SALE NO: 11 of MARCH 14 & 15, 2023

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COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale # 11 of 2023 was held on March 14 & 15, 2023 (Tue/Wed), with a weight of 5.0 mkgs, which was 0.2 Mkgs lower than the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.2 mkgs, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.6 mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 0.7 mkgs.

The Tea Auction prices across all catalogues witnessed a substantial lowering of prices on account of appreciation of the Sri Lankan Rupee against the USD. The SL Rupee has strengthened against the USD from last week, and is likely to appreciate further in the weeks ahead. In this backdrop, the buyers, whilst suffering heavy losses on account of the fluctuating parity rate between SLR and USD, are also adopting a "wait and see attitude" prior to making fresh purchases against orders in hand. Following this situation, "bulk buying" too has come to a halt, which is also contributing to the lower prices

There was improved demand for teas in the Ex Estate catalogue. The selection of better Western BOP's were Rs. 50/- dearer whilst others were firm. Neater below-best category teas appreciated up to Rs. 50/-, while, teas at the lower end often gained more. Best Western BOPF's gained up to Rs. 100/- and even more for selected teas whilst below-best teas advanced up to Rs. 50. Plainer Western BOPF's advanced up to Rs. 100/-. A few selected Nuwara Eliya BOP's were firm whilst the balance was difficult of sale. Nuwara Eliya BOPF's were conspicuous by its absence. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were irregular and lower while their corresponding BOPF's were Rs. 20/- to 40/- dearer. Uva BOP's and BOPF's gained Rs. 50/-, and, even up to Rs. 100/- for select, coloury teas. <u>CTC Teas</u> – High Grown PF1's gained Rs. 50/- to Rs. 100/-. Medium PF1's with better leaf were fully firm whilst others were irregular following quality. Low Grown PF1's commenced firm and appreciated up to Rs. 50/- as the sale progressed. There were hardly any High Grown BP1's on offer, while, Mediums were irregular. Low Grown sorts were firm to Rs. 20/- to 30/- dearer. There was better demand from the Western Markets, while buyers for Japan, China and Taiwan were also more active. Russian interest was maintained.

The levels of uncertainty in the market for Low Grown teas appeared less than the previous week, although irregular demand continued to be witnessed. Well-made OP1's were firm to easier whilst OP / OPA's too eased on last levels. A range of selected BOP1's in the "best" category held firm whilst below-best teas and poorer sorts were lower. Pekoes / PEK1's in general were firm. FBOP's once again sold at easier rates declining up to Rs. 100/- and even more whilst FBOPF1's also followed a similar trend. There was again much less demand from Iran, whilst bulk buyers for Saudi Arabia, The UAE and other Middle Eastern countries were more selective. Russia and the CIS operated on a low key. Türkiye and Syria were moderately active for Pekoe grades. Libya supported the secondary whole leaf grades, whilst Iraq was less active for bottom level teas.

This week's auction comprised of 10,132 lots with a total quantity of 5,098,630 kgs.

- **BOP1** : Select BOP1s' maintained on last week levels, balance were irregularly lower and teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- **OP1** : Select best invoices maintained and balance were irregular following quality. Stalky invoices were dearer by Rs.20-30/- per kg.
- **OP** : Teas in the select best category was maintained, balance declined by Rs.50/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were maintained.
- **OPA** : Select best OPAs' declined by Rs.50/- whilst balance were maintained. Teas at the lower end too maintained.
- **PEK/PEK1 :** A select best PEKOE1s' appreciated substantially; balance were irregular. Best bold PEKOEs' maintained; balance tended irregular. Teas at the lower end declined Rs.50/- per kg.

TIPPY/SMALL LEAF

BOP/BOPSP : A selection of well made BOPs on special inquiry were firm ,whilst others were irregular. Cleaner Below Best too sold on last levels. Balance were easier.

BOPF/BOPFS : BOPFs in general were easier.

FBOP/FBOP1 : Select Best FBOPs were firm to easier. However, Best together with Below Best varieties maintained at last week's levels. Teas at the lower end declined. FBOP1s in general were lower.

