COMMENTS

This week's tea auction (Sale # 34) was conducted on August 31 & September 01 (Tue/Wed), amidst a nation-wide COVID-19 lockdown which has been extended up to September 6, 2021 to contain the rapid spread of the Delta Variant. The offer quantity of 6.6 mkg was lower to the previous week's total by 0.2 mkg. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.88 mkg, whilst Main Sale High & Medium had 0.8 mkg and, Ex Estate category had 0.95 mkg.

High Grown plantation districts have reported overcast conditions and showers throughout the week accompanied by strong winds. The Low Grown areas too have reported dull and overcast skies with the Department of Meteorology predicting showers within the next few days. Crop intake in all regions has seen a decline.

There was good general demand for Ex Estate teas, with buyers showing a clear preference for neater teas, where the manufacturing process from 'soup to nuts' had been closely monitored and processed, resulting in even structured leaf appearance. A small selection of best Western BOP's were dearer where supported by Air mail interest whilst others and below-best teas were easier, with poor leaf types again getting neglected. Coloury Western BOPF's in the best category eased Rs. 20/- to 30/- while some improved below best teas appreciated Rs. 10/- to 20/- . The availability of select Nuwara Eliya BOP's were dearer whilst BOPF's were irregularly lower. A small range of Uda Pussellawa BOP's and BOPF's were firm to dearer but poor leaf teas were again discounted and difficult of sale. Seasonal Uva Bop's and BOPF's sold well albeit at sharply lower levels when compared to the previous week where seasonal quality was much preferable. In the CTC segment, the best high elevation PF1's were barely firm whilst others were irregular and lower. Medium elevational PF1's with neat leaf were Rs. 20/- dearer, while the balance was barely steady. Low Grown PF1's were firm to at times dearer. BP1's – the very limited offerings from the High and Medium elevations were largely irregular, while Low Grown sorts again advanced up to 20/-. Bulk buying for Russia was more widespread this week. Interest from Japan was largely centered on the better quality seasonal teas from the Eastern slopes. The UK and other buyers for Europe were selective.

There was fair demand for Low Grown leafy and Tippy teas whilst Semi-Leafy teas saw good interest. Selected OPI's were maintained but several improved below-best teas were firm to selectively dearer. The better made OP's and OPA's too were firm to at times dearer although poorer sorts tended irregular and lower. BOP1's in the 'Best' category held fast to previous levels, whilst some below-best teas were dearer. Well-made Pekoes and Pekoe1 grades were fully firm. However, mixed leaf varieties were mostly lower. The best FBOP's and improved below-best types were firm while the neater FBOPF1's ruled firm to selectively dearer; other secondary types were irregularly easier. Middle Eastern and Russian buyers continued active. Turkey supported the better Pekoe types while Iran was subdued and mainly focused on better leaf. The CIS was active on well-made leafy teas. Iraq supported bottom level teas.

This week's auction comprised of **11,934** lots with a total quantity of **6,588,464** kgs.

BOP: Best Western's were irregular with prices fluctuating following quality and special inquiry. In the Below Best category the better teas were barely steady, whilst the others declined Rs. 10-20 per kg. Plainer clean leaf types were barely steady, whilst the others declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more. Nuwara Eliya's - The few limited invoices sold well. Uda Pussellawa's were firm to marginally dearer, Uva's - Seasonal teas continued to sell well although at lower levels to last with prices fluctuating following quality and special inquiry whilst the other non-seasonal types were generally firm.

BOPF: Best Western's - Select high priced teas of last week declined Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others were up to Rs. 20 per kg lower. In the Below Best category a selection of improved teas were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular. Plainer clean leaf types were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular. Nuwara Eliya together with the Uda Pussellawa's continued to sell around last week's levels. Uva's - Seasonal teas were selectively dearer following special inquiry, whilst the other non-seasonal types were irregular and barely steady.

Crop & Weather

For the period 23rd to 29th August, 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - Both regions reported overcast weather conditions with showers throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, scattered showers are expected in both regions, whilst strong winds are expected in the Nuwara Eliya Region in the week ahead.

Uva/Udapussellawa Regions - Sunny mornings and overcast evenings with scattered showers were reported in both regions throughout the week.

Low Grown - Overcast weather conditions with evening showers were reported in the Low Grown Region throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects scattered showers in the Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake - All regions reported a decline in the crop intake.

- OTHER MARKETS -

BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.16 HELD ON TUESDAY 31ST AUGUST, 2021

CTC LEAF : 44,145 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with a fairly good demand.

