SALE NO.49 OF 11TH & 12TH DECEMBER, 2018 COMMENTS

The ongoing plantation strike has now entered the eighth day with estate workers demanding an increase to their basic daily wage. Tea Production in the majority of the High Grown plantations has come to a halt and some of the estates in the Medium category that are managed by Regional Plantation Companies too have been seriously affected. The Ex-Estate catalogue of January 9, 2019 which is currently open and due to close on Thursday 13, 2019 will no doubt show a substantial drop in offerings. It is hoped that a workable solution acceptable to all parties will be arrived at within the next few days as delayed plucking rounds at a time when we are about to commence the Western quality season is something to be avoided at all costs.

This week's auctions comprised of 7 Mkgs. Low Grown Leafy teas accounted for 1.8 Mkgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf catalogue had 1.1 Mkgs. There was good demand for the teas on offer with fairly wide-spread demand from Saudi-Arabia, Kuwait, Syria, Libya, Iraq and the U.A.E. There was also sustained demand from buyers for Turkey and the C.I.S whilst demand from Iran was once again subdued.

The stronger demand that prevailed at the commencement of the Ex Estate sale lost steam halfway through the brokers order of sale, perhaps due to the news that the stoppage of work on high grown estates will cease from tomorrow. There was added interest for the best available teas as buyers possibly wanted to cover their orders fearing a short fall which is likely in the wake of the current plantations strike.

This week's auction comprised of **11,902** lots with a total quantity of **7,029,887** Kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

The Department of Meteorology predicts strong gusty winds up to 40 kmph at times and cold weather in the week ahead. Low Growns reported bright mornings with occasional showers in both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions.

TEA FARMERS FACE BONUS CUTS AS PRICES HIT 30-MONTH LOW AT AUCTION

Tea prices at the Mombasa auction have hit a two-and-a-half-year low on increased supply, setting the stage for reduced farmer earnings in the current financial year. In the latest trading held last week, a kilogramme of processed tea fetched Sh218 on average down from Sh220 in the previous week and the lowest level since June 2016. The prices have been on a steady drop since June when it stood at Sh230 per kilogram. This look set to hurt farmers' income given that the decline in prices has been steeper than the rise in production on improved rainfall. In comparison to the same period last year, the beverage has dropped 18 per cent from a high of Sh266. East African Tea Traders Association managing director Edward Mudibo said though prices had been dropping, they have not reached an alarming stage. "Generally prices have been coming down but we anticipate they should not be moving to below Sh200, that is when we shall be worried," said Mr Mudibo. He said they anticipate the prices to rebound in the first quarter of 2019 as the volumes are expected to drop. Mr Mudibo said the decline in value of the Kenyan tea is a result of increased production.

According to Tea Directorate, production for the period January-September 2018 rose 14 per cent to stand at 346.23 million kg compared with 303.55 million kilograms in a similar period a year earlier. The value of tea opened the year on a higher note, hitting a high of Sh276 in the first sale of January, before starting to drop in the second half of the year that started in July. The low prices, however, did not affect farmers' earnings for the year to June as the poor performance was witnessed after Kenya Tea Development Agency had closed the financial year in June. Farmers were paid Sh85.74 billion in the year to June, up from Sh78.31 billion a year earlier on the back of increased production. This represented a growth of 9.4 per cent. A kilogram of green leaf fetched an average of Sh52.51 in the last season, having dropped from Sh58.61 in 2017.
