SALE NO.36 OF 11TH & 12TH SEPTEMBER, 2018 <u>COMMENTS</u>

Plantation districts experienced extensive rainfall during July and August which curtailed crops to a great extent. This has now been followed by very dry conditions which again has resulted in a further decline in crop intakes. The Department of Meteorology however, has predicted strong winds accompanied by thundershowers in the coming days in the Western, Uda Pussellawa and Uva regions, which is needed to boost present crop harvests.

This week's auction volume was only 5.8 Mkgs which is a reduction of almost 0.4 Mkgs when compared to the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown weight on offer was 2.7 Mkgs whilst High Growns totaled 0.7 Mkgs. Next week's total auction weight shows a further drop and is only 5.2 Mkgs which is a direct reflection on the adverse weather conditions the plantations had to contend with during the past two months.

This week's Low Grown teas generally met with good demand and it was encouraging to witness a little more interest from buyers for Iran. There was maintained interest from other buyers for the Middle East, Turkey, C.I.S. and Russia.

The quality of Ex-Estate offering was lower to last. Buyers were seen to closely follow quality when making purchases and only a range of select teas received dearer prices. Uva's were substantially lower following quality. There was maintained interest from Hong Kong and China whilst the "Tea Bag" sector operating for Russia was a little more active. Japan was once again selective. Demand from Europe was more subdued.

Next week's quality of Ex-Estate offerings shows a further drop and we may not be able to see any dramatic recovery in prices till the final sale for September.

<u>CROP & WEATHER</u> For the period 03^{rd -} 09th September, 2018

Dry weather continues for the 2nd consecutive week over the Western, Uva and Udapussellawa Regions. However, showers or thundershowers can be expected with temporary localized strong winds in the week ahead in these three regions according to the Department of Meteorology. Nuwara Eliya Region experienced mild windy conditions in the beginning of the week along with bright weather reported throughout the week. As expected, Low Growns both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa Regions reported intense bright weather in the past week which has had a negative impact on harvesting of green leaf.

Crop Intake: Nuwara Eliya region maintained the crop intake, whilst all other planting regions show a decrease.

LOW GROWNS - LEAFY

- **BOP1:** Teas in the best category were generally firm; balance was irregular. Lower end teas maintained.
- **OP1 :** Select best invoices were barely steady; balance was irregular. Stalky invoices fully firm at the commencement but declined Rs.20/- and at times more towards the close.
- **OP** : Select best teas declined Rs.30-40/- and more particularly at the latter part of the sale. Teas at the lower end too were irregularly lower.
- **OPA:** A few teas in the select best category appreciated substantially. Improved below best teas too advanced Rs.30-40/- per kg; balance however declined Rs.10-20/- per kg. Poorer sorts maintained.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well made shotty invoices met with good demand; balance was irregular. Bolder varieties on average declined Rs.30/- and at times more. Teas at the lower end were generally firm.

- **BOPF:** Best Westerns a few select invoices appreciated following special inquiry whilst others were Rs.10-20/- per kg lower following quality. In the below best category, few select brighter sorts were firm, others were easier following quality. At the lower end, coloury teas were Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer, others were irregular. Nuwara Eliya's were Rs.20/- per kg easier. Udapussellawa's few select invoices appreciated following special inquiry. Majority were irregular and easier. Uva seasonal teas were substantially lower, other coloury sorts were Rs.20/- per kg easier.