BROKENS : Well made good liquoring small Brokens met with a fairly good market and were a little easier. Other varieties followed a similar trend whilst Plain and BLF teas were much less in demand with a quite lot of withdrawals.

FANNINGS : Good liquoring Fannings met with a good demand and mostly sold at around last levels with the very best declining in value. Medium types were a good market and generally sold at around last levels. Plain and BLF teas met with less demand and were easier with a lot of withdrawals.

CTC DUST : 131776 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with quite a good demand. Good liquoring Dusts were in good demand and sold at around last levels. Medium sorts were a good market and were generally firm to slightly dearer closely following quality except for CDs which were easier by Tk.10/- to Tk.15/- with quite a lot of withdrawals. Plain and BLF teas were much less in demand and saw a lot of withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: Market opened to a good demand but slackened a little as the sale progressed. Blenders once again were the mainstay of the market but the Loose tea buyers were a little less active. As a result, higher valued teas declined in value.

CD were a weak feature of the sale.

MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT

Sale No.35 of the 30th/31st August, 2021

Good general demand prevailed for the 132,399 packages (8,67m/kgs) available at irregular levels. 24.30% were unsold.

The Best **BP1s** in the market met an irregular enquiry varying between USC26 - USC62 dearer to easier by USC11 - USC66 while Brighter types held firm to USC30 above last week's levels with Medium varieties ranging between steady to USC6 dearer to easier by USC2 - USC23 and a few invoices were unsold. Lower Medium sorts were irregular and varied between USC2 - USC12 above last levels to easier by USC8 - USC23 and some lines remained unsold while Plainer varieties ranged between USC2 -USC32 dearer to easier by up to USC18 with some teas unsold.

Best **PF1s** available saw an irregular interest and varied between USC10 - USC28 above previous rates to easier by up to USC10 but Brighter categories advanced by USC14 -USC30. Medium varieties were steady to USC26 dearer but a few invoices remained unsold while Lower Mediums saw an irregular enquiry ranging between USC4 - USC13 above last prices to easier by USC3 - USC16 with some invoices unsold. Plainer descriptions were irregular and varied between USC5 - USC14 dearer to easier by USC2 - USC16 with some lines remaining without bids.

Best **PDUSTs** available held steady to USC16 above last levels while brighter categories were better absorbed advancing by USC16 - USC18. Medium varieties were well-competed for at firm to USC28 dearer with Lower Medium types irregular varying between steady to USC10 above previous week's rates to easier by USC2 - USC14 and some invoices were unsold. Plainer sorts met an irregular activity following quality and ranged between USC3 - USC19 dearer to easier by USC3 - USC8 with some teas remaining without bids.

The Best **DUST1s** in the market appreciated by USC15 - USC20 while Brighter types saw improved enquiry and gained USC20 - USC26 with Medium varieties steady to USC28 above previous rates but a few lines were unsold. Lower Medium categories met an irregular interest and varied between firm to USC10 dearer to easier by a similar level. Plainer descriptions ranged between steady to USC4 above last prices to easier by USC6 - USC8 and some teas remained unsold.

In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs gained while PFs were firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were dearer with similar DUSTs advancing. Other Fannings appreciated with DUSTs steady. BMFs were well absorbed at dearer rates.

Pakistan Packers lent strong support and were dominant with strong enquiry from Sudan and Bazaar while Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and UK showed more interest. Egyptian Packers were active with Kazakhstan, other CIS nations and Russia selective while Afghanistan were quiet with Iran subdued.. Local Packers showed more and useful activity on account of price. Somalia were more active at the lower end of the market.

ORTH LEAF

Demand : Fair demand.

Market : Orthodox leaf grades witnessed fair demand at prices which were fairly steady. Some withdrawals were in evidence especially on the mediums and fannings grade. Buying Pattern : Middle East shippers operated with some support from CIS. Upcountry buyers lent support on whole leaf grades.

CTC LEAF

COONOR

Demand: Strong general demand.

Market : Market opened on a steady note and sold around last levels, as the sale progressed it had gained momentum and went on to be sold at fully firm to dearer levels across all grades and categories, including the common and Plainers which were rather less or ignored for couple of weeks. Bopf's witnessed rather less enquiry and were sold comparatively low. **The overall sale percentage is 92% at an average of Rs. 90.74.**

Buying Pattern ; Major Blenders continued their support on the Best, Better and Medium Categories alongwith the other Regional Packeteers. Fairly good Internal participation was witnessed whilst Girnar Food and Beverages was seen with an impressive buying along with Siewart and Dholakia on the Export front.
