

TEA MARKET REPORT

SALE NO. 50 OF DECEMBER 18 & 19, 2023

COMMENTS

Sri Lanka's Tea Production for the period of Jan/Nov 2023 which is 236Mkgs reflects an increase of 3.9Mkgs when compared with the corresponding period of last year. This is a welcome sign where in the previous year a deficit was recorded. A more comprehensive detail can be found elsewhere in this report.

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale # 50 of 2023 which was the concluding sale for this year was held on Dec. 18 & 19, 2023 (Mon/Tue), and, had a weight of 5.0 mkgs on offer, which was an increase of 0.1 mkgs when compared to the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy/Small Leaf & Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.1 mkgs, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.64 mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 0.74 mkgs.

There was fair general demand at firm to irregular levels for Ex-Estate teas. Best Westerns BOP/BOPF's where quality was maintained, were firm to selective dearer due to special inquiry. In the below best category, select invoices were firm whilst the others were irregularly easier. Teas in the plainer category were an easier feature. The majority of the Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold due to lack of suitable bids. Udapussellawa's BOP's were substantially lower whilst Uva's BOP's were Rs.50-100/- easier. Uda Pussellawa BOPF's were firm to irregularly easier whilst Rs,50-100/- and more. CTC Teas – High and Medium PF1's declined Rs.50/- and more whilst the balance tended irregularly easier. Low Growns however were firm to irregularly easier. There was hardly any BP1's on offer this week's. Demand from Western markets witnessed a slowing down on purchases in view of the festive season ahead. Buyers from China and Taiwan were only moderately active whist Russian interest was barely maintained at lower price levels. There was good demand in the Low Grown category. Select best BOP1/OP1/OPA's were fully firm to selectively dearer whilst the balance were firm. PEKOE/PEKOE1 's were fully firm to dearer following quality. Well made FBOP/FBOPF1, appreciated whilst balance were firm. Bright tippy teas were a slightly an easier feature this week. There was fair interest from shippers to Saudi Arabia Iran, UAE, and other Middle Eastern countries along with Russia and the CIS. The next sale for the year 2024 will be held on 2nd and 3rd January.

OPA : Select best invoices were lower by Rs.50-100/- and at times more. Balance was fully firm to dearer by Rs. 20-40/- per kg particularly in the latter part of the sale. Poorer sorts met with a lower demand.

PEK/PEK1: PEKOE's all-round appreciated by Rs.50/- per kg. Best PEKOE1's were maintained whilst others were irregular and mostly lower. Teas at the lower end were dearer by Rs.20-40/- per kg.

Uva's were Rs.50-100/- per kg easier.

BOPF: Best Western's, where quality was maintained, were mostly firm, whilst the others were irregular and easier. In the Below Best category, select invoices were firm and up to Rs.50/- per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and easier. At the lower end, plainer clean leaf types were firm, whilst the others were irregular. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and irregularly easier. Uva's declined by Rs.50/- per kg and more.

Crop & Weather

For the period 12th to 18th December, 2023

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions:

The Western Region reported bright mornings and occasional evening showers, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported sporadic showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects fairly heavy showers and misty conditions in both regions in the week ahead.

Uva/ Udapussellawa Region:

Both regions reported clear mornings and evening showers throughout the week. Sporadic showers are expected in the Uva Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Low Growns:

The Low Grown Region reported sunny mornings and evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects fairly heavy showers in the Sabaragamuwa Region and misty conditions in both the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake:

All planting districts maintained the crop intake.

CTC LEAF: 76,102 packages of tea on offer met with a fairly good demand.

BROKENS: Well made Brokens were quite a strong feature and often advanced in prices following competition. Other varieties met with a fair demand and were generally a little easier and there were some withdrawals. Plain teas continued to attract less interest and prices accordingly eased further. There were quite heavy withdrawals. BLF teas met with less demand than last with a decline in price and heavy withdrawals.

