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COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale # 22 of 2023 was held on June 06 & 07, 2023 (Tue/Wed), and, had a weight of 6.9 mkgs on offer, which was an increase of 1 mkgs over the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy/Small Leaf & Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.8 mkgs, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.94 mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 1 mkgs.

The Ex-Estate market this week met with price fluctuations following quality. Select best BOP/BOPF's declined Rs.100/- and more following quality. Teas in the below best and plainer categories too lost Rs.50/- and more as the sale progressed with a fair weight of teas remaining unsold due to lack of suitable bids. The majority of Nuwara Eliya's met with less demand with a fair weight remaining unsold. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's too were an easier feature and lost Rs.50-100/- and more as the sale progressed with many teas being neglected. CTC teas from all elevations continued to witness an irregular trend with prices declining as the sale progressed with a fair volume of teas remaining unsold particularly towards the latter part of the sale. Most buyers continued to be selective on their purchases on account of quality along with Russian buyers who too followed a similar pattern.

Low Grown Leafy teas met with improved demand this week. Select Best BOP1/OP1's were selectively dearer whilst the Below Best and poorer sorts maintained last levels. Demand for PEKOE/PEKOE1's maintained. Small Leaf teas such as FBOP/FBOP1's met with better demand and appreciated this week. Bright Tippy teas however met with less demand this week and a decline in prices was observed. Shippers to Syria, Turkey, Libya, Iraq along with Russia and the CIS continued to be active.

This week's auction comprised of 12,414 lots with a total quantity of 6,946,709 kgs.

Teas in the Below Best and Plainer categories were mostly firm and selectively dearer. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular and easier. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were firm and dearer whilst the others were barely steady. Uva's - Better teas were firm and up to Rs.50/- per kg dearer for select invoices, whilst the others were barely steady,

BOPF: Best Western's – Declined Rs.50 per kg and more following quality. Teas in the Below Best and Plainer categories, where quality was maintained, were firm and selectively dearer whilst the others declined by Rs.50/per kg and more as the sale progressed. Nuwara Eliya's were up to Rs.50/- per kg easier. Uda Pussellawa's - Better sorts were firm and Rs.20-40/- per kg dearer, whilst the others declined by a similar margin and more. Uva's - Better teas were Rs.20-30/- per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and lower by a similar margin.

Crop & Weather

For the period of 29th May to 04th June, 2023

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions:

Bright weather was reported in both regions throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects sporadic showers in both regions in the week ahead.

Uva/ Udapussellawa Region:

Both regions reported clear weather throughout the week. Evening/night showers are expected in the Uva Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Low Growns:

Bright weather was reported in the Ruhuna Region, whilst the Sabaragamuwa Region reported occasional showers throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, fairly heavy showers in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions are expected in the week ahead.

Crop Intake:

The Western, Uva, Udapussellawa and Low Grown regions reported a slight decline in the crop intake, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region maintained.

CTC LEAF: 39,934 packages of Current Season & 311 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with fair demand at easier rates.

BROKENS: Select few good Invoices sold well and were generally firm whilst Good/Mediums met with a fair demand and were easier often by Tk.5/- and more. Plain and BLF varieties witnessed much less demand and were easier with more withdrawals.

FANNINGS: A few brighter liquoring Invoices met with more competition and sold at around last levels whilst all others eased further and witnessed more withdrawals. Plain and BLF teas saw only fair demand and were easier with more withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,216 packages of Current Season & 55 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with fair demand. Good liquoring Dusts sold at around last levels. Mediums were an easier market with some withdrawals. Plain/BLF Dusts met with lower demand and had more withdrawals than last. CDs were an easier market with Tk.15/- to Tk.20/- less than last. Blenders lent good support and Loose tea buyers were selective.

COMMENTS: A little higher percentage of tea was sold this week although prices were generally lower. A few lines of improved liquoring Invoices witnessed good competition and were dearer. Blenders were a little more active this week. Loose tea buyers were selective lending good support for a few bright liquoring sorts on offer.

Dusts were an easier market.

38% DROP IN TEA CROP IN BENGAL

Culcutta: Scant rainfall coupled with sporadic pest attacks have led to significant fall in tea production in swathes of north Bengal even as prices in auctions remain stagnant amidst cost push.

Indian Tea Association, the trade body of large planters, estimates that there has been a 38 percent drop in crop in North Bengal, mainly due to lack of rainfall, with gardens in the Darjeeling hills being the worst hit.

Even if the crop is down and there is less tea available in the market, prices in the auction for CTC and dust tea which North Bengal (sans Darjeeling) produce, are trending with a negative bias, leaving the industry worried.

"When the production is down and supply is short, one expects prices to remain firm. But we are in a peculiar situation when volume and prices are both down, especially for Darjeeling and Dooars regions which faced extremely hostile weather conditions this year. This is alarming," said Atul Asthana, Managing Director of Goodricke.

Goodricke. Part of Camellia PLC, has 12 gardens in the Dooars region and five in Darjeeling, including the world famous Castleton and Margaret's Hope. It produces 16 million Kg Dooars and about 2 million kg in Darjeeling.

He recalled how during Covid, production shortage due to lockdown led to spike in prices, following the usual dynamics of demand-supply mismatch. "This time around there is a glut in the global market, which is weighing down on CTC prices internationally and in auction centres here," Asthana explained.

Prices are down between 5-9 percent (North India, orthodox and Darjeeling) on average in the first 20 auctions of 2023.

Tea Research Institute (TRA) estimated rainfall in down by 50 percent during May in Dooars. "Dry conditions are prevailing in North Bengal. It is not only the scanty rainfall, lack of relative humidity that is also hurting tea bush growth, "said Jaydeep Phukan, secretary of TRA. Moreover, there have also been pest attacks taking advantage of hot and dry conditions, he added.

Estimated curated by ITA from members suggest production in Terai, Dooars and Darjeeling are down by 25 percent, 30 percent and 40 percent respectively in May when the first flush tea is produced.

Industry participants put the condition of Darjeeling worrying as many gardens are being forced to sell tea below the cost of production. In the auction earlier this week (sale no. 22), broken and fanning teas were sold on average of Rs.350-550/- a Kg while the cost of production is around Rs.650/- a kg. Moreover, a lot of the teas went unsold, signaling weak demand.

Arijit Raha. Secretary General of ITA, described the condition as 'precarious'. "While the earnings of the gardens are down due to lower volume and weak prices, the cost is trending up, mainly led by rise in input costs including wages," he said.

Kenyan tea industry loses over \$19mn - traders

The agricultural business is suffering from attacks and high prices on resources

According to the statement of tea traders at the Mombasa Tea Auction on May 26, Kenya has lost the equivalent of about \$19.4 million since clashes at multinational tea companies in the counties of Kericho and Bomet began.

The Ekaterra Tea company (formerly Unilever) made a statement of the suspension of their activities in the two regions, after the destruction of tea plucking machines by residents who were protesting job losses on May 22.

The tea industry is an important part of Kenya's economy. According to the Kenya Tea Growers Association (KTGA), the current riot situation could have negative ramifications for the tea industry in general as they impede its growth. In addition, the farmers pointed to the high cost of seeds and fertilization as another source of stress, the Central Bank of Kenya reported in March 2023.

Local Kenyan farmers have told RT that they "are not even able to do business because there's no profit" and they need to reduce the size of farming due to the costs.