FBOPF/FBOPF1 : FBOPF/FBOPF1s' in general, were substantially lower at the commencement however, as the sale progressed there was improved demand and were firm to selectively dearer towards the closure of the sale.

FBOPFSP/EXSP : In the premium catalogued very tippy teas continued to decline, whilst Best and Below Best sold around last levels. However, teas at the lower end were lower.

HIGH GROWNS TEAS

BOP: Best Western's were firm and Rs.50/- per kg deare6, whilst the others were mostly firm. In the Below Best category, better teas were up to Rs.50/- per kg dearer whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market appreciated further. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices were dearer whilst the others were irregular and difficult of sale. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were irregular, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Uva's gained Rs.50/- per kg and marginally more for select invoices.

BOPF: Best Western's gained up to Rs.100/- per kg and substantially more for a few select invoices. In the Below Best category brighter sorts appreciated up to Rs.50/- per kg whilst the others together with teas at the lower end appreciated up to Rs.100/- per kg: Nuwara Eliya's had hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs.20-40/- per kg dearer. Uva's were firm and marginally dearer, whilst select coloury invoices gained up to Rs.100/- per kg.

Crop & Weather

For the period of 06^{th} to 12^{th} March, 2023

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions:

The Western Region reported bright mornings and gloomy evenings with occasional evening showers, whilst clear mornings and sporadic evening showers were reported in the Nuwara Eliya Region throughout the week. Afternoon/evening showers are expected in both regions in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Uva/ Udapussellawa Region:

Sunny mornings and light evening showers were reported in the Uva Region, whilst the Udapussellawa Region reported clear mornings and occasional evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects heavy showers in the Uva Region in the week ahead.

Low Growns:

The Low Grown Region reported sunny weather throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, afternoon/evening showers are expected in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: All planting districts generally maintained the crop intake.

Sh1.3bn Kenyan tea held at Karachi port as dollar shortage hits Pakistan

Kenya's tea worth Sh1.3 billion is held at the Port of Karachi as Pakistan struggles with a shortage of dollars that has restricted banks from issuing traders with the Letter of Credit, which is required before offloading.

Traders say at least 200 containers with 4.8 million kilograms of tea are being held at the port, hitting sales back in Kenya and impacting negatively on prices.

The Pakistani traders are also unable to purchase more from Kenya as they lack Letters of Credit to issue to the sellers to guarantee them payment.

Kenya Tea Development Agency (KTDA) chairman David Ichoho said the situation in Pakistan is set to improve in the coming days following talks with China and the World Bank, aimed at bailing the Asian nation out of the current financial woes.

"I am told that part of the teas being held at the port is being released to the market and we expect the situation to improve in coming days," said Mr Ichoho.

Mr Ichoho was part of the team that visited Pakistan last week together with the Minister for Agriculture Mithika Linturi.

The withheld tea has also impacted the Pakistani market with the price of the beverage hitting Rs1,600 (Sh750) per kilo from Rs1,100 (Sh517) a month ago due to limited supply.

The Pakistani government has given priority to essential commodities such as foodstuff and medicine in order to preserve dollars.

Pakistan chairman of Tea Association (PTA) Zeeshan Paracha, is quoted by the local media saying that prices would further go up if consignments stuck at the port are not released.

"PTA associations are facing problems in the clearance of documents due to dollar shortage in banks, which means that containers full of tea leaves cannot be released," the official is quoted by a media outlet in Pakistan.

Kenya said last week that it was pushing for barter trade with rice imports from Pakistan to cushion the country's largest buyer of tea at the Mombasa auction.

Tea prices continue to fall as Pakistan curbs imports

Last year, Pakistan imported tea worth 234 million kilograms with Kenya supplying 191 million kilos equivalent to about 82 percent of the total imports by Islamabad, according to the tea regulator.

Pakistan remains a market for Kenya as it accounts for at least 40 percent of the total teas that Kenya exports to the world market.
