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COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale # 18 of 2023 was held on May 09 & 10, 2023 (Tue/Wed), and, had a weight of 6.2 mkgs on offer, which was an increase of 0.2 mkgs over the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.5 mkgs, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.83 mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 0.94 mkgs.

There was mostly fair demand at easier rates for teas in the Ex Estate catalogue. A very limited selection of "best category" Western BOP's and BOPF's were firm, while others showing a drop in quality eased Rs.50/- per kg, and even more as the sale progressed. Plainer liquoring BOP's lost Rs.50/- and much more as the sale progressed, whilst their BOPF's counterparts which opened around last week's closing levels, were neglected by the close, resulting in such teas being mostly unsold. Nuwara Eliya BOP's were irregularly lower following quality, whilst their BOPF's held firm. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were generally firm, but, their BOPF's counterparts eased Rs.50/- to 100/-. Cleaner Uva BOP's were mostly firm, while others lost Rs.50/- to 100/-. Uva BOPF's commenced Rs.50/- easier, but declined up to Rs.100/- and more by the close. CTC Teas – High Grown PF1's eased by Rs. 00/-, whilst Mediums shed Rs.100/- and more towards the close. Low Growns declined Rs.50/- to 100/-. There were hardly any High Grown BP1's on offer, while, selected Mediums were irregular and easier. Low Grown sorts were firm. There was weak demand from the Western Markets, while buyers for Japan, China and Taiwan too were less active. Russian interest was moderate.

There was fair demand for Low Grown teas. Select best OP1's were firm, while, OP's and OPA's also sold around previous week's levels. BOP1's in general were easier. Pekoes and PEK1's were irregular and mostly easier. The best FBOP's were firm to a little dearer. FBOPF1's sold around last levels. Buying interest from Iran was weak. Buyers for Saudi Arabia, The UAE and other Middle Eastern countries were fairly active. Russia and the CIS were active on leafy grades at lower market levels. Türkiye and Syria supported the Pekoe grades at lower levels. Libya supported the secondary whole leaf grades, whilst bottom level teas were absorbed by Iraq.

This week's auction comprised of 11,302 lots with a total quantity of 6,225,863 kgs.

BOP: Best Western's - Few select invoices were barely steady, whilst the others declined up to Rs.50/- per kg following quality. In the Below Best category, a selection of coloury teas were firm, whilst the others particularly the thinner liquoring teas declined up to Rs.50/- per kg. Plainer sorts which were firm at the commencement declined by up to Rs.50/- per kg by the close. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular and barely steady. Uda Pussellawa's were mostly firm. Uva's – Clean leaf teas were mostly firm, whilst the others which were Rs.50/- per kg easier at the commencement of the sale declined up to Rs.100/- per kg and more by the close..

BOPF: Best Western's -Select invoices were firm, whilst the others declined up to Rs.50/- per kg. Teas in the Below Best category which commenced Rs.50-70/- per kg easier, eased further as the sale progressed. Plainer sorts which commenced around last week's closing levels were often neglected by the close and mostly unsold. Nuwara Eliya's were generally firm. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uva's which were Rs.50/- per kg easier at the commencement of the sale declined up to Rs.100/- per kg and more by the close.

Crop & Weather

For the period of 1st to 07th May, 2023

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions:

Gloomy weather with showers were reported in the Western Region, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported overcast mornings and evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects occasional showers with strong windy conditions in both regions in the week ahead.

Uva/ Udapussellawa Region:

Both regions reported bright mornings and evening showers throughout the week.

Low Growns:

Dull weather with showers were reported in the Low Grown Region throughout the week. Sporadic showers are expected in the Sabaragamuwa Region, whilst strong winds are expected in the coastal areas of the Ruhuna Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake: The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions maintained the crop intake, whilst the Uva/ Udapussellawa and Low Grown regions reported a slight decline.

Kenya expects to increase tea export to China

Kenya is keen to expand its tea export to China in order to boost the sector's revenues. It exported 1.4 million kg of tea to China in 2022. NAIROBI, May 6 (Xinhua) -- Kenya is keen to expand its tea export to China in order to boost the sector's revenues, a government official said Friday.

"This year, we expect the volume to increase as more Kenyan orthodox and black teas find their way to China," said Peris Mudida, head of the Tea Directorate at the Agriculture and Food Authority of Kenya, the world's top tea exporter.

Tea contributes about 23 percent of total foreign exchange earnings in Kenya, according to the Tea Directorate. The country produces more than 450 million kg of tea annually, and the industry supports about 5 million people directly and indirectly in the East African country with a population of 53 million.

According to the Tea Industry Committee of the China Association for the Promotion of International Agricultural Cooperation, Kenya exported 1.4 million kg of tea to China in 2022. Mudida said that Kenya recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding with a Chinese company that will help enhance the manufacturing capacity of tea factories in the country and expand their access to the global market. "This is of significant importance to the tea industry as Kenya can easily meet China's immediate and future tea requirements," Mudida said.

Qatar's flagship Tea Time pours into UK market

Leicester has been chosen as the site for the first UK Tea Time location.

Qatar's popular cafe chain Tea Time will open its first ever branch in the United Kingdom in Leicester, reports said on Thursday. An image of the new branch being constructed showed the logo of the flagship brand in the English city. Esteem Property Developers, based in Leicester, are now transforming the Granby Street unit in anticipation of the cafe's opening in July, according to a Tea Time spokesperson, reports said. 'World renowned saffron tea' from Tea Time would be among the food and beverages offered, the spokesperson told Leicestershire Live. The Qatar-exported cafe will also offer Italian soufflé, pasta dishes, sandwiches, and healthy juices.

Owing it to "its diverse population and also its reputation for being a foodie destination," Leicester was chosen as the site for the first UK Tea Time location.

Scattered across the Gulf country, Tea Time first sprouted in 2002 in Doha. Since then, it has grown in popularity and now boasts more than 100 locations for it, including 54 in Qatar, 26 in Oman, seven in Bahrain, seven in Saudi Arabia, three in Kuwait, and five in the United Arab Emirates. Qatar-based cafes and restaurants have found their way outside of the borders of the Gulf state in recent years, many of of which have thrived in the UK. The first international outpost of popular Qatari eatery <u>Burgeri</u> opened in central London back in 2016. It is located in Soho, opposite upmarket department store Liberty and within just a minutes walk from the affluent Oxford Circus. Meanwhile, Qatar's acclaimed cafe Chapati & Karak branched out of Katara Cultural Village and opened a spot in the UK capital in early 2014. Located on Brompton Road in Knightsbridge, Chapati & Karak London has become a hotspots for tourists and locals.
