<u>US SANCTIONS ON IRAN & TURKISH CURRENCY CRISIS BADLY IMPACT ON COLOMBO TEA AUCTION PRICES</u>

Apart from the best available Low Grown teas, most other grades saw a further lowering of prices at this week's auction which is sending shock waves to the producers of Low Grown and Low Grown type teas of Medium elevation. The economic sanctions on Iran by the USA which came into force this week, has seriously affected this major buyer of our Low Grown teas. Iran is facing a huge currency crisis which has delayed payments being received by Sri Lankan buyers in respect of teas already supplied. This is in turn is creating a chain reaction as many buyers in Colombo are facing difficulties in servicing new orders due to the long delay in the receipt of funds for teas already shipped to Iran. Turkey which is another major market for Sri Lanka teas, is also facing their worst ever currency crisis with the Turkish Lira plunging to a record low this week. The plunge in the Lira which began in May, now looks certain to push the Turkish economy into recession, which will have a cascading effect on the Colombo Auction tea prices as it would only mean that Turkey will have to pay more money to source their favourite tea from Sri Lanka. Buyers in Colombo are closely following the developments that are unfolding in the wake of Turkey's deteriorating relations with the United States and its impact on our tea prices.

At this week's Low Grown sale a total quantity of 2.9Mkgs was on offer. Apart from the best available leafy grades and FBOP/FBOPF1, all other grades declined in value with PEK grades showing the sharpest drop of Rs. 20-30/- per kg and more. Demand from Iran and Turkey was much weaker whilst other Middle Eastern markets active at the lower levels.

The crisis following the non-receipt of funds for shipments already made by Colombo Tea Auction buyers did have a domino effect on this week's High Grown teas sold in the Ex-Estate catalogue. Apart from the best available Westerns and seasonal Uva's all other categories received weak demand and where sold the prices recorded sharp declines. A large volume of teas remained unsold as well. Buyers for Japan were more selective whilst there was more widespread interest for the best available Western & Uva's for buyers from Europe. There was significantly lower demand for "Tea Bag" types for the Russian market.

This week's auction comprised of 11,375 lots with a total quantity of 6,207,070 Kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

<u>CROP & WEATHER</u> For the period 06th - 12th August 2018

Heavy rains continued throughout the western regions during the past week which has caused the crop levels to decline further .Fairly strong gusty winds up to 50Kmph and heavy falls reaching up to 75mm can be expected in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology. Erratic weather continues in the Nuwara Eliya Region region. The rains can be expected in the week ahead. Uva / Udapussellawa Regions experienced bright weather and mild wind during the course of the week. Low Growns Both Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna regions have experienced dull weather with occasional rain throughout the week. However, the possibility of increased showery conditions and wind speed to some extent is still high over both regions in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake: Western, Uva and Low Grown regions continued to show a decline in the crop intake whilst Udapussellawa and Nuwara Eliya regions have maintained.

LOW GROWNS - LEAFY

BOP1: Select best teas were maintained; balance declined Rs. 20-30/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end too followed a similar trend.

OP1: Select best invoices were barely steady; balance was lower by Rs. 20-30/- and at times were difficult of sale. Stalky invoices were maintained.

OP: Best teas were declined Rs. 20/- and at times more; balance too declined Rs. 20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end however maintained last week levels.

OPA: A few well made invoices maintained; balance was lower by Rs. 20/- per kg. Poorer sort however advanced Rs. 10-15/- per kg.

PEK/PEK1: A few well made shotty invoices were maintained; balance was declined Rs. 30-40/- and at times were difficult of sale. Bolder varieties declined sharply on day One by Rs.70-80/- and more as the sale progressed. However, on day Two the market appreciated by Rs. 30-40/-. Teas at the lower end were irregular.

BOP/BOPSP: Except for few select best which sold around last levels; all others eased.

BOPF/BOPFSP: A limited selection of select best maintained; all others were lower.

FBOP/FBOP1 : Select best and best FBOP's were lower whilst few cleaner below best and cleaner teas at the lower end maintained; all others too were lower. FBOP1's in general were lower.

FBOPF/FBOPF1 : Very tippy teas declined sharply and at times were unsellable. Leafier types in the best category were lower by Rs.50/- per kg and more at times. All others declined sharply and were mostly unsellable. However teas at the lower end maintained. Select best and best FF1's declined whilst

few cleaner below best and few cleaner teas at the lower end maintained. Balance eased.

FBOPFSP/EXSP: Overall there was no improvement shown and less demand continued to prevail.

Plainer clean leaf coloury sorts gained Rs.30-40/- per kg, others were firm around last. Nuwara Eliya's – last week's high priced teas were substantially lower; others were up to Rs.30/- per kg easier. Udapussellawa's were Rs.20/- per kg lower. Uva's - seasonal teas continued to sell at firm to dearer rates following quality, other coloury sorts were firm and Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer.

BOPF: Best Westerns gained Rs.20/- per kg and more as the sale progressed. In the below best category, brighter sorts which were Rs.20/- per kg dearer at the commencement appreciated further, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Plainer clean leaf teas which were Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer at the commencement appreciated further by the close. Nuwara Eliya's were substantially lower. Udapussellawa's were irregular. Uva's seasonal teas, select invoices were substantially dearer, other seasonal teas neglected whilst the coloury sorts sold at firm to dearer rates

MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT SALE 33

Fair demand for the 146,137 packages (9.39m/kgs) available in the market at irregular levels and 15.7% remained unsold.

The Best **BP1s** available met improved interest were firm to USC13 dearer while brighter varieties saw better absorption at firm to USC32 above previous rates with Medium types gaining USC3-USC14. Plainer varieties were firm to USC7 above last prices but Plainest shed USC3 where sold.

Best **PF1s** on offer eased by USC8-USC13 and saw a few invoices were unsold with brighter categories easing by USC2-USC4 where sold while Medium types were irregular ranging between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC12 and some lines were neglected. Plainer descriptions by USC4-USC5 and Plainest remained unsold.

The Best **PDUSTs** in the market saw an irregular enquiry varying between USC21 dearer to easier by up to USC25 with Brighter categories gaining US10-USC11 whole Mediums ranged firm to USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC17 with some lines unsold. Plainer descriptions USC2-USC4 dearer but Plainestwere discounted where sold.

Best **DUST1s** available advanced by up to USC13 while Brighter types appreciated by USC18 although a few invoices eased by up to USC3 with Medium categories irregular varying between USC4-USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC3. Plainest types steady.
