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COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale # 23 of 2023 was held on June 13 & 14, 2023 (Tue/Wed), and, had a weight of 6.9 mkgs on offer, which was a slight increase of 0.019 mkgs over the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy/Small Leaf & Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.8 mkgs, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.89 mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 1 mkgs.

Improved demand was witnessed this week consequent to the Sri Lankan Rupee depreciating against the US Dollar. Select best BOP/BOPF invoices from the Western district appreciated Rs. 50-100/- and more whilst Below best and Plainer varieties too appreciated but up to a lesser extent. The Majority of the Nuwaraeliyas once again remained unsold due to lack of suitable bids. Select clean leaf Udapussellwas gained up to Rs.50/- whilst the others were barely steady, and with some teas being neglected. Select best Uva's were up to Rs.50/- dearer, whilst the balance were firm to marginally dearer. CTC teas from High & Medium elevations, the better teas were firm to Rs.50/- dearer whilst the balance tended irregularly easier. Low Grown types however held firm on last levels. There was improved demand from most buyers this week.

Once again demand in the leafy category improved further this week. BOP1/OP1's too were fully maintained. Select best PEKOE/PEKOE's were fully firm to marginally easier but the balance maintained last levels. In the small leaf category FBOP/FBOP1's held firm throughout the sale. The majority of the Middle Eastern buyers along with Russia and the CIS countries continued to be operative.

This week's auction comprised of 12,244 lots with a total quantity of 6,965,794 kgs.

BOP: Best Western's – Select high priced teas gained Rs. 100/- per kg and more, whilst the others appreciated Rs. 50-100/- per kg. Teas in the Below Best category gained Rs. 20-40 per kg and more, whilst the Plainer sorts were firm and up to Rs. 20/- per kg dearer. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's – Select invoices gained Rs. 100/- per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others and particularly the poorer sorts sold around last week's levels. Uva's – Coloury sorts were firm and up to Rs. 50/- per kg dearer, whilst the lighter thinner liquoring types were irregular and barely steady.

BOPF: Best Western's – Select invoices gained Rs. 50-100/- per kg, whilst the others gained Rs. 20-40/- per kg. In the Below Best category, coloury/brighter sorts appreciated Rs. 50-80/- per kg and more, whilst the others gained Rs. 30-40/- per kg. Plainer clean leaf sorts were up to Rs. 50-100/- per kg dearer, whilst the others were up to Rs. 50/- per kg dearer. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Crop & Weather

For the period of 05th to 11th June, 2023

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions:

The Western Region reported gloomy weather conditions with showers, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported sunny weather at the beginning of the week and rain towards the latter part of the week. The Department of Meteorology expects occasional showers in the Western Region and heavy showers with strong windy conditions in the Nuwara Eliya Region in the week ahead.

Uva/ Udapussellawa Region:

Clear weather conditions were reported in the Uva Region, whilst the Udapussellawa Region reported bright mornings and evening showers throughout the week. Evening/night showers are expected in the Uva Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Low Growns:

The Low Grown Region reported sunny mornings and evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects sporadic showers in the Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake:

SALE NO. 08 OF TUESDAY 12th JUNE, 2023

CTC LEAF: 42,558 packages of Current Season & 70 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with fairly good demand.

BROKENS: A few good liquoring Invoices on offer met with more competition and were firm to mostly dearer following quality. Good/Mediums types also met with a fairly good demand and prices were generally steady with less withdrawals. Plain/BLF types again met with less demand and prices eased with more withdrawals.

FANNINGS: A handful of good liquoring Invoices met with a fairly good demand and were generally about firm to occasionally dearer. Good/Mediums witnessed a fairly good demand but eased slightly. Plain/BLF types again met with less demand and prices eased with more withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,609 packages of Current Season & 5 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a fairly good demand. Good liquoring Dusts sold well at around last levels. Mediums were easier by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/- closely following quality. Plain and BLF Dusts witnessed much less demand and were easier with more withdrawals. CDs once again eased further and there was a decline in price level.

COMMENTS: There was a little more demand from the Blenders this week especially for the brighter liquoring teas on offer. As a result, these mostly appreciated in price whilst other varieties declined in price owing to lack of competition. Loose tea buyers were selective.

Clonal seedlings a new hope for the tea industry

Clonal tea seedlings, which are cloned from hybrid varieties of the plant, are helping develop the tea industry of Bangladesh by providing high yields of top-quality tea, according to growers.

The clone tea plants developed so far have demonstrated average yields of more than 3,000 kilogrammes (kgs) per hectare while also indicating reduced susceptibility to disease, experts say.

The tea industry has developed steadily over the years, and even though much of its potential remains untapped, there have been many achievements along the way.

For example, technology and scientific knowledge developed by the Bangladesh Tea Research Institution (BTRI) is being used to locally produce tea clones through genetic modification and micro propagation.

Compared to common seed cultivars, clone cultivars have better cold and drought tolerance, disease and insect resistance, and improved taste and odour.

In order to boost tea production in the country, the BTRI has so far released 18 varieties of clone tea plants that were bred though clonal selection and seed development.

Mainly four types of bi-clonal seedlings -- BT-1, BT-2, BT-3 and BT-4 -- developed by the BTRI are providing the best quality and highest yields compared to those grown from normal seeds.

Besides, the BTRI recently developed its latest variety of clone tea called BT-23 while the launch of BT-24 is highly anticipated.

High quality seedlings of the BT-22 and BT-23 varieties were unveiled on the occasion of the first National Tea Day in 2021. The event was organized by Bangladesh Tea Board.



Shamim Ahmed Chowdhury, manager of Shirajnagor Tea Garden, said he is enjoying good yields from his clonal tea plants even though they have low heat tolerance.

However, the BTRI has come up with new seedlings that are more resilient to bad weather, such as cold and drought as well disease and pests.

"So, I planted those too but I cannot say how the yields will be until the harvest period," he added.

As such, the development of high-quality clone tea plants with high production capacity has been making a significant contribution to the progress of the tea industry.

Dr. Md Ismail Hossain, director (in-charge) of the BTRI, said the highest recorded yield from a hectare of clone tea plants is about 4,000 kgs.

"Efforts are being made to produce quality clones that are capable of leafing and full bushing in a short period of time," he added.

Tea workers trained in cloning seedlings say that no seedlings are currently produced from seeds with about 25,000 clonal seedlings being planted each year.

Golam Mohammad Shiblee, chairman of the Sylhet chapter of the Bangladesh Tea Association, a platform of tea garden owners, said they are getting more than double the yield from clone plants compared to traditional seedlings.

Shiblee went on to say that the BTRI discovered these clones after several years of research.

Jahar Tarafder, member secretary of the Tea Planters and Traders Association of Bangladesh, said 96.5 million kgs of tea was produced by 167 tea gardens across Bangladesh in 2021.

This was the highest recorded production in the 168-year history of the country's tea industry.

Bangladesh ranks ninth in global tea production. The domestic demand for tea is increasing due to the country's increasing population and continuous urbanization.

As a result, exports of tea have suddenly decreased but still, the importance of the tea industry in the national economy is immense and far-reaching.
