

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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# SALE NO.35 OF $04^{\rm TH}$ & $05^{\rm TH}$ SEPTEMBER, 2018. COMMENTS

This week's tea sale quantity of 6.2 Mkgs comprised of 2.8 Mkgs of Low Growns and once again a low volume of 0.8 Mkgs of Ex-Estate teas.

There was good demand for Low Growns after many weeks of dwindling interest and better enquiry from Iran and Turkey in particular. The level of activity seen this week gives hope to the producer sector that has suffered lowering prices month after month from January this year.

Ex-Estate teas saw good general demand. A range of selected Westerns at the top end and also some seasonal Uva's received substantially higher prices on account of special enquiry. Below best teas with neater leaf also appreciated on last whilst CTC PF1's which have had a poor run in prices for many weeks, were fully firm to Rs.10/- per kg dearer.

Low Grown teas received wider support from buyers for Iran and Turkey whilst other Middle Eastern and CIS buyers too were active. The "Tea Bag" sector was more active in the Estate sale with improved buying for Russia. Japan and Europe concentrated on the better liquoring High Growns whilst there was sustained interest for below best teas from buyers for Hong Kong and China in the Far East.

Meanwhile, the plantation districts are now enjoying bright weather conditions after several continuous weeks of heavy rain with no sun light. The current weather should hold out for next week as well according to the Department of Meteorology and we could therefore expect an improvement in harvests by the end of September.

This week's auction comprised of 11,368 lots with a total quantity of 6,215,645 Kgs.

## **LOW GROWNS - LEAFY**

**BOP1:** Best teas declined Rs.30-40/- and more as the sale progressed; balance was generally firm. Teas at the lower end were irregular.

**OP1**: Select best teas were fully firm to dearer at the commencement but declined Rs.40-50/- and more as the sale progressed; balance was irregularly dearer. Stalky invoices were generally lower.

**OP**: Select best invoiced were irregularly dearer; balance was lower by Rs.20/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end too declined.

**OPA:** Teas in the select best category advanced Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance was lower by Rs.10-20/- and more as the sale progressed. Poor sorts declined Rs.20/- and more.

**PEK/PEK1:** Well made shotty invoices appreciated Rs.30-40/- and more following quality; balance too irregularly dearer. Bolder varieties declined sharply by Rs.30-40/- and more as the sale progressed. Teas at the lower end too declined.

Plainer sorts were Rs.10-20/- per kg lower. Nuwara Eliyas were firm and up to Rs.50/- per kg dearer. Udapussellawas were Rs.10-20/- per kg lower. Uva seasonal teas were irregular and mostly easier. Coloury teas declined Rs.20-40/- per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week.

**BOPF:** Best Westerns were mostly Rs.10-20/- per kg easier. In the below best category brighter sorts were Rs.10/- per kg lower whilst the others gained Rs.10-20/- per kg and more. At the lower end, clean leaf brighter sorts were Rs.30-40/- per kg dearer whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas were firm. Udapussellawas were Rs.20-40/- per kg easier. Uva seasonal teas – few select invoices were firm and substantially dearer following special inquiry, other coloury sorts were firm and Rs.10-20/-per kg dearer.

# **OTHER MARKETS**

# MOMBASA TEA AUCTION MARKET REPORT SALE 36 OF THE 03<sup>RD</sup>/04<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST 2018

Fairly good demand for the 134.802 packages (8.71Mkgs) on offer at irregular levels following quality with 12.91% neglected.

Best BP1s in the market met more interest at firm to USC32 dearer with Brighter sorts advancing by up to USC30 while Medium varieties saw an irregular enquiry ranging between firm to USC34 dearer to easier by USC4-USC12. Plainer categories steady and Plainest neglected.

The Best PF1's available met improved interest appreciating by up to USC30 but a few lines eased by USC6 while Brighter descriptions were irregular ranging between firm to USC14 dearer to easier by a similar rate with improved. Medium categories firm to USC2 dearer but others shed USC3-USC15 below previous levels. Plainer sorts were q weak feature and discounted by USC4-USC12 but a few lines appreciated by a similar margin.

Best PDUSTs on offer saw improved competition at firm to USC14 dearer with Brighter varieties firm to USC13 dearer while Mediiums were irregular varying between firm to USC13 dearer to easier by USC3-USC18. Plainer types fully firm where sold.

The best DUST1s available appreciated by USC5-USC18 with Brighter categories gaining USC4-USC10 while medium types saw an irregular enquiry and varied between USC6 dearer to easier by USC3-USC10. Plainer cescription were a weak feature and eased by up to USC10 although a few improved lines held firm to USC22 dearer.

In the **Secondary Catalogues** BPs eased with PFs discounted. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were steady while similar DUSTs held value. Other Fannings were discounted with DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed.