FANNINGS: A few good liquoring Fannings were quite a strong market and were firm to slightly dearer. Other varieties met with a fair demand but prices were about steady to little easier. However, there were quite heavy withdrawals. Plain teas followed a similar trend as of last week with heavier withdrawals. BLF teas met with less demand than last with a decline in price and heavy withdrawals.

DUST: 15,811 packages of tea on offer met with fair demand. Good liquoring Dusts met with a fair demand and sold Tk.5/- to Tk.8/- less than last levels. Mediums were an easier market and sold around Tk.5/- to Tk.10/- less than last following quality. Plain and BLF Dusts again continued to be difficult of sale and with heavy withdrawals. Blenders were fairly active whilst Loose tea buyers were selective.

COMMENTS: Reprinted teas from previous sales constituted the bulk of the offerings and owing to lack of interest for these teas, withdrawal percentage was heavy. Furthermore, there was also easing of price levels. The fresh Invoices, however, were well supported at irregular rates. Blenders lent fairly good support and there was some interest from the Loose tea buyers.

There was good general demand in the market at irregular rates for the 255,158 packages (17,065,234.00 kilos) available in the market; 38.29% was unsold.

Offerings:

Leaf Grades - 137,420 packages (9,002,615.00 kilos) - 38.19% unsold.

Dust Grades - 89,320 packages (6,618,457.00 kilos) - 42.23% unsold.

Secondary Grades - 28,418 packages (1,444,162.00 kilos) - 26.39% unsold.

MARKETS -

Pakistan Packers were strong with more enquiry from Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries. Bazaar and UK maintained activity with Kazakhstan and other CIS states active but selective. Afghanistan were more selective while Egyptian Packers lent more and strong support. There was increased interest from South Sudan while Iran showed some activity. Russia was less active with Sudan absent. Local Packers showed more enquiry while Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.

BP1

Best – Met very irregular demand and varied from USC104 dearer for some lines to easier by up to USC113.

Brighter – Saw good enquiry ranging between USC67 above last rates with some invoices advancing by up to USC102; some lines were discounted by up to USC14.

Mediums – KTDA mediums lost up to USC18 where sold with Plantation mediums irregular at USC50 above previous rates for some lines while others were discounted by up to USC10.

Lower Medium – Met less activity and lost up to USC15 but a few lines held steady to USC6 above last levels.

Plainer – Met less enquiry at mostly easier rates with a number of teas discounted by up to USC16.

Boston Tea Party turns 250 years old with reenactments of the revolutionary protest

BOSTON -- Patriotic mobs and harbor tea-dumping returned to Boston on Saturday as the city marked the 250th anniversary of the revolutionary protest that preceded America's independence.

The commemoration of the Boston Tea Party included scheduled reenactments of the throwing of tea leaves into the city's harbor and community meetings that preceded the defiant act on Dec. 16, 1773 -- though this time, the symbolic protest was aided by spotlights and microphones. City officials were expecting thousands of visitors for the celebration.

Crowds who gathered to watch the reenactment quickly joined in, shouting "Huzzah!" along with the costumed actors as boxes of tea were dumped in the harbor. Later, they resoundingly booed an actor who read King George III's order closing the bay, and they cheered as narrators detailed the drafting of the Declaration of Independence.

Tea for the reenactment was supplied by the East India Co., the same British company that was at the center of the raucous dispute.

During the historic event, protesting "taxation without representation," members of the Sons of Liberty and others boarded East India Co. ships and dumped their valuable haul - some 92,000 pounds (41,700 kilograms) of tea worth nearly \$2 million today -- into the murky waters of Boston Harbor.

Great Britain responded with military rule and other sanctions on Massachusetts, stoking American opposition to colonial rule.

The Boston Tea Party is considered a pivotal event leading the American Revolutionary War.

"It's a reminder for all of us, not just here in the United States but all over the world, that democracy is in action: Doing what's right, no matter the odds, for our friends, our families, our homes, our future," Boston Mayor Michelle Wu said at a news conference Friday previewing the anniversary.
