

LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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SALE NO.44 OF $09^{\text{TH}}/10^{\text{TH}}$ NOVEMBER 2021

COMMENTS

This week's tea auction (Sale # 44) was held on November 09 & 10 (Tue/Wed), and, the offer quantity was 6.2 mkgs. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.8 mkgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium had 0.7 mkgs, and, Ex Estate category had 0.8 mkgs. Meanwhile, the country is currently experiencing unprecedented rainfall following a convergence zone in the Bay of Bengal where airflows from the Western and Southern Hemispheres have met. Whilst the depression in this region is expected to last some more days, the heavy precipitation has resulted in poor crop intakes across all three elevations.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, a range of select invoices were firm to dearer, whilst the balance teas was irregular. Select best Western Bop's and BOPF's were Rs. 10/- to 20/- dearer. In the below-best category, BOP's were irregular and lower, and, their corresponding BOPF's were about firm. Nuwara Eliya's received substantially lower offers, and were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were irregularly easier while their BOPF's counterparts with neater leaf advanced Rs. 10/- to 20/-. The best Uva BOP's and BOPF's gained up to Rs. 20/-, but others declined by a similar margin. CTC Teas – The better High & Medium Grown PF1's were firm and Rs. 10/- per kg dearer, while Low Growns advanced up to Rs. 20/-. BP1's – There were hardly any offerings from the High and Medium elevations, while Low Grown sorts were firm. Bulk buying for Russia was more widespread on account of stepped up winter buying, for shipment to St. Petersburgh in vessels due to set sail shortly. Japan, Germany and the UK were again selective on the better liquoring teas. There was only moderate interest from Hong Kong, and China.

There was fair demand for Low Growns. Select best OP1's were irregular whilst some below-best teas were firm. Poorer sorts were firm to irregular and easier. The better OP's and OPA's were generally firm to selectively dearer while others were irregular. Well-made BOP1's were maintained, but others were irregular and sometimes easier. Selected, Pekoes and Pekoe1 grades along with improved below-best sorts were fully firm to dearer; others and mixed varieties were irregular and easier. Well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's were firm, while cleaner below-best teas appreciated on last. Poorer teas however, were irregular following quality. Buyers for the Middle East and a few European destinations bid on well-made BOP1 types while the CIS supported clean and stylish leafy teas. Turkey was fairly active on Pekoes, but, continued to follow quality. Iran was strong on well-made Tippy descriptions while Iraq concentrated more on bottom level teas.

This week's auction comprised of 11,795 lots with a total quantity of 6,231,024 kgs.

Uda Pussellawa's were irregular. Uva's - Better sorts were Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer whilst the others were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg lower.

BOPF: Best Western's - Select high priced teas declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more whilst the others were Rs. 10-20 per kg lower. Teas in the Below Best category were firm/irregular. At the lower end prices were mostly firm. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsaleable. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer. Crop & Weather

For the period 1st to 7th November, 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - Both regions reported overcast weather with showers throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, heavy showers are expected in the Western Region in the week ahead.

Uva/Udapussellawa Region - Rain and dull weather was reported in both regions throughout the week.

Low Growns - The Low Grown Region reported gloomy weather with showers throughout the week.

Crop Intake - Western, Uva, Udapussellawa and Low Grown regions reported a decline in the crop intake, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region maintained.

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-OTHER MARKETS-

BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.26 HELD ON MONDAY 08TH NOVEMBER 2021.

CTC LEAF: 52,049 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with less demand at easier

rates.

BROKENS: Well made good liquoring Brokens were a fair market and eased by Tk.3 to Tk.5/- and

at times more over last. Medium and plainer varieties were also an easier market with quite fair withdrawals. BLF teas met with less demand and were easier with quite a

lot of withdrawals.

FANNINGS: Good liquoring Fannings met with a fair market but prices eased by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/-

compared to last prices. Medium varieties followed a similar trend but withdrawals were more in this category. Plainer varieties met with much less demand with quite

heavy withdrawals. BLF teas were an easier market with a lot of withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 11,215 packages of Current Season & 20 packages of Old Season teas on offer met

with a fairly good demand. Good liquoring Dusts sold around last levels. Medium varieties were fully firm to occasionally dearer by Tk.2/- to Tk.3/- following quality. Plain and BLF Dusts were an easier market and saw fair withdrawals. Blenders lent

strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: Demand slackened as the sale progressed this week resulting in a lower prices with quite fair withdrawals. Blenders showed quite fair interest for all good liquoring

Uganda hopes to win market for tea, Turkey's most popular hot drink

Tea comes from environments that meet specific requirements, making it one of best known in Africa



Uganda is endowed with a favorable climate, fertile soils, altitude, plenty of sunshine and abundant rainfall for tea growing. Tea is largely grown along the Lake Victoria crescent, the lower slopes of the Rwenzori Mountain -- 1,200-1,800 meters (3,937 feet-5,906 feet) above sea level -- and the Western Rift Valley. The tea plant, introduced in 1900, had by the mid-1950s become one of Uganda's main estate crops. An average of 65,000 metric tons (71,650 tons) is exported from the country annually and experts think that this figure could be further improved with better agronomical practices.

Uganda has only exploited about 10% of its potential for tea growing and has about 21,000 hectares (52,000 acres) under cultivation for the crop. Tea leaves are harvested by hand or shears, with well-trained workers able to selectively pick the plant's two main leaves and bud, which are then usually processed. Though the tea liquors are of average quality, their leaves are very clean, blackish, grainy, and dense.

Ugandan tea meets specific requirements

Consumption of tea can have benefits to health and wellness due to the beverage's anti-inflammatory and antioxidant effects. It also has a cultural significance for many societies. The majority of Uganda's tea finds its way to international markets, including to Turkey, the world's top tea consumer per capita. Turkey is a strategic market for African tea producers like Uganda, with a production capacity averaging 65,000 tons per annum and potential for further growth and productivity gains.

All Ugandan tea comes from farming environments that meet specific requirements, including little or no use of pesticides, making it one of the best-known agricultural export plants on the continent. The country ranked third last year among African producers behind Kenya and Malawi, according to the Hamburg-based data website Statista. The most typical method of tea processing in Uganda is curing in the sun. Also used often is charcoal-based roasting, a method that many claim gives the leaves an aromatic flavor and prolongs shelf life.

Turkey-Africa relations

Trade volume between Turkey and Africa has risen by 381%, ballooning from \$5.4 billion when Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan came to power in 2003, to \$25.4 billion in 2020. "We will work together, shoulder to shoulder to increase our trade volume up to \$50 billion," Erdogan said in January last year at an economic and business forum between Turkey and Africa.

Erdogan has visited 30 of 54 African countries, the most by a non-African head of state. The number of Turkish embassies in Africa has grown from 12 to 43 since 2002, while the national flag carrier, Turkish Airlines, flies to more than 60 African destinations.

Uganda Investment Authority board chairman Morrison Rwakakamba attended the Turkey-Africa III Economic and Business Forum earlier this year and expressed hope in Turkish interest in agriculture and agro-processing in the East African country.

"With Turkey, the relationship is very much based on mutuality and win-win, and that is a very good starting point," said Morrison.

Experts say Turkey has developed goodwill in Africa, with its more considered approach, compared with countries like China, whose projects have been known to burden developing countries with heavy debt.

Turkish Ambassador to Uganda Fikret Kerim Alp told Anadolu Agency that the main reason for Ankara's increased interest in Africa is the potential for development together.

"Turkey is interested in diversifying its investment and resources to enhance cooperation with the developing world and develop together," said Alp.
