / BOPF's sold well at fully firm prices. Uda Pussellawa BOP's/BOPF's with maintained quality were fully firm, whilst Uva BOP's held firm, but their corresponding BOPF's were Rs. 10/- to 20/- lower. High Grown CTC PF1's were up to 20/- easier whilst CTC Mediums with neat leaf varied between firm to Rs. 10/- to 20/- lower. Low Grown PF1's eased Rs. 10/- to 20/-. A prominent multinational buyer was once again active for both rotorvane and CTC teas. There was strong competition from China, whilst Taiwan, and the "Tea Bag" sector operating for Russia were also active. Japan, Europe and North America bid on the liquoring teas, although on a more selective note.

Low grown stylish OP1's were generally easier apart from a range of cleaner below-best teas that were maintained. OP/OPA's lost Rs. 10/- to 20/- and more following quality. A few selected BOP1's were firm whilst all others were irregular and lower. The better Pek/Pek1's held last levels but others were easier. Well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's too were irregularly lower. Bottom level teas continued to meet with fair demand across all low grown catalogues. Several factors are preventing seamless export operations of low grown teas in particular. The disruptions in the Port following the low turnout of specialist workers, directly on account of COVID-19 lockdown and Isolation imposed in several areas to contain the virus, lesser frequency of cargo vessels and the reported shortage of empty containers are adding to the local buyers' woes. Additionally, the recent war between Armenia and Azerbaijan which ended which saw an end following a peace deal brokered by Russia has also weakened trading in tea as much as the Turkish Lira's downward slide against major currencies to become the year's worst performing emerging market currency. There was fair demand from Germany and the Middle Eastern buyers at lower levels.

LOW GROWNS - LEAFY

BOP1: Best teas declined substantially; balance too irregularly lower by Rs,20-30/- per kg, Poorer sorts were however maintained.

OP1 : Few select best invoices were barely steady; balance declined substantially and at times were difficult of sale. Stalky invoices tended irregular.

OP : Best teas were lower by Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance too declined and at times were difficult of sale. Teas at the lower end were generally firm.

OPA: Best teas declined substantially; balance too irregularly dearer. Poorer sorts held firm.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were lower by Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance too declined but up to a lesser extent. Best bold PEK's lower by Rs.20/- per kg and at times more; balance declined Rs.30-40/- per kg and at times were difficult of sale. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

BOPF/BOPFSP: Select best and best together with cleaner below best were firm. Others were irregular following quality.

FBOP/FBOP1: Select best FBOP's were irregularly lower. Best and cleaner below best firm. Others irregular, Cleaner teas at the bottom too were firm to selectively dearer. Others sold around last levels. FBOP1's in general firm.

FBOPF/FBOPF1: Select best FF1's were easier. Best together with below best too were lower. However, cleaner teas at the lower end were firm. Others irregular following quality. Very tippy teas declined. Well-made teas in the best category maintained. All others were lower.

FBOPFSP/EXSP: Except for few Invoices in the top category which sold well others declined and below best varieties firm to lower as the sale progressed. Teas at the lower end sold at last week levels.

Teas in the Below Best category were up to Rs. 20/- per kg dearer. At the lower end, clean leaf teas gained Rs. 20-30 per kg, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Nuwara Eliya's —the very limited availability continued to sell well. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's gained Rs. 20 per kg and more for the clean leaf teas

BOPF: A small selection of teas were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. Teas in the Below Best category were irregular. At the lower end, clean leaf teas were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular. Nuwara Eliya's –the very limited availability continued to sell well. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's were firm and tended dearer.

Crop & Weather

For the period 09th - 15th November 2020

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - Bright weather and evening showers were reported from the Western and Nuwara Eliya regions during the week. Heavy showers are expected in the North Western Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Uva/Udapussellawa Regions -The Uva/Udapussellawa regions experienced clear weather and evening showers during the week. The Department of Meteorology forecasts heavy showers in the week ahead.

Low Growns -_The Low Grown Region reported bright mornings and evening showers. Heavy showers are expected in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake -_The Western Region reported a slight increase in the crop intake, whilst the Nuwara Eliya and Low Grown regions maintained. The Uva/Udapussellawa regions reported a slight decrease in the crop intake.

BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.25 HELD ON MONDAY 16TH NOVEMBER, 2020

CTC LEAF: 50,679 packages of Current Season and 190 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with an improved demand.

BROKENS: Well made good liquoring BOPs met with quite a good demand and sold at firm to slightly dearer rates. Their BOP's met with a strong demand and were dearer by Tk.1/- to Tk.2/- and occasionally more. Medium varieties witnessed more demand and were slightly dearer but plainer varieties were a fair market with quite fair withdrawals. BLF's met with only a fair demand at easier rates. Withdrawals were quite fair in this category.

FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring Fannings were a better market following competition and these sold at firm to slightly dearer rates. Mediums were also a good market and were about steady with a few withdrawals. Plain and BLF's met with some interest at easier rates with quite a lot of withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 8,741 packages of Current Season and 2 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with quite a strong demand. Well made good liquoring Dusts met with a good competition and advanced by Tk.8/- to Tk.10/-. Medium varieties sold at around last levels. Plain and BLF teas met with only some interest at mostly easier prices with quite fair withdrawals. Blenders lent useful support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: Market witnessed a better demand with buyers competing freely particularly for good and better liquoring sorts. Both Blenders and Loose tea buyers showed more interest. As a result, withdrawals were less this week.

Dusts were a dearer market.





Sri Lanka Tea Production for October has been announced as 23.4 m/kgs which shows a gain of 2.1 m/kgs when compared to the same month last year. This is only the second occasion this year that the monthly production has shown an increase, the only other being in July when a 0.3 m/kgs gain was recorded. The balance months has all seen negative crop harvests. During the month under review, the low grown and high grown sectors have gained approximately 1 m/kgs each whilst the medium elevation increase is only 0.14 m/kgs.

The *ytd* production is only 224.7 m/kgs which is – 29.4 m/kgs behind Jan/ Oct, 2019 and, with just two months left to complete this year, it does point out to the stark reality that Sri Lanka will have an embarrassingly low harvest in 2020.
