

# LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT

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# SALE NO.39 OF 02<sup>ND</sup> & 03<sup>RD</sup> OCTOBER, 2018 **COMMENTS**

Tea exporting countries like Sri Lanka are bound to face stiff challenges as they feel the impact of global policies in the face of United States sanctions against countries that continue to trade with Iran. Additional US sanctions will be enforced from November 5, 2018. Iran retained its position as the 04<sup>th</sup> largest importer of "Ceylon Tea" for the period January to August, 2018 and any destabilizing of this important market will have an adverse impact particularly on our Low Grown teas. Notwithstanding the impending U.S sanctions, Iran together with Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Turkey and the CIS buyers lent good demand for this week's Low Grown offerings amounting to 2.5 Mkgs which resulted in an overall firm to dearer market.

The High Grown teas catalogued on "Ex-Estate" terms this week amounted to 0.7Mkgs with good overall demand for most teas. Select best liquoring teas appreciated Rs. 20-30/- per kg and more following quality whilst brighter, below best varieties too were dearer although to a lesser extent. Teas from Nuwara Eliya showed a sharp price decline following the lower quality. The "Tea Bag" sector was active with wider participation from buyers for Russia and Europe. Japan was selective. There was good interest from Hong Kong and China.

In the meanwhile the Sri Lanka Tea Board has just released the national averages for teas sold during September, 2018 as well as the year-to-date particulars. During September, the teas in the "Orthodox Western High" elevation have fared the best with an average of Rs.629.87 followed by Orthodox Low Grown at Rs. 549.61 and Uva High Grown teas at Rs. 500.45. During the period January/September 2018, a total weight of 225,522,600 Kgs has gone through the auction system and other approved channels of sale at an average of Rs. 581.95. During the same period in 2017 however, a higher weight of 231,416,354 Kgs was sold at a much better average of Rs. 613.62.

# <u>CROP & WEATHER</u> <u>For the period 24<sup>th -</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2018</u>

Western & Nuwara Eliya Regions: Both regions experienced similar weather patterns with bright mornings and rainy evenings throughout the week. The rainy weather is expected to continue in the week ahead according to The Department of Meteorology. Uva and Udapussellawa Regions: Bright mornings with dull afternoons and wet evenings reported throughout the week. However, due to the low level atmospheric disturbance in the vicinity of Sri Lanka, prevailing showery conditions are expected to enhance over the island in the week ahead according to The Department of Meteorology. Low Growns: Both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported bright mornings and frequent heavy showers during the week. The Department of Meteorology predicts heavy rainfalls above 100mm and temporary localized strong winds in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: Western and Nuwara Eliya regions show an increase in the crop intake, whilst Uva, Udapussellawa and Low Growns maintained.

#### TURKS WORLD'S BIGGEST TEA DRINKERS, SAYS REPORT

Turkey consumes the largest amount of tea in the world with 3.5 kilograms of tea per person annually, according the latest report by the International Tea Committee (ITC), a non-profit organization which is an official source for tea statistics. Meanwhile, China tops the list of tea-producing nations in the world, the ITC said, noting the country accounted for 42.6 percent of global production with 2.27 million tones in the last year. China is followed by India, which produced around 1.27 million tones.

Turkey placed fifth in the world for tea production with 259,000 tones of tea over the past year, the NGO's report noted. Eighty-six percent of the world's tea production takes place in Asia; 11 percent in Africa and three percent on other continents, it said. Global tea consumption and production are projected to keep rising over the next decade, according to the ITC, due to an increasing demand in developing and emerging countries.

Good general demand prevailed for the 132,310 packages (8.62m/kgs) on offer with 12.38% neglected.

Best **BP1s** in the market appreciated by USC2-USC8 with Brighter categories irregular ranging between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC12 while Mediums were discounted by USC4-USC24. Plainer sorts were irregular varying between USC4 above last prices to USC6 easier.

The best **PF1s** on offer held steady to USC10 dearer while Brighter categories were irregular and raged between USC4 above previous rates to easier by a similar level with Medium types firm to USC14 dearer. Plainer varieties were well competed for at firm to USC10 above previous rates.

Best **PDUSTs** in the market met an irregular enquiry varying between USC3 dearer to easier by up to USC11 with Brighter sorts a weak feature and shed USC8-USC18 while Medium descriptions were irregular and ranged between firm to USC18 above last prices to easier by a similar rate. Plainer types met improved competition and gained USC2-USC12 but poorest were neglected.

The Best **DUST1s** available were irregular varying between USC2 dearer to easier by up to USC7 with brighter varieties ranging between USC6 dearer to easier by upto USC25 while Medium sorts held firm to USC18 above previous levels but some lines eased by the same rate. ; Plainer categories fully firm to USC24 above previous levels but plainest were discounted where sold.

In the **Secondary Catalogues** BPs appreciated while PFs were dearer. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings gained with similar DUSTs firm. Other Fannings held value while similar DUSTs were steady. BMFs were readily absorbed.

Pakistan Packers showed useful enquiry and were dominant with strong support from Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, Kazakhstan, other CIS states and Egyptian Packers. Afghanistan, Russia and Bazaar lent useful activity while UK and Sudan were active but selective. Iran were quieter. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.
